10	Tel West Communications, LLC ("Tel West") hereby submits to the Commission this Petition for				
11	Designation as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier (ETC) pursuant to Section 214(e)(2) of				
12	the relevant multications act of 1754, as antended (Act), 47 0.5.e. § 214(c)(2), and Section				
13	54.201 of the rules of the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC"), 47 C.F.R. § 54.201.				
14	Tel West requests that it be designated as eligible to receive all available support from the federal				
15	Universal Service Fund ("USF") including, but not limited to, support for low income consumers.				
16	In support of its Petition, Tel West provides the following:				
17	I. Name and Address of Petitioner				
18	The name and address of Petitioner are Tel West Communications, LLC, 3701 S. Norfolk				
19	Street, Suite 300, Seattle, WA 98118.				
20	II. Applicable Statutes and Rules				
21	The statutes and rules pertaining to this Petition are as follows: 47 U.S.C. §§ 153(44),				
22	214(e), 253(b), and 254(d); C.F.R. §§ 51.5, 54.5, 54.101, 54.201, 54.207, and 54.307.				
23	III. Authorization and Service Area				
24	1. Tel West was granted authority to provide local exchange services by the Commission				
25	in its order dated October 28, 1998, in Docket UT-981258;				
26	2. Tel West is a telecommunications carrier as defined in 47 U.S.C. § 153(44) and 47				
	C.F.R. § 51.5, and for the purposes of Part 54 of the FCC's rules. Tel West is				

1			therefore considered a common carrier under the Act.
2		3.	A telecommunications carrier may be designated as an ETC and receive universal
3			service support through its designated service area if it agrees to a) offer services that
4			are supported by federal universal support mechanisms, and b) advertise the availability
5			of such services [(47 U.S.C. § 214(e)1)].
6		4.	Section 214(e)(2) of the Act provides that ETC designations shall be made for a
7			"service area" designated by the state commission. Accordingly, Tel West requests
8			designation as its service area the wire centers of Qwest, Sprint and Verizon, which are
9			the incumbent local exchange carriers ("ILECs") with whom Tel West has resale and
10			interconnection agreements in the state of Washington.
11	IV.	Τe	el West Offers the Services to Qualify for Federal USF Support
12		1.	Section 214(e)(1) of the Act and Section 54.201(d) of the FCC's rules provide that
13			carriers designated as ETCs shall, throughout their service areas, a) offer the services
14			that are supported by federal universal service support mechanisms, either using their
15			own facilities or a combination of their own facilities and resale of another carrier's
16			services, and b) advertise the availability of such services and the charges therefore
17			using media of general distribution. The services supported by the federal USF are
18			[(47 C.F.R. § 54.101(a)] are:

20			(a) Voice grade access to the public switched network(b) Local usage
21			(c) Dual tone multi-frequency signaling or its functional equivalent(d) Single party service or its functional equivalent
22			(e) Access to emergency services
23			(f) Access to operator services(g) Access to interexchange services
24			(h) Access to directory assistance
25		2.	(i) Toll limitation for qualifying low-income consumersTel West provides all of these supported services through a combination of resold
26		4.	ILEC services, Unbundled Network Elements ("UNEs") obtained from the ILECs [47
			The services, enounded retwork Elements (Ordes) obtained noin the ILECS [47

1	C.F.R. § 54.201(f)], and/or its own facilities throughout its service area, and therefore
2	satisfies the requirements of Section 214(e)(1) of the Act. Description of each of these
3	services follows:
4	(a) <u>Voice Grade Access</u> : Tel West provides voice grade access (300 – 3,000
5	Hz) to the public switched network either through resale and/or
6	interconnection arrangements with the ILECs, or through its own facilities.
7	(b) Local Usage: Tel West will comply with any and all minimum local usage
8	requirements when or if adopted by the FCC.
9	(c) DTMF Signaling: In the case of resold services of ILECs, signaling is
10	provided by the ILECs from whom Tel West obtains its resold services. In
11	the provision of service via UNEs or its own facilities, Tel West uses DTMF-
12	compliant network signaling throughout its service area.
13	(d) Single Party Service: Tel West provides only single party service throughout
14	its service area.
15	(e) Access to Emergency Services: Tel West provides access to emergency
16	services throughout its service area.
17	(f) Access to Operator Services: Tel West provides access to operator
18	services throughout its service area.
19	(g) Access to Directory Assistance: Tel West provides access to directory
20	assistance service throughout its service area.
21	(h) Toll Limitation: Tel West has, or has access to, toll blocking capabilities
22	which will provide toll blocking service for Lifeline customers.
23	3. Pursuant to Section 54.201 of the FCC's rules, Tel West will advertise the availability
24	of each of the supported services detailed above, throughout its service area, by media
25	of general distribution.
26	
	V. Statement of Need

Tel West currently provides significantly discounted local telephone service to over 6,600 low income consumers in Washington via the Washington Telephone Assistance Plan (WTAP). Designation as an ETC will allow Tel West to provide additional discounts of certain federal surcharges, will allow Tel West to expand its service offerings to include LifeLine and Link Up, which are federal USF programs, and to file claims with the federal USF administrators. With ETC designation, Tel West will also be able to offer services to tribal areas and receive appropriate compensation from the federal USF.

VI. **Granting Tel West's Petition Would Serve the Public Interest**

Granting of Tel West's Petition for Designation as an ETC would serve the public interest by promoting competition among service providers of local exchange services to low income consumers. Without support from the federal USF, Tel West is unable to offer such programs as LifeLine, Link Up, and services to tribal areas, thus reducing the choices low income consumers have for providers of such services.

WHEREFORE, pursuant to Section 214(e)(2) of the Act, Tel West respectfully requests that the Commission enter an order designating Tel West as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier.
