Promote energy conservation

Objective: Accumulate, companywide, 2,500,000 conservation points.

Since conservation is one of Puget Power's least-cost energy resources, the Energy Plus program continues to emphasize the value of conserving energy.

Embracing this goal last year, employees easily achieved the required 1 million points, which helped the company achieve 24 aMW of savings through conservation programs.

Again this year, conservation points can be accumulated in three broad areas: customer conservation, conservation at home and conservation in company facilities through the following activities:

Points

Customer Conservation Program Participation

Refer customers for participation in Puget Power's residential or commercial new construction or retrofit energy conservation programs.

Energy Conservation at Home

Participate in any of Puget Power's energy conservation service programs or otherwise implement conservation measures in your own home per the 30 Simple Energy Conservation Things You Can Do to Save the Earth book.

Conservation in Company Facilities

Implement an energy conservation activity or measure in the building or facility in which you work

10 points per 100 kWh/month saved

Each employee is responsible for reporting the number of conservation points earned each month on a scorecard and turning it in to the department's Energy Plus coordinator. Coordinators are responsible for tallying points from the scorecards and reporting totals to the Compensation Department by the 10th of each month.



Community service and the environment

Objective: Both parts must be achieved.

Part I
Accumulate, companywide, 6,000,000 community points through the following activities:

Activities

1. Community Service

■ Volunteer work for any community service activity in the areas of health and human services, education, culture and the performing arts, and civic activities. Exclusions will be environmental organizations (already covered in Energy Plus) and religious organizations, unless the activity provides service to the community at large

■ Donations to United Way and other community organizations that meet the above criteria

Point Value

100 points per employee hour

2. Energy Fund

■ Organizer of an Energy Fund event

■ Participation in Energy Fund payroll deductions

■ Energy Fund contribution with bill payment

100 points per employee per fund-raising event

5 points per employee per month

5 points per employee per contribution.

3. Food Bank and/or Clothing Donations; Group Food and/or Clothing Drives

■ Individual contributions.

5 points per item or 5 points per contribution.

■ Group food drives

100 points for the group (once per drive) plus 2 points per item or 2 points per dollar.

4. Adopt A Family

■ This can be a holiday or year-round activity

10 points per employee per month.

5. Blood Bank Donations

200 points per employee per donation.

6. Support for Education

100 points per employee per hour

Education reform and future work force preparedness rank among the top societal issues facing our country today. Puget Power has a long history of support for education. The company is committed to investing and involving employees in the process of improving the teaching and learning of our young people.

Through the Energy Plus program, employees can earn 100 community points per hour by supporting the education needs of our local schools in the following ways:

- Volunteering as a school tutor
- Attending PTA/PTSA meetings
- Serving on school boards and committees
- Participating in career fairs or counseling

Part II Accumulate, companywide, 700,000 earth points through the following activities:

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Car pooling, bus ridership, walking to work, biking to work, and other means of reducing single-occupancy vehicle commuting | 25 points per employee month |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Home recycling (paper, yard wastes, hazardous wastes, etc.) | 5 points per employee month |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Office recycling (WOW, aluminum cans and newspapers) | 3 points per employee month. |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Waste reduction (not recycling) such as generating less paper or purchasing products with less packaging | 1 pt. per lb. of reduced waste |
