(All proceedings were translated by the interpreter, and all answers given were through the interpreter, unless otherwise noted.)

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Let's be on the record. Good morning. This is Docket TE-180219, which is captioned In the Matter of Determining the Proper Carrier Classification of and Complaint for Penalties Against Tiger Express Shipping Corporation, doing business as Tiger Travel.

My name is Laura Chartoff, and I am an administrative law judge with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission. I am the presiding officer for today's hearing being conducted at the Commission's headquarters in Olympia. Today is Monday, June 4th, 2018, and the time is 1:30 p.m.

Madam Interpreter, are you going to be --
Let's go off the record for a minute.
(Pause in the proceedings.)
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Let's be back on the record. Okay. So let's start by taking short

1 appearances starting with Commission Staff. So please 2 state your name and job title.

MR. RAUB: My name is Justin Raub. Last name is spelled $\mathrm{R}-\mathrm{a}-\mathrm{u}-\mathrm{b}$. I'm a compliance investigator within consumer protection.

MR. FELDMAN: Good afternoon, Your Honor. Patrick Feldman, Feldman \& Lee. Last name is spelled F, as in Frank, $e-l-d-m-a-n$. Counsel for Mr. Ye.

You want to identify yourself?
THE INTERPRETER: He wants to identify himself.

MR. YE: Hello, everyone. My name's Zhongxiang Ye, last name $Y$-e.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you.
Okay. So you are here because the Commission filed a complaint alleging that your company is performing or advertising to perform work as a charter party or excursion services carrier without the required permit. The purpose of today's proceeding is to explain what your choices are and then hear from you regarding which option you wish to pursue. You can choose one of two options on behalf of your company.

Okay. The first option is to cease and desist providing, offering, or advertising unpermitted charter party or excursion services. If you choose this

1 option, you will need to demonstrate what you have done

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So -- okay. At this time, I'm going to swear in Mr. Raub.
(Justin Raub sworn.)
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you. Okay.
Mr. Feldman has indicated they intend to pursue a cease and desist order. Is that acceptable to Staff?

MR. RAUB: Yes, Your Honor.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So at this point, then, we're going to take a recess, and I'll give you the opportunity to speak with Staff and see if you can agree on an order for entry.

MR. FELDMAN: Okay. Thank you, Your Honor.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Essentially, that order will say that you agree you were operating without a permit, that you advertised without a permit, and that you agree to stop operating until you get a permit if you decide to apply for one.

Once you are satisfied that you understand all the terms of the order, you and Staff will both sign it. It will include but most -- most likely an agreement as to the amount of the penalty to be imposed, but if not, you can make your case about why the penalty should be different than what Staff is recommending.

MR. FELDMAN: And just one moment, Your Honor. Okay, Your Honor. I think we're prepared to, I

1 guess, have me talk to the Staff now to see if we can work to a mutual agreement, and if not, I guess come back in front of the Court after a break.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Yes.
Anything further from Staff?
MR. RAUB: No, Your Honor.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So I'll be in my office and please notify me when I need to come back. So we will be in recess.
(Recess taken from 1:44 p.m. until 2:33 p.m.)

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Let's be back on the record. So I have the order. I have a couple of questions for Mr. Ye, so I need to swear you in.
(Zhongxiang Ye sworn.)
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Mr. Ye, did you have a chance to go through the order?

THE INTERPRETER: Yes, yes, he does.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: And do you understand all five pages prior to the signature page?

THE INTERPRETER: He read all of them, and the attorney explained all to him, and he fully understand.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Thank you.
Okay. And for the record, it looks like

MR. YE: Yes.
JUDGE CHARTOFF: Thank you. Okay. And the penalty amount is $\$ 5,000$. A $\$ 4,500$ portion of the penalty is suspended for a period of two years from the date of this order and then waived provided Tiger Travel refrains from further operations as a charter party or excursion carrier in the state of Washington. Okay -provided Tiger Travel doesn't get a permit. And the remainder of the penalty I understand was paid today? MR. YE: (In English) Yes. JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. And I just wanted to mention that consistent with that on Appendix A, I wrote in that -- that the due date of the $\$ 500$ was today. I think that was just a -MR. FELDMAN: Sorry. Yes, Your Honor. JUDGE CHARTOFF: -- fixing an error. MR. FELDMAN: Yeah, we'll acknowledge that, Your Honor. Thank you.

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. Okay. So I will go ahead and sign this. Any questions?

MR. FELDMAN: Nothing further from our side, Your Honor. Thank you. JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. So I will sign this, I'll hand this to Staff, and they will make a copy for you. And once you get your copy, you're free to go. MR. FELDMAN: Thank you very much, Your

JUDGE CHARTOFF: Okay. We are adjourned. (Adjourned at 2:38 p.m.)
