Re: Avista Corporation's d/b/a Avista Utilities 2023 Gas Integrated Resource Plan (**Docket UG-220244**) and 2023 Electric Integrated Resource Plan Progress Report (**Docket UE-200301**)

TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS:

The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) seeks feedback on Avista Corporation d/b/a Avista Utilities (Avista or Company) final 2023 Gas Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) and 2023 Electric Integrated Resource Plan Progress Report (Progress Report). Comments are due by **5 p.m. on August 1, 2023.**

INTEGRATED RESOURCE PLANS

How do electric and gas utilities decide on future energy resources for their customers?

An IRP shows a utility company's long-term energy resource strategy. IRPs describe how future customer needs will be met at the lowest reasonable cost to ratepayers.

Utilities must give the Commission:

- an electric IRP every four years, with an IRP progress report two years later; and
- a gas IRP every two years.²

An electric IRP progress report must update the following pieces of an electric utility's most recent electric IRP completed two years prior:

- the load forecast;
- the assessment of energy efficiency and other demand-side resources;³
- resource costs;
- the portfolio analysis and preferred portfolio;
- any additional items due to changing state or federal requirements, or significant changes to economic or market forces; and
- any elements also found in the utility's current clean energy implementation plan.⁴

Similarly, Commission rule describes gas IRP requirements.⁵

Avista filed its <u>2023 Gas IRP</u> on April 11, 2023. Avista filed its 2023 Electric IRP Progress report in compliance with Commission rules January 3, 2023, and a <u>2023 Electric IRP for compliance with Idaho requirements June 1, 2023.</u> Copies of the documents can be found at both <u>Avista's website</u> and online through the Commission's docket website. You can ask for hard copies of these documents from Avista.

WRITTEN COMMENTS

When to submit: No later than 5 p.m. on August 12023.

<u>What to submit</u>: The Commission prefers comments in electronic format (.pdf or Microsoft Word). This increases public access, reduces the need for paper, and makes it easier to access quotations from the comments.
