Unit 1 – This was an Amtrak passenger train #507. The engineer operating the train was Witness Brooks. Witness Brooks was evaluated by DRE Officer Michl at the scene. Officer Michl did not find any signs of impairment on Witness Brooks.

Unit 2 – 5-10/154, brown eyes. SFD L7, A14, and M10 responded. King County Medical Examiner's Office responded. Investigator Nelson took custody of Unit 2. KCME case #2016-872.

The location of this collision was on a city street in the City of Seattle. This section of roadway was straight and level. S Lander St carried vehicular traffic east and westbound, each with two marked lanes that were separated by a center left-turn lane in the middle of the roadway. Four sets of railroad tracks crossed S Lander St (north/south).

On 04-30-2016 Officers responded to a train vs. pedestrian collision at the 100 block of S Lander St. Upon arrival, Officers found the pedestrian (Unit 2) deceased on the western-most tracks, just south of S Lander St.

I spoke with Witness Perry. In summary, she reported the following: > She was in her vehicle facing eastbound on S Lander St. She was the first vehicle at the train crossing and in the left lane. There was a slow moving freight train on one of the eastern most tracks. The train was going back and forth for several minutes blocking the street before it moved away northbound. As the freight train moved away, a southbound Amtrak passenger train approached in one of the western most tracks. She heard the Amtrak train blow its horn as it approached. As the train went by her, she heard a sound and noticed items flying in the air. She heard the driver in the vehicle to her right yell something about a person being struck. She noted that all the crossing gates were down, flashing lights activated, and bells were sounding at the railroad crossing when she was waiting for the trains to pass. <

I obtained Witness Perry's statement on my in-car video system, bookmarked at 1436-1445 hours.

Officer Jenkins #5850 obtained ICV-recorded statements from Witnesses MacApinlat and Champion, both reported similar accounts to Witness Perry's.

Officer Suarez #7546 obtained ICV-recorded statements from Witnesses Legg and Gallagher.

Sgt. Downing (2R), Sgt. Price (T8), and Lt. Clenna (262) responded to the scene. SPD Media Unit was also advised of this call by Sgt. Downing.

TCIS Detectives Parker and Schmidt responded to the scene to conduct an investigation.
