

PREPROPOSAL STATEMENT OF INQUIRY

CR-101 (June 2004)

(Implements RCW 34.05.310)

Do NOT use for expedited rule making

Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission Subject of possible rule making: The Commission will consider whether it should propose rules in chapter 480-30 WAC relating to rates (fares) and ratemaking for passenger transportation companies regulated under chapter 81.68 RCW. In its review the Commission will consider whether the current regulation of entry and rates (fares) for passenger transportation companies reflects sound public policy. The review will also consider, given the current entry regulation set forth in chapter 81.68 RCW, whether the Commission should adopt rules and/or recommend statutory changes to the legislature. Docket No. TC-060177 Statutes authorizing the agency to adopt rules on this subject: RCW 80.01.040; RCW 81.04.160; RCW 81.68.030 Reasons why rules on this subject may be needed and what they might accomplish: Rules may be needed to establish a specific ratemaking methodology for general rate increases and fuel surcharge increases.
