**BACKGROUND**

- 1     Excursion carrier services operating in the state of Washington, subject to regulation by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) must file and maintain proof of liability and property damage insurance.
  
- 2     On June 29, 2010, the Commission notified you by letter that your certificate to operate as an excursion carrier service in Washington state would be suspended if your insurance company did not file acceptable proof of insurance. We also informed you that you could contest suspension of your certificate by requesting a hearing within 10 days of receiving the notice.
  
- 3     The Commission has not received proof of insurance and you have not requested a hearing.

**FINDINGS AND CONCLUSION**

- 4     (1)    The Commission is an agency of the State of Washington with authority to regulate an excursion carrier service as defined in RCW 81.70.
  
- 5     (2)    Rafael V. Deleon, d/b/a Boyet Transport, (Boyet Transport), is an excursion carrier service operating in Washington state under certificate ES-179.
  
- 6     (3)    On June 29, 2010, the Commission received notice of insurance cancellation related to Boyet Transport, effective August 13, 2010.

- 7 (4) The Commission is authorized by WAC 480-30-171(1)(a) to suspend an excursion carrier service certificate for failure to file and maintain proof of insurance.
- 8 (5) The Commission is authorized by WAC 480-30-171(2)(a) to cancel an excursion carrier service certificate for failure to correct conditions leading to suspension within the time defined in the order of suspension.

**ORDER**

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS:**

- 9 (1) The excursion carrier service certificate ES-179 held by Rafael V. Deleon, d/b/a Boyet Transport, is suspended for a period of 30 days effective August 13, 2010.
- 10 (2) Rafael V. Deleon, d/b/a Boyet Transport, is directed to **cease** all operations associated with certificate ES-179 until the Commission receives proof of liability and property damage insurance and enters an order lifting this suspension order and authorizing you to resume operations.
- 11 (3) If proof of insurance is not filed with the Commission within 30 days, certificate ES-179 will be cancelled without further notice or order. To reinstate this certificate you must submit a new application and acceptable proof of insurance.
- 12 (4) Rafael V. Deleon, d/b/a Boyet Transport, may contest cancellation of certificate ES-179 by requesting a hearing within 10 days of service of this Order. A hearing request does not affect the suspension status of your certificate.
- 13 The Commission has delegated authority to the Secretary, or to the Secretary's delegate, to enter this Order under RCW 80.01.030 and WAC 480-07-905(5)(b), and Order 01 in Docket A090485.

**NOTICE:** This is an order delegated to the Secretary, or to the Secretary's delegate, for decision. In addition to serving you a copy of the decision, the Commission will post on its Internet Web site for at least 14 days a listing of all matters delegated to the Secretary for decision. You may seek Commission review of this decision. You must file a request for Commission review of this order no later than fourteen (14) days after the date the decision is posted on the Commission's Web site.

The Commission will schedule your request for review by issuing a notice of hearing to be held before an administrative law judge. The Commission, at its discretion, may consider your request for review in an adjudicative proceeding under RCW 34.05 Part IV, or in a brief adjudicative proceeding under RCW 34.05.482 through .494. Following hearing, the administrative law judge will enter an initial order. If you wish to seek review of the initial order, you may file a petition for administrative review under RCW 34.05.464, or if the matter is heard in a brief adjudicative proceeding, under RCW 34.05.491.

The Commission will grant a late-filed request for review only on a showing of good cause, including a satisfactory explanation of why the person did not timely file the request. A form for late-filed requests is available on the Commission's Web site.

This notice and review process is pursuant to the provisions of RCW 80.01.030 and WAC 480-07-904(2) and (3), and WAC 480-07-905, as amended effective September 22, 2008.
