

- 7 (4) The Commission is authorized by WAC 480-14-230(1)(a) to suspend a motor freight carrier's permit for failure to file and maintain proof of insurance.
- 8 (5) The Commission is authorized by WAC 480-14-230(3)(b) to cancel a motor freight carrier's permit for failure to correct conditions leading to suspension within the time defined in the order of suspension.

ORDER

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- 9 (1) Permit CC-65284, held by Stuart Allen Monsma, d/b/a Stu Monsma, is suspended for a period of 30 days effective April 25, 2014.
- 10 (2) Stuart Allen Monsma, d/b/a Stu Monsma, is directed to **cease** all operations associated with permit CC-65284 until the Commission receives proof of liability and property damage insurance and enters an order lifting the suspension order and authorizing you to resume operations.
- 11 (3) If proof of insurance is not filed with the Commission within 30 days, permit CC-65284 will be cancelled without further notice or order. To reinstate this permit you must submit a new application and acceptable proof of insurance.
- 12 (4) Stuart Allen Monsma, d/b/a Stu Monsma, may contest cancellation of permit CC-65284 by requesting a hearing within 10 days of service of this Order. A hearing request does not affect the suspension status of your permit.
- 13 The Commission has delegated authority to the Secretary, or to the Secretary's delegate, to enter this Order under RCW 80.01.030, WAC 480-07-903(1)(c), and Order 01 in Docket A-090485.

Following hearing, the administrative law judge will enter an initial order. If you wish to seek review of the initial order, you may file a petition for administrative review under RCW 34.05.464, or if the matter is heard in a brief adjudicative proceeding, under RCW 34.05.491.
