- 3 **INITIAL ORDER:** An initial order was entered on January 6, 2005, by Administrative Law Judge Ann E. Rendahl proposing that Tier 2 payments to the state not be required if Qwest fails to met the performance standards of PID-20, a recently revised performance measure addressing Qwest's accuracy in manually processing service orders.
- 4 PETITION FOR REVIEW: No petition for administrative review was filed within the 20 days allowed by rule for filing. The Commission has reviewed the proposed order and the evidence of record and believes that the findings, the conclusions, and the order are consistent with the record.
