- 1 JUDGE WALLIS: Let us be on the record,
- 2 please. This is a pre-hearing conference in the
- 3 matter of Commission Docket Number 040788, which, for
- 4 today's purposes, involves a filing by Verizon
- 5 Northwest seeking an interim rate increase pending
- 6 resolution of issues in a final determination of
- 7 rates in a general rate proceeding.
- 8 This conference is being held at Olympia,
- 9 Washington, on today, which is the 5th of August of
- 10 the year 2004. My name is C. Robert Wallis, and I am
- 11 the presiding Administrative Law Judge.
- 12 Let's get some appearances this morning. I
- 13 understand that a couple of parties have persons in
- 14 the hearing room who have not entered appearances.
- 15 If you do not intend to continue on behalf of that
- 16 party, but your appearance is just for today, then
- 17 your name would be sufficient. If you will be
- 18 appearing later in the proceeding, then please give
- 19 your contact information. Let's start with the
- 20 company.
- MS. ENDEJAN: Good morning, Your Honor.
- 22 Judy Endejan, for Verizon Northwest, Inc. I believe
- 23 all my identification information's on the record.
- JUDGE WALLIS: It's on the record. For
- 25 Commission Staff.

- 1 MR. TRAUTMAN: Gregory J. Trautman,
- 2 Assistant Attorney General, for Commission Staff.
- JUDGE WALLIS: And you're standing in for
- 4 today only?
- 5 MR. TRAUTMAN: At the moment, yes.
- 6 MR. CROMWELL: Good morning, Your Honor.
- 7 Robert Cromwell, Assistant Attorney General, on
- 8 behalf of the Public Counsel Section. And as with
- 9 Mr. Trautman, I'm here to meet any needs you might
- 10 have from us, but Mr. ffitch is on the bridge line.
- JUDGE WALLIS: We acknowledge his presence
- 12 on the bridge line and thank him for bifurcating his
- 13 vacation to do so.
- MR. CROMWELL: Thank you.
- MR. ROSEMAN: Ronald Roseman, Attorney at
- 16 Law, appearing on behalf of AARP.
- MR. BUTLER: Arthur A. Butler, from the Law
- 18 Firm of Ater Wynne, LLP, on behalf of WeBTEC.
- 19 JUDGE WALLIS: And on the bridge line, for
- 20 Department of Defense?
- 21 MR. MELNIKOFF: This is Steve Melnikoff,
- 22 appearing for the consumer interests of the
- 23 Department of Defense and all other federal executive
- 24 agencies, Your Honor.
- 25 JUDGE WALLIS: Thank you. All right. There

- 1 are several questions that I had regarding the
- 2 exhibits. Our records center had some concerns about
- 3 filings by three parties, and I would like to
- 4 identify those concerns, and I have some questions
- 5 about individual exhibits, so I would suggest that we
- 6 go off the record to discuss those. Is there any
- 7 objection to that procedure? We will return to the
- 8 record and anyone who wishes to make a comment may do
- 9 so. Very well. Let's be off the record, please.
- 10 (Discussion off the record.)
- JUDGE WALLIS: Let's be back on the record,
- 12 please. We engaged in some procedural discussions
- 13 regarding the accuracy of a draft exhibit list and
- 14 have a number of questions noted. I have pledged to
- 15 complete the update of the list consistent with the
- 16 discussions this morning at the conclusion of this
- 17 session and to distribute that by electronic mail,
- 18 and I will have a goal of doing that before noon
- 19 today.
- 20 In conjunction with that, I will assign some
- 21 numbers, we will leave some space for additional
- 22 documents that might be presented, which the parties
- 23 have explained results from the recent filing of
- 24 rebuttal testimony on the part of the company, and
- 25 some very quick discovery that has been engaged in,

- 1 so we do anticipate that. We ask the parties, if at
- 2 all possible, to file any remaining documents by
- 3 close of business tomorrow. By mid-afternoon
- 4 tomorrow would allow us to get the documents in the
- 5 Commission's books, in our own books, so that we can
- 6 review them over the weekend. At latest, we ask that
- 7 they be filed by noon on Monday, unless, of course,
- 8 extenuating circumstances create an emergency.
- 9 Is there any reason, given our discussions
- 10 today and the resolution of the questions that we
- 11 had, to ask parties to convene prior to the beginning
- of the scheduled session on Tuesday at 9:30 a.m.
- MS. ENDEJAN: Your Honor, my only question
- 14 is what I have always found useful is to mark the
- 15 exhibits and -- with the number.
- 16 JUDGE WALLIS: I will do that in the list
- 17 that I distribute today.
- 18 MS. ENDEJAN: Okay. So that we can
- 19 correlate it and make sure we're all singing from the
- 20 same sheet.
- JUDGE WALLIS: Yes, yes.
- MS. ENDEJAN: Okay.
- JUDGE WALLIS: So hopefully, by the time you
- 24 get back to your office, you'll have that and be able
- 25 to do that.

- 1 MR. FFITCH: Your Honor.
- JUDGE WALLIS: Mr. ffitch.
- 3 MR. FFITCH: Can I inquire about the
- 4 schedule for the hearing days? I understand there's
- 5 an open meeting on Wednesday.
- 6 JUDGE WALLIS: There is an open meeting on
- 7 Wednesday. I did inquire this morning before the
- 8 conference began as to potential conflicts on the
- 9 Commissioners' calendars, and there is a potential
- 10 conflict between 11:00 and 12:00 on August 13th, but
- 11 other than that, it appears that we have a -- if not
- 12 a green light, at least a bright yellow light to
- 13 proceed on the schedule that's been identified,
- 14 working around the open meeting.
- Now, one reason to call that an amber,
- 16 rather than a green light, is that the Commissioners
- 17 have scheduled meetings in the morning and over the
- 18 noon hour, and there are occasions when those
- 19 meetings extend a little bit into the time for
- 20 hearings, so we will do our best to run a tight
- 21 schedule, begin promptly at 9:30 each morning, and
- 22 break promptly at noon, resume promptly at 1:30, and
- 23 continue until about 5:00.
- I'm optimistic that the estimates of the
- 25 parties are going to prove to be excessive and that

- 1 we will have no trouble in concluding the session in
- 2 the time that it's available, and maybe even take off
- 3 early on Friday afternoon so that we can enjoy the
- 4 beautiful Northwest weather.
- 5 Is there anything further, Mr. Roseman?
- 6 MR. ROSEMAN: The open meeting on Wednesday
- 7 -- so what time would the hearing -- I might have
- 8 missed that.
- 9 JUDGE WALLIS: We have scheduled the hearing
- 10 to exclude a morning session, and we will begin at
- 11 1:30.
- MR. ROSEMAN: Thank you.
- 13 JUDGE WALLIS: The reason is partly
- 14 uncertainty about the length of the open meeting and
- 15 partly because the Commissioners have some contingent
- 16 conferences scheduled in the event that it finishes
- 17 early enough.
- 18 MR. ROSEMAN: Thank you, Your Honor.
- MR. BUTLER: Your Honor.
- JUDGE WALLIS: Mr. Butler.
- 21 MR. BUTLER: What time would you like us
- 22 here on Tuesday morning?
- JUDGE WALLIS: My preference would be to
- 24 have people in the hearing room and ready to go by 20
- 25 after. I'm cognizant that the Commissioners

sometimes have things going on and it takes them a few minutes to get here, but I'd like all of us to be ready to go when the Commissioners come in, and 10 minutes should allow us, if anything unexpected comes up, to deal with that. All right. Is there anything further? Let the record show that there's no response. Thank you, Mr. Melnikoff and Mr. ffitch, for joining us virtually, and thank you for all who are in the hearing room. We're off the record. (Proceedings adjourned at 10:27 a.m.)
