Dear Judge Pearson:

Clark County respectfully requests that the procedural schedule for this matter be suspended to allow the parties to focus their efforts on reaching a negotiated resolution. This request is supported by good cause and is not opposed by BNSF or UTC Staff.

On September 12, 2019, the parties conducted a productive settlement conference and it appears that a negotiated settlement may be possible in this matter. However, given the complexity of the issues involved in this case, additional time is necessary to determine whether an agreement can be reached and to seek any necessary approvals from the Federal Railroad Administration. A suspension of the procedural schedule will serve the interests of judicial economy by allowing the parties and staff to continue productive settlement discussions without simultaneously spending limited time and resources litigating this matter to hearing. Under these circumstances, good cause exists to suspend the procedural schedule, including all deadlines and hearing dates.

If this request is granted and the procedural schedule is suspended, Clark County intends to provide regular updates to the UTC staff, as well as notice of any settlement agreement.
