G CONFERENCE TICE OF HEARING; Hearing set for Tuesday, 23, at 9:30 a.m.)

- NATURE OF PROCEEDING. On September 15, 2022, the Washington Utilities and 1 Transportation Commission (Commission) served on Puget Sound Energy (PSE or Company) the formal complaint (Complaint) of Alexander and Elena Argunov, Thomas and Heidi Johnson, and Chad and Victoria Groesbeck (Complainants). The Complaint alleges that PSE violated several Commission rules contained in Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 480-100.
- 2 **CONFERENCE.** The Commission convened a virtual prehearing conference on October 24, 2022, before Administrative Law Judges Samantha Doyle and Gregory Kopta.
  - **APPEARANCES.** Sheree Strom Carson and Byron C. Starkey, Perkins Coie LLP, 3 Bellevue, Washington, represent PSE. Nash Callaghan, Assistant Attorney General, Lacey, Washington, represents Commission staff (Staff).<sup>1</sup> Alexander and Elena Argunov, Heidi Johnson, and Victoria Groesbeck, represent Complainants, pro se. Lisa W. Gafken, Assistant Attorney General, Seattle, Washington, represent the Public Counsel Unit of the Attorney General's Office (Public Counsel). Contact information for the parties' representatives is attached as Appendix A to this Order.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> In formal proceedings such as this, the Commission's regulatory staff participates like any other party, while the Commissioners make the decision. To assure fairness, the Commissioners, the presiding administrative law judge, and the Commissioners' policy and accounting advisors do not discuss the merits of this proceeding with the regulatory staff, or any other party, without giving notice and opportunity for all parties to participate. See RCW 34.05.455.

- DISCOVERY. Discovery will be conducted under the Commission's discovery rules,
  WAC 480-07-400 425. The Commission urges the parties to work cooperatively
  together to avoid having to bring discovery matters forward for formal resolution.
- 5 Response times to data requests will be adjusted as set forth in Appendix B.
- <sup>6</sup> The Commission believes it will aid discovery in this case if all responses to data requests are shared with all parties. No party objected to the Commission making the exchange of data request responses with all parties as a requirement for discovery in this case. Accordingly, the Commission requires each party to share its data request responses with all other parties. Parties, however, must not share data requests and responses with the Commissioners, the presiding administrative law judge, or Commission policy advisors, unless those responses are offered as exhibits to be admitted into the record.
- 7 PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE. The parties agreed on a procedural schedule at the prehearing conference. The Commission adopts the parties' proposed procedural schedule, which is attached to this Order as Appendix B. The parties may modify the date of the parties-only settlement conference by providing written notice to the Commission.
- 8 **DOCUMENT FILING AND SERVICE REQUIREMENTS.** Parties must file and serve all pleadings, motions, briefs, and other pre-filed materials in compliance with all of the following requirements:
  - (a) Parties must submit electronic copies of all documents by 5 p.m. on the filing deadline established in the procedural schedule (or other deadline as applicable) unless the Commission orders otherwise. Parties must comply with WAC 480-07-140(6) in formatting, organizing, and identifying electronic files.
  - (b) The Commission accepts only electronic versions of documents for formal filing. Parties must submit documents electronically through the Commission's web portal (<u>www.utc.wa.gov/e-filing</u>). If a party is unable to use the web portal to submit documents for filing, the Commission will accept a submission via email to <u>records@utc.wa.gov</u>, provided that the email: (1) explains the reason the documents are not being submitted via the web portal, and (2) complies with the requirements in WAC 480-07-140(5)(b).
  - (c) Documents filed with the Commission must conform to the formatting and other requirements in WAC 480-07-395 and WAC 480-07-460. Written testimony filed on the deadlines established in the procedural schedule should be in question and answer format. Examples of written testimony may be

found in other adjudications (*e.g.*, Docket UE-220066) on the Commission's website.

- (d) Parties must electronically serve the other parties and provide courtesy electronic copies of filings to the presiding administrative law judges (<u>samantha.doyle@utc.wa.gov and Gregory.Kopta@utc.wa.gov</u>) by 5 p.m. on the filing deadline unless the Commission orders otherwise. If parties are unable to email copies, they may furnish electronic copies by delivering them on a flash drive only.
- 9 EXHIBITS FOR CROSS-EXAMINATION. Parties are required to file with the Commission and serve all proposed cross-examination exhibits by 5 p.m. on Wednesday, March 8, 2022. Cross-examination exhibits are responses to data requests or other documents a party intends to use in asking questions of an adverse witness during the evidentiary hearing. The Commission requires electronic copies in searchable PDF (Adobe Acrobat or comparable software). The exhibits must be grouped according to the witness the party intends to cross examine with the exhibits.
- 10 **EXHIBIT LISTS**. With each submission of pre-filed (written) testimony and exhibits, the party making the submission must include a preliminary exhibit list that identifies each submitted exhibit in the format the Commission uses for exhibit lists it prepares for evidentiary hearings. Each party must file and serve a final list of all exhibits the party intends to introduce into the evidentiary record, including all pre-filed testimony and exhibits and cross-examination exhibits, by **5 p.m., Wednesday, March 8, 2023**.
- 11 CROSS-EXAMINATION TIME ESTIMATES. Each party must provide a list of witnesses the party intends to cross-examine at the evidentiary hearing and an estimate of the time that party anticipates the cross-examination of that witness will take. Parties should not file witness lists or cross-examination time estimates but must provide them to the administrative law judges (samantha.doyle@utc.wa.gov and Gregory.Kopta@utc.wa.gov) and the other parties by 5 p.m., Monday, February 27, 2023.
- 12 **NOTICE OF EVIDENTIARY HEARING**. The Commission will hold an evidentiary hearing in this docket on **Tuesday**, **March 14**, **2023**, **at 9:30 a.m- 12:30 p.m.** Due to uncertainties surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic, the Commission will determine at a later date whether the hearing will be conducted in-person or virtually. If the hearing is conducted in-person, it will convene in the Commission's Hearing Room, First Floor, Commission Headquarters, 621 Woodland Square Loop S.E., Lacey, Washington.
- 13 **ALTERNATE DISPUTE RESOLUTION**. The Commission supports the informal settlement of matters before it. Parties are encouraged to consider means of resolving

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disputes informally. The Commission has limited ability to provide dispute resolution services. If you wish to explore those services, please contact Rayne Pearson, Director, Administrative Law and Policy Division (360-664-1136).

14 NOTICE TO PARTIES: A party who objects to any portion of this Order must file a written objection within ten (10) calendar days after the service date of this Order, pursuant to WAC 480-07-430 and WAC 480-07-810. The service date appears on the first page of this Order, in the upper right-hand corner. Absent such objection, this Order will control further proceedings in this docket, subject to Commission review.
