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PROCEEDINGS: Air Liquide, et al. filed their original Formal Complaint Requesting Emergency Adjudicative Proceeding in Docket No. UE-001952 on December 12, 2000. Complainants filed an Amended Complaint on December 18, 2000, and a Second Amended Complaint on December 28, 2000. PSE filed its Petition in Docket No. UE-001959 on December 13, 2000. PSE filed its Answer to the first Amended Complaint on January 2, 2000.

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The Commission, on due and proper notice, conducted a prehearing conference on December 14, 2000, before Chairwoman Marilyn Showalter, Commissioner Richard Hemstad, and Administrative Law Judge Dennis J. Moss. Among other things, the Commission established a procedural schedule, invoked the discovery rule (WAC 480-09-480), and entered a Protective Order (First Supplemental Order, December 19, 2000). A second prehearing conference was convened before ALJ Moss on

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future conform to the requirements for filing as stated in the Commission's procedural rules and in prior Order in this proceeding. Parties should be on notice that future filings that fail to conform to these requirements may not be considered.

DISPOSITION: Complainants filed this action requesting Emergency Adjudicative Proceedings under RCW 34.05.479 and WAC 480-09-510. The Commission and the Parties have proceeded under an expedited schedule to permit an early hearing to determine, among other things, the threshold question whether the circumstances of which Air Liquide, et al. complain involve "an immediate danger to the public health, safety, or welfare requiring immediate action by the commission." WAC 480-09-510(1).

Originally, the hearing was scheduled at Complainants' request for December 29, 2000. During discussion with the Parties at our second prehearing conference, it became apparent that the Parties simply could not accomplish all that needed to be accomplished by that deadline. Accordingly, the evidentiary hearing was postponed by one business week. Additional process and procedural dates were established by the presiding Administrative Law Judge following full consultation with the Parties. Among other things, January 4, 2001, was established as the date for filing prehearing briefs. This allowed only a single business day between the filing of prehearing briefs and the commencement of evidentiary hearings on January 8, 2001. The Parties and the Commission require some period of time to review and consider the prehearing briefs. Moreover, the Parties and the Commission must complete various other demanding tasks prior to the commencement of evidentiary hearings. One business day is barely adequate to accomplish all that must be accomplished to ensure an orderly proceeding. For these reasons, it would not be appropriate to grant an extension of time for the filing of briefs.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS That the request for an extension to file prehearing briefs is DENIED.
