6	JUDGE PEARSON: So let's go ahead and be on
7	the record.
8	Today is Monday, August 7th, 2017, and the
9	time is just after 9:30 a.m.
LO	This is Docket TE-161261, which is captioned
L1	In the Matter of Determining the Proper Carrier
L2	Classification of and Complaint for Penalties Against
L3	Apex Limousine, LLC.
L4	My name is Rayne Pearson. I'm the
L5	administrative law judge presiding over today's brief
L6	adjudicative proceeding. So let's just start by taking
L7	appearances from both parties, and then we'll talk about
L8	how we're going to proceed this morning.
L9	So we'll start with the Commission staff.
20	MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Jennifer
21	Cameron-Rulkowski, Assistant Attorney General, appearing
22	on behalf of Commission staff. And I do have a notice
23	of appearance on file in this docket. Will that
24	suffice?
25	JUDGE PEARSON: It will. Thank you. All

1	right.
2	And if you could state your first and last
3	name and spell your last name, and then provide us with
4	your address, phone number and email address.
5	MR. ALEASAWI: Okay. My name is Ahmad
6	Aleasawi.
7	JUDGE PEARSON: Is your microphone turned
8	on? And if you could pull it closer to you. Perfect.
9	MR. ALEASAWI: My name is Ahmad Aleasawi,
10	spelled A-L-E-A-S-A-W-I. I live 4752 South 172nd
11	Street, SeaTac, Washington 98188.
12	JUDGE PEARSON: Telephone number?
13	MR. ALEASAWI: (206) 393-2332.
14	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. And an email address?
15	MR. ALEASAWI: 4752
16	JUDGE PEARSON: No. Email. Sorry.
17	MR. ALEASAWI: Oh, email,
18	info@apexlimoseattle.com.
19	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.
20	So as we were discussing briefly off the
21	record this morning, this is a classification hearing
22	that was brought by the Commission based on Staff's
23	findings that you were conducting business as a charter,
24	party or excursion service carrier without the required
25	certificate from the Commission.

1	And I know you're familiar with that because
2	you've had a certificate in the past, correct?
3	MR. ALEASAWI: When I bought the party bus,
4	yes, I
5	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
6	MR. ALEASAWI: That's I came here, I did
7	the application, and they told me where is the they
8	hook me up with the appointment and
9	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
10	MR. ALEASAWI: everything was okay, yeah.
11	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
12	So if we determine here today that you are
13	conducting business as a charter, party or excursion
14	carrier without the certificate, then we'll issue an
15	order that requires you to cease and desist all
16	operations unless and until you reapply and get a
17	certificate from the Commission again.
18	And then we also have a complaint for
19	penalties, which alleges that you have, in fact, engaged
20	in activities as a charter, party or excursion service
21	carrier, so today is also an evidentiary hearing to
22	consider whether you should be classified as a charter,
23	party or excursion service carrier and whether penalties
24	are appropriate.
25	And as we discussed, you are representing

1	yourself, so if you have any questions about the
2	applicable laws, just let me know. And again, I am
3	assuming that you're familiar with Commission rules
4	because you have held a certificate in the past.
5	MR. ALEASAWI: Well, I just had it for one
6	year and half, and I called them here in the office, and
7	I wanted to cancel it because I took the party bus from
8	the insurance
9	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. You can just wait
10	until I can swear you in and then you'll have an
11	opportunity to tell me everything that you want to.
12	MR. ALEASAWI: All right.
13	JUDGE PEARSON: So Staff's complaint alleges
14	that you have at least once offered to provide charter,
15	party or excursion carrier services without a
16	certificate, and that you've also advertised these
17	services on your website and on Yelp.com, so Staff is
18	requesting penalties of up to \$5,000 per violation in
19	the complaint.
20	And Staff will present its case first today.
21	You'll have the opportunity to cross-examine Staff's
22	witness, who is Mr. Turcott, seated over here to my
23	right.
24	And then after that, you'll have a chance to

testify and tell your side of the story, and

1	Ms. Cameron-Rulkowski may have some cross-examination
2	questions for you.
3	Okay?
4	MR. ALEASAWI: Thank you.
5	JUDGE PEARSON: Do you have any questions
6	before we proceed?
7	MR. ALEASAWI: No.
8	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
9	So Ms. Cameron-Rulkowski, you can proceed
10	when you're ready.
11	MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Thank you,
12	your Honor. I would like to call Mr. Michael Turcott.
13	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. If you could stand
14	and raise your right hand.
15	
16	MICHAEL TURCOTT, witness herein, having been
17	first duly sworn on oath,
18	was examined and testified
19	as follows:
20	
21	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Please be seated.
22	
23	DIRECT EXAMINATION
24	BY MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI:
25	Q. Good morning, Mr. Turcott.

1	A.	Good morning.
2	Q.	Please state
3	A.	Good morning.
4	Q.	Thank you.
5		Please state and spell your name.
6	A.	Michael L. Turcott, T-U-R-C-O-T-T.
7	Q.	And please state the name of your employer.
8	A.	I am employed by the Washington Utilities and
9	Tran	sportation Commission.
10	Q.	In what position are you employed?
11	A.	As of July 1st, I am the compliance
12	inves	stigations supervisor in the Consumer Protection
13	secti	on.
14	Q.	And what was your position prior to that
15	posit	ion?
16	A.	Prior to prior to July 1st, I was a
17	com	pliance investigator in Transportation Safety.
18	Q.	And how long have you been employed by the
19	Com	mission?
20	A.	Since October 1st, 2015.
21	Q.	Do you have prior experience working as an
22	inves	tigator?
23	A.	Yes, I do.
24	Q.	What kind of prior experience do you have?
25	Α.	I served in a commissioned capacity with the

1	Washington State Patrol for 28 years, and was involved	
2	in many, many civil, misdemeanor and felony	
3	investigations, traffic and criminal.	
4	And I worked following my time with patrol, I	
5	worked for a year and a half with the Department of	
6	Licensing where I managed the driver identity and	
7	vehicle title fraud investigation unit.	
8	Q. And regarding your work at the Commission,	
9	please briefly describe your responsibilities as they	
L O	pertain to this matter.	
L1	A. We conduct investigations of companies that we	
L2	believe may be operating in a regulated industry without	
L3	the proper authority, and in this particular case, it's	
L4	a charter industry investigation.	
L5	The goal is compliance, preferably voluntary	
L6	compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations	
L7	but the ultimate benefit being safety.	
L8	And compliance benefits everyone. The company,	
L9	in particular, by, A, avoiding penalties for violations;	
20	and, B, by being in compliance with the safety rules and	
21	regulations, the company is better prepared to defend	
22	themself [sic] from liability in the event something	
23	horrible or unthinkable happens, an accident or mishap.	
2.4	So the company benefits, the passengers on the	

vehicle benefit by safety and having confidence that the

1	drive	r is qualified and rested and sober and the vehicle	
2	is safe, and then everyone on the highway, the traveling		
3	public benefits when these vehicles are operated within		
4	regul	ation.	
5	Q.	Are you familiar with Apex Limousine, LLC?	
6	A.	I am.	
7	Q.	And how did you become familiar with Apex	
8	Limo	usine?	
9	A.	I conducted an investigation of Apex Limousine	
10	with	respect to its operating authority.	
11	Q.	Did you document your investigation of Apex?	
12	A.	Yes.	
13	Q.	Please refer to Exhibit MT-1.	
14		Is this a true and accurate copy of the	
15	inves	tigation report that you authored?	
16	A.	Yes.	
17	Q.	All right.	
18		The name of Apex Limousine, LLC, indicates it's	
19	a limited liability company. Do you know who actually		
20	runs	the company?	
21	A.	That's yes, that's Mr. Aleasawi, seated to my	
22	right	•	
23	Q.	And what leads you to believe that he runs the	
24	company?		
25	Α.	His name is listed with the Department of	

1	Revenue Business Licensing record, and as well as the	
2	Secre	etary of State for the LLC registration.
3	Q.	And we've heard that Apex Limousine has held
4	chart	er authority from the Commission. When did Apex
5	recei	ve charter authority?
6	A.	June of 2013.
7	Q.	Was Apex's certificate cancelled?
8	A.	Yes.
9	Q.	Was it a voluntary cancellation?
10	A.	No.
11	Q.	All right.
12		When did the Commission cancel Apex's charter
13	certificate?	
14	A.	May 21st, 2015.
15	Q.	And why did the Commission cancel Apex's charter
16	certif	icate?
17	A.	The company failed to provide the required proof
18	of in	surance to the Commission.
19	Q.	And was this the first time that there was a
20	lack (of insurance on file?
21	A.	No, it was the fourth occurrence.
22	Q.	Is there a copy of the cancellation order
23	inclu	ded in your investigation report?
24	A.	Yes.
25		Since Aney's certificate was cancelled in you

1	said,	May 2015, has the Commission provided any
2	techr	nical assistance to Apex?
3	A.	Yes.
4	Q.	All right.
5		And what was the impetus for the technical
6	assis	tance?
7	A.	Through a Google search or internet search, I
8	disc	overed a website for the company, Apex Limousine,
9	and i	t appeared the vehicle and service that's being
10	offer	ed fell within the jurisdiction of the Commission.
11		And it's our policy and procedure to reach out
12	to th	e company before beginning any investigation, reach
13	out i	n writing, notify them of the licensing
14	requ	irements, and ask the company to respond either just
15	by si	mply submitting an application or by explaining the
16	busi	ness model or simply reaching out for a discussion
17	with	Staff about the requirements and whether they fall
18	unde	er the charter certificate requirements.
19	Q.	Now, you just talked about reaching out in
20	writin	g.
21		Did the Commission send Apex a letter?
22	A.	The Commission staff sent two letters, actually,
23	yes.	
24	Q.	And did Apex respond to the Commission?
25	A.	No.

1	Q. Are true and correct copies of the two letters
2	contained in your investigation report?
3	A. Yes.
4	Q. All right. Let's go there now.
5	Do you recall which appendices those letters are
6	at?
7	A. I have them under K and L.
8	Q. All right. Thank you. All right.
9	The first one references party bus services.
10	Does the Commission regulate party bus service?
11	A. Yes.
12	Q. Does the company have to obtain authority from
13	the Commission to operate party bus service?
14	A. Yes.
15	Q. What kind of authority?
16	A. A charter excursion certificate is required as a
17	party bus is a subset of the charter service, which is
18	regulated by the Commission.
19	Q. Does any other state agency regulate party bus
20	service?
21	A. No.
22	Q. All right.
23	I want to ask you about any vehicles that Apex
24	may be operating. Will you please turn to Appendix E in
25	your investigation report. What is Appendix E?

1	A.	Appendix E is an application for charter and	
2	excursion carrier service. This was filed by the		
3	company under Docket TE-130679 for Apex Limo Service,		
4	and t	the date is April 17th, 2013.	
5	Q.	And is the document in Appendix E a true and	
6	corre	ct copy of the application?	
7	A.	Yes.	
8	Q.	Does the application list a vehicle?	
9	A.	Yes, it did.	
10	Q.	Can you please tell us what vehicle and where	
11	that's	listed on the application?	
12	A.	We're looking at page number 3 of the	
13	appli	cation at the bottom, the section 2, Equipment, and	
14	the li	cense number is left blank, but it describes the	
15	year	of the vehicle as a 2003, provides a vehicle ID	
16	num	ber ending in 9840, and indicates seating capacity,	
17	24.		
18	Q.	And do you know what kind of vehicle that is?	
19	A.	Well, I found out later through the Department	
20	of Li	censing, I looked it up, it's a 2003 International	
21	bus.		
22	Q.	Do you know if Apex Limousine or Mr. Aleasawi	
23	curre	ntly owns that vehicle?	
24	A.	Yes, it is registered as of this morning, I	
25	chec	ked again Apex Limo Service, LLC, at the 172nd	

1	Stree	t, SeaTac address that we've seen and been
2	discu	ssing today.
3	Q.	Does Apex Limousine have a website?
4	A.	Yes.
5	Q.	Did you document the company's website in your
6	inves	tigation report?
7	A.	Yes, I did.
8	Q.	Can you please point us to that documentation?
9	A.	These are appendices M and N, and M is the home
10	page	, the front page at apexlimoseattle.com.
11		JUDGE PEARSON: So can I just stop you? It
12	woul	d be helpful to me if you just gave me page numbers
13	rathe	er than the name of the exhibit.
14		MR. TURCOTT: Yes, your Honor.
15		JUDGE PEARSON: Then I don't have to keep
16	returi	ning to the table of contents.
17		MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: It starts on page
18	49.	
19		JUDGE PEARSON: Thank you.
20		MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: And also in your
21	exhib	it, you should have the appendices tabbed.
22		JUDGE PEARSON: Oh, I see that. I'm looking
23	at the	e records center copy. Thank you.
24	BY M	IS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI:
25	Q.	All right.

1	You were describing you had just testified	
2	that M and N were copies were represented the web	
3	page. And are these screenshots of the web page?	
4	A. Yes.	
5	Q. And what's here in your investigation report	
6	or what's here in this exhibit, are these true and	
7	accurate copies of your screenshots?	
8	A. Yes.	
9	Q. When did you make these screenshots?	
10	A. April 27th, 2017.	
11	Q. And what information on the website shows that	
12	Apex is advertising services that the Commission	
13	regulates?	
14	A. There are a number of things. The description,	
15	the text here: Apex Limousine is the Seattle area's	
16	full-service transportation company that will satisfy	
17	all of your ground transportation requests from limo and	
18	party bus rental to airport, et cetera, et cetera. So	
19	it actually describes party bus.	
20	There's a photo of what I believe is the	
21	International bus on the home page. And then	
22	specifically on the tab there's a tab and a tab	
23	for Seattle Party Bus Rental, and, again, it says, With	
24	our top-of-the-line luxury party bus rentals, you can be	
25	sure you'll be arriving to your occasion in style, et	

cetera, et cetera.

2.

The photo is -- it's the interior of a vehicle, and the photo depicts perimeter seating in which the passengers would be able to circulate throughout the vehicle, whether it's moving or stationary. It has some colorful, somewhat elaborate lighting, and I see some beverage glasses. And these extra amenities are things that are, per statute definition, the definition of a party bus, regardless of the seating capacity.

And finally, as to the seating capacity, the website says, "24 Passenger Luxury Limo Bus." The charter application also said 24 passenger.

And just to explain for a moment, the difference between limousine authority and charter authority is a stretch limo can accommodate up to 14 passengers, not including the driver. And so anything, you know, in excess of that, regardless of, you know, party bus or not, cannot be operated as a limousine. It has to be operated under authority from the Commission as a charter vehicle.

- Q. When did you last check the Apex Limousine website?
- A. This morning prior to the hearing.
 - Q. Is it still active?
- **A. Yes.**

1	Q. Has it changed in any material way from what's
2	in this exhibit?
3	A. No.
4	Q. During your investigation, did you document any
5	other online advertising by Apex Limousine?
6	A. Yes, I did. I also documented the company's
7	profile on Yelp.com.
8	Q. Where is the Yelp profile documented in your
9	investigation report?
L O	A. It's Appendix O, and I will look for a
L1	JUDGE PEARSON: It's okay now that I have my
L2	tabbed copy. Sorry about that.
L3	MR. TURCOTT: Not a problem.
L4	A. Appendix O.
L5	BY MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI:
L6	Q. And does Appendix O contain a true and accurate
L7	copy of the Yelp profile that you documented?
L8	A. It's yes, it's true and accurate, but it's
L9	not the entire Yelp profile, because profiles tend to
20	have advertising and consumer comments and so on. This
21	is the this is the section that was posted by the
22	business by Apex Limo Service.
23	Q. And when did you review the Yelp profile?
24	A. Well, this image was captured April 27th, and I
25	reviewed it again this morning.

1	Q. Thank you.
2	And had the Yelp profile that is here in the
3	exhibit changed in any material way in what's online
4	this morning?
5	A. No.
6	Q. All right.
7	In your report, you discuss receiving an offer
8	of transportation from Apex Limousine, and this is on
9	page 7. How did you contact Apex Limousine?
10	A. By email.
11	Q. And how did you locate the email address that
12	you used?
13	A. I went to the website and there was a Contact Us
14	area, and it had icons for different modes of
15	communication. And I located the email icon and hovered
16	the mouse over the icon and observed the email address
17	of info@apex info@apexlimoseattle.com.
18	Q. And ultimately, did you click on that on that
19	icon then to send your email?
20	A. Well, I actually typed the email address into my
21	Outlook browser and sent the email that way.
22	Q. All right.
23	And did you receive a reply?
24	A. I did.
25	Q. All right.

1	And what was the reply?
2	A. Well, in my when I sent the email, I wanted
3	to be clear about what I was asking for, so in the
4	subject line, it says, "24-passenger party bus," and
5	then I asked for a quote for a group of 20 passengers
6	for Thursday, May 25th.
7	And I received a reply back later that evening,
8	the evening of April 12th, the address here the reply
9	came from ajinfo@apexlimoseattle.com, and it confirmed
10	that, for six hours, I would get the vehicle for \$1,200.
11	Q. And the vehicle that you asked for, was that
12	specifically a party bus?
13	A. Well, I intentionally put that in the subject
14	line so we'd be clear about what vehicle we were talking
15	about, and it says, "24-passenger party bus."
16	Q. Thank you.
17	And then I would simply ask you to refer to
18	Appendix P of your investigation report. This is the
19	very last appendix. And is this a true and correct copy
20	of the email offer that you received from Apex
21	Limousine?
22	A. Yes.
23	MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Your Honor, at this
24	time I offer Exhibit MT-1 for admission into evidence.
25	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.

1	Mr. Aleasawi, do you have any objection to
2	admitting Staff's investigation report?
3	MR. ALEASAWI: So whatever he talking, I can
4	object?
5	JUDGE PEARSON: You can no, at this point
6	I'm asking if you have any objection to admitting this
7	into evidence. You can address what's in the report
8	when it's your turn.
9	MR. ALEASAWI: That's right. I want to just
10	object to a lot of thing he said, but I don't know how
11	the terminology I use. So you want to give me my chance
12	now or
13	JUDGE PEARSON: No, this is just about
14	whether you object to admitting his investigation report
15	into the record. And if we admit it into the record,
16	then you'll have an opportunity to respond to it.
17	MR. ALEASAWI: Can you say that again?
18	Yeah, I want to like part of what he said is not
19	correct.
20	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. I hear what you're
21	saying. So I'm going to go ahead and admit it because
22	it is the investigation report underlying the complaint
23	in this matter. So I will admit it and mark it as MT-1.
24	And then when it's your turn, we can walk through it and
25	you can tell me which portions you believe are

1	incorrect. Okay?	
2	MR. ALEASAWI: Can I ask Mr. Mike later on	
3	that question?	
4	JUDGE PEARSON: You can ask him as soon as	
5	Mr. Cameron-Rulkowski is done. You'll have an	
6	opportunity to ask him questions.	
7	MR. ALEASAWI: Thank you very much.	
8	MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Thank you,	
9	your Honor.	
10	(Exhibit No. MT-1 was marked.)	
11	BY MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI:	
12	Q. In your investigation report, you discuss annual	
13	report penalties that Apex Limousine incurred. This is	
14	on page 5.	
15	How many times did Apex fail to timely file an	
16	annual report?	
17	A. Two times.	
18	Q. Did Apex pay annual report penalties?	
19	A. Yes. In 2014 they were assessed penalties of	
20	\$200 I should correct that \$1,000, which was	
21	mitigated to 200, and again \$1,000 was assessed for the	
22	2015 report.	
23	Q. All right.	
24	And are the penalties paid in full?	
25	A. Yes and no. The 2014 report, the penalty was	

1	paid in full. The company is making installments on its
2	2015 annual report penalty.
3	Q. And are those installments generally timely, so
4	far as you know?
5	A. Yes.
6	Q. And what's the remaining balance?
7	A. Well, the most recent payment came in of \$115.62
8	on June 28th, and the balance remaining is \$325.55.
9	Q. All righty. Thank you.
10	And I'd like to go ahead and move on to Staff's
11	penalty recommendation at this point.
12	Are you recommending that a penalty be assessed
13	against Apex Limousine?
14	A. Yes, I am.
15	Q. All right.
16	What amount of penalty does Staff recommend that
17	the Commission assess against Apex Limousine?
18	A. Well, I'd like to begin just by prefacing this
19	with just a little background on Staff's position on
20	this, is that, again, as we talked about, safety is what
21	really drives what we do, and this particular vehicle, a
22	24-passenger, that's a large vehicle. It falls into a
23	lot of the extra requirements, safety requirements, drug
24	and alcohol testing, hours of service, driver
25	qualifications, periodic inspections, daily inspections,

things that are not done to the degree as a charter vehicle if it was operated as a limousine. So there are extra requirements that are very important.

2.

The company applied and obtained charter authority for that vehicle, and maintained insurance off and on for a while, and eventually the certificate was cancelled. And at least for the past year, since we've been looking at this, the company has kept the advertising up.

The company renewed the vehicle license tabs in April for the bus, and the company agreed to transport a group, so we believe that the vehicle is being operated. Regardless, the company is advertising on at least two modes of internet advertising and did agree to book a trip for three violations.

And due to the lack of response from the company and the seriousness of the potential harm to the public, Staff is recommending the maximum penalty of up to \$5,000 for each of the three violations.

Q. And the three violations are based on the -- one being the website advertisement, the second being the Yelp advertisement, and the third being the email offer; is that correct?

A. That's correct, yes.

MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Thank you. I have

1	no further questions for Mr. Turcott at this time.
2	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
3	So Mr. Aleasawi, if you want to ask
4	Mr. Turcott questions, you may.
5	MR. ALEASAWI: Can I just give you a brief
6	presentation about my company and then
7	JUDGE PEARSON: Not yet.
8	MR. ALEASAWI: and then proceed?
9	JUDGE PEARSON: No. Now is your opportunity
LO	to cross-examine him, and then you can give me your
L1	presentation because I'll need to swear you in at that
L2	point.
L3	MR. ALEASAWI: Sure.
L4	
L5	CROSS-EXAMINATION
L6	BY MR. ALEASAWI:
L7	Q. Mr. Mike, you said you sent an email to Apex
L8	Limousine; is that right? And you hear me all right?
L9	A. I can hear you, but I need to turn this on
20	before I talk.
21	Q. Did you particularly you know, as you guys
22	know, Apex Limousine own only one party bus, only one.
23	And it's Apex number one, license plate; that's right,
24	Mr. Mike?
25	A. Yes, the registration that I ran

1	Q.	Yeah.
2	A.	that is the license plate number on that bus.
3	Q.	So did Apex limousine own any other busses above
4	14-pa	assenger?
5	A.	Not under the business name Apex Limo. I'm only
6	awar	e of the one. There may be others that
7	Q.	So we have only one party bus?
8	A.	I'm only aware of the one that's presented in
9	this	case.
10	Q.	Good.
11	A.	If it's under if there's other vehicles under
12	a diff	ferent name, I'm not aware of them.
13	Q.	No. Apex Limousine is servicing only one
14	with o	only one name, you know. I mean, if there is

21	you p	particularly order that bus and you said, hey, I
22	want	ed that bus in the picture to come to my party? Did
23	you c	lid this?
24	A.	I asked for the 24-passenger party bus that your
25	comi	pany that was the main intent in the content of my

1	email was 24-passenger party bus.
2	Q. That's so that's all what you talking here
3	is verbally. There's nothing you didn't pay a
4	payment did you pay a payment for the service?
5	A. No, I didn't pay a payment. I obtained an offer
6	and a quote
7	Q. That's good.
8	A for the service.
9	Q. Thank you.
LO	Did you came and you saw the bus?
L1	A. No.
L2	Q. Because most customer, they come and see the bus
L3	if it's you know, in this business there's a lot of
L4	people
L5	MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Objection,
L6	your Honor. Can you please instruct Mr. Aleasawi not to
L7	testify at this point?
L8	JUDGE PEARSON: Yes, please don't provide
L9	testimony at this point. You'll have an opportunity to
20	explain all that. If you have questions for
21	Mr. Turcott, keep it limited to that.
22	BY MR. ALEASAWI:
23	Q. Yeah.
24	So did you do payments for the bus?
25	JUDGE PEARSON: Mr. Aleasawi

1	MR. ALEASAWI: Oh, okay.
2	JUDGE PEARSON: also, we need to only
3	speak one at a time, because the court reporter cannot
4	record when two people are speaking at once. So make
5	sure not to speak over Mr. Turcott and give him a
6	chance to
7	MR. ALEASAWI: Sorry, your Honor. I've
8	never been in court. I'm sorry.
9	JUDGE PEARSON: It's okay.
10	BY MR. ALEASAWI:
11	Q. So did you came to our office or our property
12	and you saw the bus?
13	A. No.
14	Q. Did the bus ever show up to your request time
15	and you saw the bus next to your home or next to your
16	party?
17	A. I no, I simply obtained a quote from your
18	company for the service. I never saw the bus, rode the
19	bus, gave an address to be picked up. I simply went to
20	your website address, inquired about a 24-person party
21	bus with a date and requested a quote, and I was
22	provided a quote of \$1,200.
23	Q. So basically you've never seen the bus on the
24	road, never seen the bus physically, never seen Apex
25	number one, owned by Apex Limousine, come to your house,

1	or yo	u never see it at all?
2	A.	Correct.
3	Q.	And you said you contact Apex Limousine only by
4	email	; that's right?
5	A.	With regards to the quote, you mean, or
6	Q.	Yeah, in regard to the party bus and the quote.
7	A.	I sent two letters to the mailing address, and
8	the q	uote was requested via the email address
9	Q.	So
10	A.	on the website.
11	Q.	So you're saying you didn't call Apex Limousine
12	by ph	none?
13	A.	I obtained the quote by email.
14	Q.	Not the phone?
15	A.	No, by email.
16	Q.	So you didn't call from a number 425 and you
17	insist	about the party bus and you insist about the
18	арро	intment here?
19	A.	I'll make this really clear and as simple as
20	poss	ible. I requested the quote via the email address
21	on th	e website, not the phone number.
22	Q.	Okay.
23		Because I have phone number, it's 425, with the
24	name	e Mike, and asked me to have to be here, and kind of
25	like ir	n threatening languages, which I'm assuming that's

1	you or not, and I have to be here, it's better to be
2	here.
3	A. Are you referring to a phone call July 21st at
4	about 11:00 a.m.?
5	Q. I'm not sure about the time. But it was an
6	aggressive phone call maybe from somebody not officially
7	working here, somebody acting like he's a customer.
8	That was you?
9	A. Yes, that was me.
LO	Q. Okay.
L1	And are you sure Apex Limousine have account in
L2	Yelp?
L3	A. I believe it to be true.
L4	Q. Okay.
L5	How confident you are that picture in the
L6	website is for International truck with the Apex plate
L7	on it? Is that the same picture, or is this only image?
L8	A. It doesn't need to be.
L9	Q. Okay.
20	A. It's just a picture of a party bus. You could
21	have your friend's party bus on your website if you
22	like.
23	JUDGE PEARSON: I have a question. Is it
24	Ford International bus? Is that the
25	MR. ALEASAWI: It's International trucking.

1	It's not Ford.
2	JUDGE PEARSON: It's not Ford.
3	MR. ALEASAWI: The company's called
4	International.
5	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. I just wanted to
6	clarify. I've never heard of that company, so I just
7	wanted to clarify.
8	MR. ALEASAWI: So your Honor, later on,
9	like, if I want to ask some more questions, because it
10	doesn't crossing my mind right now, that's fine, or I
11	just have to keep going right now?
12	JUDGE PEARSON: This is your opportunity
13	right now.
14	MR. ALEASAWI: Okay.
15	BY MR. ALEASAWI:
16	Q. So Mr. Mike, are you aware of me, I call your
17	offices here and I asked them to help me with the
18	application to to do the what do you call it
19	not the certificate, it's actually when you pay the \$25.
20	I'm not familiar with it, because I know I done it one.
21	When I call here, they told me, if you are not driving
22	that bus to the other state, then you don't have to do
23	it, something
24	JUDGE PEARSON: Are you just asking
25	Mr. Turcott if he's aware of that phone call?

1	BY MR. ALEASAWI:
2	Q. Yeah, if he was did you aware of that? I
3	called twice, and I came one time to the office right
4	here, and I remember this. I mean, I came to the office
5	and I asked them, do I have to do this every year even
6	if I'm not using the bus? And they told me, if you are
7	not crossing other states with that bus, you don't have
8	to do it.
9	A. When was that call?
10	Q. 2014. That's when I took the bus from the
11	service. That's when I decided to don't use the bus
12	anymore.
13	A. I wasn't employed here in 2014. And those
14	questions typically don't go to transportation safety.
15	They go to licensing and
16	Q. No, I
17	A I wouldn't have gotten that call.
18	Q. I think it's part of I think it's part of
19	that department, I'm very sure
20	A. All right.
21	Q because they answered the question.
22	A. Yeah. I'm sorry. I'm not able to help with
23	that.
24	Q. Let me ask you one more question. If you are
25	investigator, how many website are there in Seattle or

1	in Washington, they operated busses and charter but they
т	
2	really don't own any charter and bus? Do you know this?
3	A. So the question was, how many websites are
4	there? And the internet, sometimes it just seems
5	infinite, so I don't think I could give a number of how
6	many websites there are.
7	But I will say that 2015 legislation clarified
8	that advertising as a charter is evidence of operating
9	as a charter. So the advertising if a person is
L ₀	advertising, they are deemed to be offering charter
L1	service, which is regulated.
L2	Q. And did you guys send a letter to every owner,
L3	carrier or whatever who Carey the busses to tell them,
L4	if you advertise for a party bus or a bus or a charter,
L5	you'll be questionable or you'll be penalty?
L6	A. The outreach that we provided to your company is
L7	very typical of the outreach we do on a nearly daily
L8	basis with technical assistance. So it is common to
L9	send many, many of those letters out to different
20	carriers that we believe need to be regulated.
21	Q. So I didn't understand the answer, but is that
22	yes or no? Like did you send everybody advertising a
23	party bus or carrier party bus to say, hey, you cannot
24	market even if you don't use those busses?

A. So the question was, did I send a letter to

1	everybody? Well, I don't know who everybody is. We do
2	have many cases open, and we're very busy and diligent
3	working with companies that are non-permitted.
4	But to answer your question and say, did
5	everybody get a letter? Well, probably not. There's
6	probably some that we don't know about yet. But we have
7	a staff now that that's what we do, and they're very
8	busy.
9	Q. Can I phrase my question differently?
10	A. Yeah, absolutely.
11	Q. Can you penalty a website or a company they are
12	not even have a certificate or hold any party bus in
13	their in their fleet because
14	MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Objection,
15	your Honor. I'd like to keep the question relevant
16	the questions
17	MR. ALEASAWI: It's very relevant.
18	MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: relevant to Apex
19	Limousine Service and not the entire industry.
20	JUDGE PEARSON: Sure. And I'll just tell
21	you that if you have general questions about what the
22	laws are, you can ask me when you're done
23	MR. ALEASAWI: Okay.
24	JUDGE PEARSON: asking him questions.
25	111

1	BY MR. ALEASAWI:
2	Q. So my last question to you is that I really
3	want to focus on that.
4	So when you order from the website from even
5	from the phone, which is first you hesitated to say
6	you called me, but you called, and you never seen that
7	bus, that bus never showed to your house, that bus never
8	been in the road, you never seen it in the road, yes or
9	no?
LO	A. I think I've answered that, sir. I've never
L1	seen that bus in person.
L2	MR. ALEASAWI: Thank you so much.
L3	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. That's all?
L4	MR. ALEASAWI: (Nods head.)
L5	JUDGE PEARSON: So did you have any redirect
L6	for Mr. Turcott?
L7	MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: None, your Honor.
L8	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
L9	So Mr. Aleasawi, if you could please stand
20	and raise your right hand.
21	
22	AHMAD ALEASAWI, witness herein, having been
23	first duly sworn on oath,
24	was examined and testified
25	as follows:

JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. So go ahead and take a seat. And you can just go ahead and address whatever you'd like to address and explain your side of the story.

MR. ALEASAWI: Thank you, your Honor.

MR. ALEASAWI: I started this company in -probably in 15 years. I started it with one car, hard
working with a Town Car. Then I grow up to almost 14
car, all Town Car and stretch limo, not above
14-passenger because we don't want to deal with this.
And actually, I didn't know that busses deal with all
the charter and stuff.

And when I get the opportunity to grow up and get that bus in 2013, bought it from California, drove it with me and my buddy -- I have a CDL class A, but I don't have class B, so I'm not allowed to Carey a passenger because I didn't -- I don't drive a lot. So one of my drivers sometimes used to drive it.

And as soon as -- we are really busy with the Town Car, and we focus on a lot of executive people, you know. So in 2013, I run it, like, maybe only on the prom season, and I see, like, it's not suitable for my

1	company. It's wasting time, wasting size, and a lot of
2	driver don't want to drive it.
3	We got the insurance confusion here because
4	when you buy from insurance company the whole umbrella,
5	they call it, you will get a big discount. And I'm
6	dealing with a lot of hotel, like Hyatt Regency, Grand
7	Hyatt, Hyatt Olive, Hampton in SeaTac, all those hotel,
8	they always require a certificate insurance with 4
9	million coverage. And that's why I buy the big
10	umbrella.
11	So I never been in this 15 years out of
12	insurance at all. And I think the law is really clear,
13	Port of Seattle really clear, State of Washington, City
14	of Seattle, you cannot do inspection, you cannot be in
15	the road without those certificate. And we always
16	certificate our car and stuff.
17	The 2013, as you see, and as Mike, he
18	mentioned, I got the certificate for the party bus. In
19	2014, I took it out. But I this bus has cost me
20	\$60,000. I have to insure it. But I never let it be in
21	the street without insurance at all.
22	JUDGE PEARSON: So you're saying in 2014 you
23	removed it from your insurance policy and stopped
24	driving it?

25

MR. ALEASAWI: Yes. 2014, I think I put

1	it what I do, your Honor, I put it in the beginning
2	of the coverage to get a good deal, and then we take
3	them out if they are not suitable, you know. It's
4	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Go ahead.
5	MR. ALEASAWI: Yeah. So I know I get the
6	penalty \$200, and then I actually, I told you I'm not
7	good at paper. I hire usually somebody assisting me in
8	summer when it's busy, business is busy in summer.
9	So they missed those applications to but
10	then in the end of it, I called here and I came here
11	personally, and I say, look, every year I get those
12	penalties, like \$1,000 or something. What's going on?
13	Somebody from here told me, if you don't drive that bus
14	out of the state, you cannot you don't have to do
15	this. You don't have to do the application or whatever.
16	And I know myself, I took it out of the
17	insurance. I don't drive it, so why I give why I,
18	like, you know, pay for all this money.
19	And as you saw, your Honor, Mr. Mike, he
20	never seen that bus in the road, he never seen the bus
21	physically driven even without passenger. And I am not
22	a single car company so I can risk my company and my
23	reputation in the market driving a bus without

insurance.

1	you don't mind.
2	JUDGE PEARSON: Sure. Please.
3	MR. ALEASAWI: So I brought my iPad,
4	actually I don't know if you'll let me use it, I can
5	show Mike and Jennifer. There is a hundred website
6	in the state of Washington, they put any car they want,
7	party bus, charter, but they don't have it. But because
8	it's a part of network companies that we work together,
9	if you call me tomorrow, and I'm not lying because I'm
10	under the oath, and you want to book a party bus, yes, I
11	book it for you. But I'm not gonna use my bus. I will
12	use Bayview, I will give it to AA Limousine. And all of
13	them, they know me. I give them a job, and we get
14	20 percent commission, your Honor. And that's every
15	company do this.
16	And I'm doing every day ten trips, fourteen
17	trips from just Bayview. I do two to three trips from
18	Carey Limousine, and they are very well known in the
19	whole America, not just even in Washington.
20	JUDGE PEARSON: How do you spell that?
21	MR. ALEASAWI: Carey Limousine and Bayview.
22	JUDGE PEARSON: How do you spell Carey?
23	MR. ALEASAWI: Carey
24	JUDGE PEARSON: Not sure?
25	MR. ALEASAWI: C actually, Carey with a

1	
1	U.

2 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Is it C-A-R-Y

3 | [sic]?

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MR. ALEASAWI: Yeah.

JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.

MR. ALEASAWI: I know the owner, you can email and ask them about AJ and ask them about Apex Limousine, and they will know you -- they tell you, like, we never give this guy our executive, our VIP --

we to go Microsoft, we go everywhere -- to Amazon -- and we sit there and we do job for their VIP if I don't have insurance.

I mean -- I mean, I know they're concerned about safety, and I really admire his work and admire Jennifer work, go after company like this. But they never seen that bus on the road and I never drive that bus on the road. And actually, it's been out of work and it's broken for, like, 2015.

And my evidence is, is the International dealer in Tukwila, I request to take it there, to tow it there, but just because it's such a long bus, they cannot put it in the -- in the shop because they like to have a bobtail. So the bus even is not working.

And -- and as I told you, we can go to -- a

lot of website, they market for party bus, charter, name

it, anything, but they are not owning the car.

JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. So I understand what you're saying, and I believe you. And we've had this come up in previous cases before. This is not the first time I've heard about this referral network among Town Car and party bus drivers and people in the auto transportation industry generally.

However, the statute says that advertising to provide the service is the same as providing it, so you will need to take that down off your website. You cannot participate in this.

What you can do if you get an inquiry is say, oh, my friends at Bayview can handle that, let me give you their information. But you can't represent as though you are able to provide that service directly yourself. That's what violates the law, so that's the distinction. And that's why you'll need to take that off of your website and make sure that you're not holding yourself out as Apex Limo can provide this service.

You're welcome to say, oh, here, call these other companies. I have information -- contact information for you and pass that along to the consumer, but not to make it appear as though Apex itself can provide that service.

1	Do you understand the distinction?
2	MR. ALEASAWI: Very understanding.
3	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
4	MR. ALEASAWI: Your Honor, there is one
5	thing I want to ask Mike, did you send a letter to say,
6	remove it from the website, because otherwise you got
7	you know, you can be accountable for marketing.
8	JUDGE PEARSON: Right.
9	MR. ALEASAWI: When we do the Town Car, when
10	we do the regular limousine, we go to the City of
11	Seattle, and there is no marketing in the side. There
12	is if the law change, they will tell you every year.
13	JUDGE PEARSON: Right.
14	MR. ALEASAWI: So I don't know what's
15	happening.
16	JUDGE PEARSON: I understand. I understand
17	exactly what you're saying, so I appreciate that
18	perspective.
19	Did you have anything else that you wanted
20	to add?
21	MR. ALEASAWI: Yeah. Just about the Yelp, I
22	mean, I cannot prove that. I never paid for Yelp.
23	There's a lot of company, like the marketing company
24	they put your name there just to to let you, hey,
25	come market with us. But I never market with Yelp. I

1	never market with Google, because I'm really busy with
2	Town Cars. I'm not doing any marketing.
3	JUDGE PEARSON: So Mr. Turcott, I'd like to
4	ask you a question. I don't know enough about how these
5	websites work, but it looks to me like this Yelp ad was
6	literally pulled from Apex's website. Do you think it's
7	possible that that happened without Mr. Aleasawi
8	proactively putting that information on Yelp?
9	MR. TURCOTT: I don't have direct
10	knowledge
11	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
12	MR. TURCOTT: of how this was created.
13	JUDGE PEARSON: Well, that has come up
14	multiple times, mostly in the household good
15	classification proceedings where and I know that the
16	other compliance investigation staff has confirmed that
17	there are instances where ads are generated without the
18	knowledge or consent of the company. I know that's
19	something that happens.
20	So I guess it would be useful to me if maybe
21	you could look into that a little bit more and find out
22	if that's the way Yelp works or
23	MR. TURCOTT: Yes, your Honor.
24	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. And that was Exhibit
25	O; is that right?

1	MR. TURCOTT: Yes.
2	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. I'm sorry. I'm just
3	looking through this, and it does it does reference
4	party bus rentals. I think that was Staff's basis
5	for even though we understand that you are a licensed
6	limousine operator, and you're entitled to advertise
7	those services, and that's fine, it's the reference to
8	party busses that need to be
9	MR. ALEASAWI: No problem.
LO	JUDGE PEARSON: removed from your
L1	website, and the photo taken down and
L2	MR. ALEASAWI: Sure.
L3	JUDGE PEARSON: things like that. So I
L4	guess we just need to know a little bit more about how
L5	the Yelp site is generated, because, like I said, I know
L6	that that's been a problem in the past that sometimes
L7	those that once someone creates a review of the
L8	company, Yelp may be going out and pulling off of the
L9	company's website. I'm just not sure. So I'd be more
20	comfortable if I knew how that worked.
21	MR. ALEASAWI: Yes.
22	MR. TURCOTT: Yes, your Honor.
23	MR. ALEASAWI: Like in Google, they call it
24	organic name. Like if there's only one Seattle
25	limousine in Seattle. Google will attract it to make

1	Google to make Seattle number one so they can sell
2	them by click, and that's how they do it. I mean, Yelp
3	calling me every day, even I told them I don't want, and
4	they
5	JUDGE PEARSON: Oh, okay.
6	MR. ALEASAWI: and they email me every
7	day, we can put you in good position. And even Google,
8	they do this.
9	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.
10	MR. ALEASAWI: No problem.
11	JUDGE PEARSON: Do you have anything else
12	that you'd like to add?
13	MR. ALEASAWI: Your Honor, I just want to
14	say, like, my conclusion is, like, you can look at my
15	record, and you can look let them look at my record.
16	I never have fatality or, like, bad accident, anything
17	in my 15 years. I choose a good driver, I've been
18	well-known in the market.
19	This is an honest mistake, and now I know
20	it. They never inform us you have to take it out, and
21	that's what I'm gonna do right now. I'm gonna go there,
22	call my website guy, take it out. I don't even deal
23	with it. If I'm a party bus guy, I could have bought a
24	second one and third one and fourth one.
25	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.

1		MR. ALEASAWI: Thank you so much.
2		JUDGE PEARSON: Ms. Cameron-Rulkowski, do
3	you h	nave any questions for Mr. Aleasawi?
4		MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: I do, your Honor.
5		
6		CROSS-EXAMINATION
7	BY M	IS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI:
8	Q.	Mr. Aleasawi, Apex renewed the registration on
9	that 2	2003 International bus in April of this year,
10	corre	ct?
11	A.	That's right.
12	Q.	And what vehicles what other vehicles does
13	Apex	Limousine own?
14	A.	Apex so Apex 2, Apex 4, Apex 6, Apex 7, 8, 9,
15	10, 1	1, until 15.
16	Q.	And what type of vehicles are these?
17	A.	Town Cars, SUV, Ford van, 14-passenger. The
18	stret	ch limo, it's same thing. It's out of the
19	insu	rance. They are only 14 and below.
20	Q.	That's what I wanted to know. Thank you.
21	A.	Yeah.
22	Q.	And does Apex Limousine lease any vehicles?
23	A.	No.
24	Q.	Does it lease any vehicles from any other
25	comp	pany?

1	A.	Leasing from another company?
2	Q.	Correct.
3	A.	No, we don't.
4	Q.	Thank you.
5		And what vehicles do you own in your own name?
6	A.	My Jeep, I have a Jeep Wrangler, and I have my
7	SUV,	like Suburban.
8	Q.	And neither of those are commercial vehicles,
9	corre	ct?
L O	A.	No.
L1	Q.	All right.
L2		And now, you talked about insurance. So did I
L3	unde	rstand correctly that the 2003 bus is currently not
L4	insur	ed?
L5	A.	As of now?
L6	Q.	Correct.
L7	A.	It's not.
L8	Q.	All right.
L9		Do you hold a uniform carrier registration
20	numk	per?
21	A.	What does that mean?
22	Q.	Do you hold a UCR number, which is what carriers
23	gene	rally are required to have to hold
24	A.	Like the
25	Q.	for Department of from Department of

1	Transportation?
2	A. Like the one they put it in the party bus or the
3	charter on the side of it? That's what you mean?
4	Q. That number would be the DOT number on the side
5	of the vehicle.
6	A. Yeah. I don't know if it still exists. You
7	cancelled the certificate. Maybe it's not exist. But
8	it is there on the bus. It's we stick it in the bus
9	on the side, and it's still there, and I don't remember
10	what the number.
11	Q. And do you go by the name of AJ?
12	A. Yes.
13	Q. All righty.
14	And we were talking about the Yelp
15	advertisement.
16	A. Okay.
17	Q. And on there, there's a section that says, Meet
18	the business owner, and it lists "AJ A" as the business
19	owner.
20	A. I don't know about the A.
21	Q. Presumably Aleasawi?
22	A. Could be.
23	Q. Did you and you said that Yelp contacted you
24	multiple times. Did you ever confirm that you were the
25	business in this Yelp profile?
	1

1	A. I mean, I'm surprised sometimes when even they
2	call me and they say AJ with my nickname. They never
3	say even, like, my last name. And I don't know how they
4	know, honestly. Maybe like Mr. Mike, they call me on
5	different number, and I say, this is AJ, and then how
6	they get it.
7	Q. And have you ever asked them to change the text
8	on the profile?
9	A. I didn't know even there is a profile, believe
10	it or not. I never went to Yelp. I don't even get a
11	call from Yelp. Look at the review. Maybe there is not
12	even review. Like, I don't think there is a review.
13	I'm not getting any call from the marketing. I'm not
14	doing any marketing. And I can prove this with a bank
15	statement.
16	Q. All right.
17	You had testified that you had called the
18	Commission, and I believe this was sometime in 2014; is
19	that correct?
20	A. After I get the first ticket, like, the first
21	penalty, I called them and I came here and I say
22	yeah, so
23	Q. All right.
24	And do you recall who you spoke with?
25	A. This is my mistake, I didn't write number, but I

1	know it's a girl, and she was trying to help me. And
2	she said, if you don't drive that bus out of the state,
3	you don't need to do the report yearly, annual.
4	And I talked to Bayview and I talked with the
5	company, and they said, yes, they do it themselves
6	because they go across Canada and across Portland. And
7	I told them, I don't have to do it because you guys told
8	me I don't have to do it.
9	Q. When you replied to the email from Mr. Turcott
10	who was posing as a customer and offered the
11	transportation, how would that transportation have been
12	provided if that trip had gone forward?
13	A. As I mentioned, I could give it to Bayview
14	because they have a party bus, and I take the
15	20 percent. That's what I do. Or I will call AA
16	Limousine and say, tomorrow I'm gonna like tomorrow
17	if somebody call me, I say, I have another company, they
18	can do it for you. And I can sell it for \$2,000. They
19	do it for \$1,800, I get the 200. And we do with the
20	Town Car, with every car, not only with the party bus.
21	Q. All right.
22	Mr. Aleasawi, I would ask you to turn to Exhibit
23	No. K, and this on your exhibit, this is page 45 of
24	MT-1.
25	A. Okay. That's A-45; that's right?

1	Q. That's correct.
2	A. Okay.
3	Q. All right.
4	And then do you see the second paragraph there?
5	And I would just ask you to could you please read
6	A. I have an MT-1, that's from 45 A-45.
7	Q. Hold on. Oh, I'm sorry. It's A-36.
8	JUDGE PEARSON: Yeah, at the bottom of the
9	page, the page number at the bottom, not at the top.
10	MR. ALEASAWI: Yeah, that's the bottom is
11	A-45.
12	JUDGE PEARSON: Right. So look at 36.
13	MR. ALEASAWI: Oh, 36.
14	JUDGE PEARSON: Yeah.
15	And then I have a question. Is your last
16	name two words?
17	MR. ALEASAWI: No. Aleasawi.
18	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. The letter is
19	addressed to A-L space E-A-S-A-W-I.
20	MR. ALEASAWI: No idea.
21	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. It's just one word.
22	I just wanted to make sure that I get it correct.
23	MR. ALEASAWI: You say 36? I'm sorry.
24	MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Page A-36 at the
25	bottom.

1	MR. ALEASAWI: Okay.
2	BY MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI:
3	Q. All right.
4	And do you see the second paragraph there
5	beginning "Under"? Could you just read that first
6	sentence, please?
7	A. I'm not good with reading, so you got to handle
8	my
9	Q. It's okay. I understand.
10	A. So that will say [as read], "Under legislation
11	passed in 2015, person who is offered advertiser or
12	provide party bus service in consideration of engaging
13	the operation of charter bus or carrier, this required a
14	certificate of authority from Commission regardless."
15	Q. That's fine.
16	A. Okay.
17	Q. That's fine. Thank you.
18	MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: I have no further
19	questions for Mr. Aleasawi.
20	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you. All
21	right.
22	So does Staff have anything further with
23	respect to the penalty recommendation? Has that changed
24	now that you've heard from Mr. Aleasawi?
25	MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Nothing further at

1	this point, your Honor.
2	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. I'll just say that
3	that's unusual. Usually Staff recommends suspending a
4	portion of the penalty, even in situations that are very
5	similar to this. So if you want a few minutes to think
6	about that, I'd be happy to give it to you.
7	(Brief pause in the proceedings.)
8	MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Your Honor, may I
9	call Mr. Turcott back?
10	JUDGE PEARSON: Sure, of course.
11	
12	REDIRECT EXAMINATION
13	BY MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI:
14	Q. Mr. Turcott, please proceed with the penalty
15	recommendation.
16	A. Staff would further recommend suspension of
17	\$10,000 of the total \$15,000 penalty on certain
18	conditions: Either the company immediately obtain a
19	certificate of authority for charter service, or
20	immediately cease and desist advertising the party bus,
21	offering to provide transportation, or actually
22	providing it, all of the above. So and that would
23	leave 5,000 to be paid.
24	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
25	And what's your recommendation for the

1	length of time of the suspension?
2	MR. TURCOTT: Two years.
3	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
4	Anything further from either party before we
5	go off the record?
6	MR. ALEASAWI: Well, your Honor, can I
7	JUDGE PEARSON: Sure.
8	MR. ALEASAWI: Well, I wasn't even happy
9	with the first penalty, you know. I told you, I was
10	I have a clear communication with their office, and I
11	drove from Seattle to here to talk to somebody, and I
12	say, why I will get the penalty? And they said I
13	made it clear to them. They say, you don't have to
14	apply for that certificate if you are not driving across
15	the state.
16	And I asked different limo carrier, and
17	that's what they told me. They say, we do it because we
18	drive to Portland, we drive to Vancouver. My party bus
19	is really old, 2013, and that's why it's broken.
20	And I'm never aware of the law. And as I
21	said, 15 years in business, I never done anything wrong.
22	City of Seattle know me. Port of Seattle know me. And
23	to me, as evidence, Mr. Mike, he showing up, and it's
24	not the every like just me, Apex Limousine, doing
25	it. I brought my iPad to show you, like, there is

1	hundred of website doing it, and doing the same thing,
2	because we thought it's legal.
3	If you guys make it clear this is illegal, I
4	should it should be, like, more clear, like, letter,
5	or even when we do the like, the inspection should
6	be, like, talking, handing paper to the to the limo
7	companies, to the owner.
8	And for the website and for the reservation
9	he did, I think that was illegal to call me and harass
10	me with a different phone number. And he said he
11	didn't, but then he admit it. Thank you.
12	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.
13	So Mr. Turcott, how long do you think you
14	would need to look into that Yelp issue?
15	MR. TURCOTT: A day or two.
16	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
17	So why don't we just I'll call that a
18	bench request, Bench Request No. 1, and why don't I give
19	you three days. How does that sound?
20	MR. TURCOTT: Thank you, your Honor.
21	JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
22	So Mr. Turcott's going to look into the Yelp
23	advertisement and how that's generated to see how that
24	came about. Okay? And once I hear back from him, then
25	I'll he able to nut together an order, which I will

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1	issue most likely within the next ten days reflecting my
2	decision. Okay?
3	MR. ALEASAWI: Thank you very much.
4	JUDGE PEARSON: Thank you for coming here
5	today. All right. Then we are adjourned.
6	MS. CAMERON-RULKOWSKI: Thank you,
7	your Honor.
