- 2
- JUDGE PEARSON: This is Docket TR-180466, which
- 4 is a petition filed by Whatcom County to install median
- 5 barriers at a highway rail grade crossing at Cliffside
- 6 Drive in Bellingham, Washington.
- 7 Today is Thursday, August 2nd, 2018, at 9:30 a.m.
- 8 And we are here for a prehearing conference to
- 9 discuss scheduling and other procedural issues.
- 10 My name is Rayne Pearson. I'm an administrative
- 11 law judge with the Utilities and Transportation
- 12 Commission. And seated to my left is Judge Laura
- 13 Chartoff, who is co-presiding with me in this case.
- So let's begin by taking appearances. I'll start
- 15 with staff, who can enter a short appearance. And then I
- 16 will take full appearances from the attorneys on the
- 17 phone.
- 18 So Mr. Roberson. Go ahead.
- 19 MR. ROBERSON: Good morning. My name is Jeff
- 20 Roberson, R-O-B-E-R-S-O-N. I'm the Assistant Attorney
- 21 General representing Commission Staff.
- 22 JUDGE PEARSON: And Ms. Willingham, if you could
- 23 enter a full appearance, stating your full name, spelling
- 24 your last name, and then providing your address, phone
- 25 number, and email address.

- 1 MS. WILLINGHAM: Yes, ma'am. This is Jennifer
- 2 Willingham, last name, W-I-L-L-I-N-G-H-A-M, attorney for
- 3 BNSF Railroad. My address is 2500 Lou Menk, that is
- 4 L-O-U, M-E-N-K, Drive, and then capital A, capital O,
- 5 capital B-3, Fort Worth, Texas, 76131. And I also have
- 6 Stephen Semenick with BNSF on the phone, as well. And
- 7 that last name is S-E-M-E-N-I-C-K, my email address is
- 8 jennifer.willingham, W-I-L-L-I-N-G-H-A-M, @bnsf.com.
- 9 MS. PEARSON: Thank you, Ms. Willingham.
- 10 And, Mr. Quinn, if you would similarly enter a
- 11 full appearance, stating your full name, spelling your
- 12 last name, and providing your address, telephone number,
- 13 and email address for the record.
- MR. QUINN: Yes, ma'am.
- Good morning. Christopher Quinn, Civil Deputy
- 16 Prosecuting Attorney appearing for Whatcom County,
- 17 representing the petitioner in this case. My address is
- 18 the Whatcom County Courthouse, 311 Grand Avenue, that's
- 19 Suite 201, in Bellingham, Washington, 98225. My email
- 20 address is letter C-Q-U-I-N-N @ C-O dot W-H-A-T-C-O-M dot
- 21 W-A dot U-S. My phone number is (360) 778-5710. I'm also
- 22 present at this time with Jim Karcher,
- 23 engineer with Whatcom County Public Works.
- MS. PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.
- Is there anyone else on the bridge line who

- 1 wishes to enter an appearance?
- 2 (No response.)
- 3 MS. PEARSON: Okay. Hearing nothing.
- 4 Is there any party on the bridge line seeking
- 5 intervention?
- 6 (No response.)
- 7 MS. PEARSON: Okay. Again hearing nothing.
- 8 We'll move on.
- 9 Do the parties want the discovery rules to be
- 10 available in this case?
- 11 MS. WILLINGHAM: Yes, your Honor.
- MS. PEARSON: Okay.
- MR. QUINN: Yes, from Whatcom County also, your
- 14 Honor.
- MS. PEARSON: Okay. Then we will make those
- 16 available. Which brings us to the schedule.
- 17 Mr. Roberson, have the parties had a chance to
- 18 come to an agreed schedule?
- 19 MR. ROBERSON: Yes, your Honor. The parties have
- 20 agreed essentially on a schedule, although there's one
- 21 caveat, which is the parties are still trying to determine
- 22 when an appropriate date for a mediation or settlement
- 23 discussion would be.
- MS. PEARSON: Okay.
- MR. ROBERSON: But as to the agreed schedule,

- 1 direct testimony by Whatcom County would be due
- 2 November 2nd, 2018.
- Response testimony from BNSF and staff would be
- 4 due December 14th, 2018.
- 5 Cross answering or rebuttal testimony would be
- 6 due January 11, 2019.
- 7 MS. PEARSON: Okay. Hold on one second. You
- 8 said January 11th?
- 9 MR. ROBERSON: Yes, your Honor.
- MS. PEARSON: Okay. Okay.
- 11 MR. ROBERSON: Cross exhibits and the exhibit
- 12 list would be due February 15th, 2019.
- 13 MS. PEARSON: Sorry. Say that date again.
- MR. ROBERSON: February 15th, 2019.
- MS. PEARSON: Okay. Discovery cutoff?
- MR. ROBERSON: That we didn't decide.
- 17 MS. PEARSON: Okay. What about a hearing date?
- 18 MR. ROBERSON: March 5th, 2019.
- 19 MS. PEARSON: Okay. And simultaneous
- 20 post-hearing briefs?
- 21 MR. ROBERSON: Public comment hearing would also
- 22 be on March 5th, 2019.
- MS. PEARSON: Right.
- 24 MR. ROBERSON: And then simultaneous post-hearing
- 25 briefs would be due April 5, 2019.

- 1 And I also spoke with Mr. Quinn. And he's agreed
- 2 to provide a hearing room in Whatcom County for the
- 3 hearing.
- 4 MS. PEARSON: Okay. So the only issue is -- or
- 5 discovery cutoff is typically two weeks before the
- 6 hearing?
- 7 MR. ROBERSON: Typically.
- 8 MS. PEARSON: Okay. So let's just pick a date?
- 9 As you're aware the procedural rules require a settlement
- 10 date. And so, I'd like you to pick one now; otherwise,
- 11 I'm going to have to say in the order that you have three
- 12 business days to do so. And then we'll have to file
- 13 paperwork. And I'll have to issue a notice. And it's a
- 14 lot of extra work. So if we need to take a recess --
- MR. QUINN: Whatcom County is open to a date that
- 16 would be acceptable to BNSF.
- 17 MS. WILLINGHAM: Your Honor, do you want us to go
- 18 off the record and we can --
- 19 JUDGE PEARSON: Sure. Why don't we take a
- 20 recess. I'll leave the room. And the parties can
- 21 discuss.
- 22 And then, Mr. Roberson, if you just want to let
- 23 me know. And this can be, you know, settlement or
- 24 mediation; it's up to you. The rule requires a settlement
- 25 hearing so -- or settlement conference. So it's up to you

- 1 how you want to handle that. So we will go ahead and go
- 2 off the record. And while we're off the record, if you
- 3 could also get a date for the discovery cutoff so that
- 4 when we come back, we can put that into the schedule, as
- 5 well.
- 6 MS. WILLINGHAM: Absolutely.
- 7 JUDGE PEARSON: And I will be in my office.
- 8 (Recessed from 9:35 a.m.
- 9 until 9:40 a.m.)
- 10 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. So let's be back on the
- 11 record following a short recess.
- 12 And, Mr. Roberson, I understand that the parties
- 13 have agreed on a settlement conference date.
- MR. ROBERSON: They have. October 24th, 2018.
- 15 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. And at this time parties
- 16 are not requesting mediation?
- 17 MR. ROBERSON: Not at this time.
- JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. But you'll let me know if
- 19 that changes so we can assign another judge to do the
- 20 mediation?
- MR. ROBERSON: Yes, your Honor.
- 22 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. What about the discovery
- 23 cutoff date?
- MR. ROBERSON: February 12th, 2019.
- JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Then -- so, Mr. Quinn, do

- 1 you also have the room reserved up there in Bellingham for
- 2 the hearing?
- 3 MR. QUINN: I do not. I believe we wanted to
- 4 wait to hear on the court's preference, parties'
- 5 preference. But we will have it available.
- 6 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. So this is the way it's
- 7 going to work: If you can confirm with me the exact
- 8 location and address and secure that, and email me and the
- 9 parties later today, then I can reflect that in the
- 10 prehearing conference order; otherwise, I will have to
- 11 schedule it here in Olympia and then again issue another
- 12 notice later down the road. So my preference is that if
- 13 you could make the reservation and let me know later
- 14 today, then we can lock that down.
- MR. QUINN: Of course. I will have that to you
- 16 before noon today.
- 17 JUDGE PEARSON: That's great. Okay. And will
- 18 that be at the Whatcom County Courthouse?
- 19 MR. QUINN: The courthouse, your Honor.
- 20 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Great. Is there anything
- 21 else that we need to address while we're here today?
- (No response.)
- JUDGE PEARSON: No?
- MR. QUINN: Not from Whatcom County, your Honor.
- MR. ROBERSON: Not from staff's perspective.
