COMPLAINT AND ORDER SUSPENDING TARIFF REVISIONS

BACKGROUND

- On November 14, 2016, Pacific Power & Light Company (Pacific Power or Company) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) revisions to its currently effective Tariff WN U-75, Rule 1 General Rules and Regulations; Rule 4 Application for Electric Service; Rule 6 Facilities on Customer's Premises; and Schedule 300 Charges as Defined by the Rules and Regulations.
- The Company requests approval of modifications to its permanent disconnection and removal procedures to eliminate confusion and avoid cost shifting when its customers disconnect service to receive electric service from another energy provider.

DISCUSSION

The Company's proposed tariff revisions raise issues that warrant further investigation to determine whether they are in the public interest. As authorized under RCW 80.04.130, the Commission suspends the tariff revisions pending the outcome of that investigation.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS

The Commission is an agency of the State of Washington vested by statute with the authority to regulate rates, regulations, practices, accounts, securities, transfers of property, and affiliated interests of public service companies; including electric companies.

5 (2) Pacific Power is an electric company and a public service company subject to Commission jurisdiction.

6 (3) The Commission concludes that the tariff revisions Pacific Power filed on November 14, 2016, warrant further investigation. Accordingly, the tariff revisions should be suspended.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- 7 (1) The tariff revisions Pacific Power & Light Company filed on November 14, 2016, are suspended.
- 8 (2) The Commission may hold hearings at such times and places as may be required.
- 9 (3) Pacific Power & Light Company must not change or alter the tariffs filed in this docket during the suspension period, unless authorized by the Commission.
