## AFFIDAVIT CONTAINING CERTIFICATIONS PURSUANT TO WAC 480-123-060 AND WAC 480-123-070

I, Kevin Owen, being of lawful age, state that I am the President of First Step Internet, LLC ("Company"), that I am authorized to execute this Affidavit on behalf of the Company and that the facts set forth in this Affidavit are true to the best of my knowledge, information and belief. On this basis, I hereby certify to the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission ("Commission") for use by the Commission in providing the certification to the Federal Communications Commission and Universal Service Administrative Company required by 47 C.F.R. §54.314, as follows:

(1) That on February 12, 2015, in Docket #UT-141440, the Commission granted the Company's Petition to be an eligible telecommunications carrier ("ETC");

(2) That the Company received \$29,109.84 federal high-cost support in the preceding calendar year (2016) and that all federal high-cost support provided to the Company will be used in the coming calendar year (2018) only for the provision, maintenance and upgrading of the facilities and services for which the support is intended;

(3) That during the 2016 calendar year, the Company was an ETC and therefore was subject to the following requirements applicable to ETCs in Washington state and: a) met substantially the applicable service quality standard found in WAC 480-123-030(1)(h), b) the standard related to the ability to function in emergency situations found in WAC 480-123-030(1)(g), as such standard relates to functionality of wireline carriers in emergency situations; and c) the requirement to publicize the availability of its applicable telephone assistance programs in a manner reasonably designed to reach those likely to qualify for service found in WAC 480-123-030(1)(e).

## REPORTS AS REFERENCED IN WAC 480-123-070 AND WAC 480-123-080

First Step Internet, LLC. (the "Company") hereby submits the following reports in accordance with WAC 480-123-070 and WAC 480-123-080.<sup>1</sup>

Report 1: WAC 480-123-070(l)(a): (Use of Federal High-Cost Funds) As of December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2016, the Company has received \$29,109.84 in Federal high-cost funding from the FCC's Rural Broadband Experiments program ("RBE") The Company has expenses for 2016 of \$28,921.48 directly associated with the RBE program. The expenditure of this funding consisted mostly of routing and network management equipment used to improve the connectivity and monitoring of the services provided within the Study Area Code. The Company has received its Study Area Code number: 476222. The Company has timely filed its required Form 481.

Report 2: WAC 480-123-070(1)(b): (Benefit from investment) The Company has completed the installation of equipment necessary to cover 90% of the required census blocks associated with its Study Area Code. (111 total blocks, 7 blocks in Washington) As of this filing, the 7 blocks in Washington account for a possible 12 customers. During the 2016 calendar year, one customer from the service area requested service but declined the 10/1 service provided under the RBE award. They declined the service due to the \$75/month cost and instead elected a lower speed package of 2/1 for \$35/month. The benefit of the investment to the potential consumers is that customers can now have access to high-speed broadband Internet should they desire and request the service. In the case of the above consumer, they did not feel they needed to have the 10/1 broadband package available under the RBE award. The benefits to consumers are a direct result of the investments made in 2016 pursuant to WAC 480-123-070(1)(a). In 2017, the anticipated spending will continue to directly benefit those customers in the high-cost service area as they will be able to receive service in areas that were previously un-served by qualifying broadband.

Through the expenditure of these anticipated RBE funds, the Company will be able, throughout the service area for which the Company has ETC designation, to:

- provide services at a level that the Company believes meets the intent set forth in 47 U.S.C. §254 of providing quality telecommunications services to customers;
- make substantial investments over the next several years to allow it to provide quality telecommunications services;
- expand its network over the next several years so that it will be capable of providing access to broadband services;
- offer service that is comparable to services offered in urban areas at rates that will be comparable to the rates for such services in urban areas.


Report 3: WAC 480-123-070(2): (Local Service Outage). The Company reports no service outages as described in WAC 280-123-070(2) during the 2016 calendar year.

Report 4: WAC 480-123-070(3): (Failure to Provide Service). The Company reports no requests for service that were unfulfilled during the 2016 calendar year.

Report 5: WAC 480-123-070(4): (Complaints per 1,000 connections) The Company reports no service complaints during the 2016 calendar year made to the Federal Communications Commission or the consumer protection division of the office of the attorney general of Washington.

Report 6: WAC 480-123-080(1-3): The Company reports the planned investment for 2018 will be approximately \$30,000 for the approved ETC service areas. This investment will be made to support the services in both the Washington and Idaho service areas. This investment is combined to align with the single Study Area Code (SAC 476222) that was provided by the USAC. The funding will be expended to maintain and improve the fixed wireless LTE access points that will provide the required service in the area. Additionally, the funding will be used to expand and increase the capacity of the network carrying the broadband Internet traffic. These investments and expenses will directly benefit the consumers within the Study Area, as broadband and voice services will be made available to those customers that currently do not have access to service.

Coverage area maps: The included maps show the entire coverage area of First Step Internet as well as the required census blocks within the State of Washington. Due to the nature of the propagation mapping software, the locations of the fixed distribution antennas, it is necessary to include the coverage for both Idaho and for Washington.
