Commission Staff respectfully requests that the commission extend today's September 11, 2020 deadline for response to Avista's petition in the above-referenced docket to a date after the September 24, 2020 open meeting, at which time the commission is expected to resolve issues related to Avista's standard contract in Docket UE-190663.

Avista's avoided cost rate methodology for power purchases from large qualified facilities, found in Revised Exhibit A to its petition, appears to differ materially and substantially from the Schedule 62 avoided cost tariff under consideration by the commission in Docket UE-190663. For this reason, Staff requests permission to file comments in response to Avista's petition by October 31, 2020, with a commission order to follow.
