This letter is a formal request for the Utilities and Transportation commissioners to remove the Newaukum Water System, Inc., (NWS) from regulation by the UTC. This corporation was put under the UTC's jurisdiction despite the fact that NWS, a not-for-profit corporation, is not a public corporation. Furthermore, our corporation is a limited corporation that cannot sell or make water connections to any property that is not one of the original 27 lots surveyed as the Bill Noah subdivision, consisting of the Newaukum Country Estates on 183rd Ave SE and the nine lots on 181st Ave SE, Auburn, WA 98092. A copy of the plat map is attached for your information.

The bylaws of the corporation limit the water usage to these 27 lots. Furthermore, based on the water system's storage capacity, the Washington State Department of Health currently limits the number of these lots that can be served to 23. This demonstrates that Newaukum Water System is a limited corporation for the benefit of its small number of lot owners.

The adoption of the current bylaws by the lot owners established a five person Board of Directors to manage the Newaukum Water System. Jim Ward of the UTC staff has received a copy of these bylaws. These five board members must be lot owners and not more than one member of a joint lot ownership may serve on the board at one time. There is a chairman elected as the executive officer by the board from the five members.

The NWS Board of Directors is not aware of any public interest that would require the UTC to continue its regulation of the NWS. Therefore, the NWS Board of Directors requests that the UTC commissioners release the Newaukum Water System from its jurisdiction.

Attached are letters signed by 19 lot owners in support of the position of the NWS Board of Directors.

It is requested that the UTC Board of Commissioners release Newaukum Water System, Inc. from UTC control by October 10, 2014.


