**Re: Advice No. 2019-11
PSE’s Electric Tariff Filing - Filed Electronically**

Dear Mr. Johnson:

Puget Sound Energy (“PSE”) hereby submits proposed revisions to its electric Schedule 95, Power Cost Adjustment Clause. This filing, pursuant to RCW 80.28.060 and Chapter 480-80 WAC, proposes revisions to the following electric tariff sheets.

WN U-60, Tariff G - (Electric Tariff):

- 12th Revision of Sheet No. 95-D – Power Cost Adjustment Clause (Continued)

The purpose of this filing is to update rates in Schedule 95 to reflect the loss of load, and the resulting increase in unit costs that will occur once Microsoft takes service under the special contract.¹ PSE anticipates that Microsoft will commence service on the Microsoft Special Contract (“Special Contract”) on April 1, 2019. Nearly 100 electric Schedule 40 meters will be served under the Special Contract. This filing proposes changes to PSE’s electric Schedule 95 Power Cost Adjustment Clause to, 1) reallocate fixed power costs to non-decoupled customers (Schedules 5, 46, 49 and 50-59), and 2) reallocate variable power costs to all sales schedules.

Overall, this proposal represents a \$3.3 million increase in revenue or an average 0.12 percent increase for all schedules, except transportation customers under Schedules 448, 449, 458 and 459.

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The typical residential customer using 900 kWh per month would experience an increase to their monthly bill of \$0.13.

The tariff sheets described herein reflect an issue date of March 29, 2019, and an effective date of May 1, 2019. As required by WAC 480-100-193, PSE will post the proposed tariff sheets on the PSE web site coincident with the date of this transmittal letter. Notice to the public under the provisions of WAC 480-100-194 will be provided, as required, within 30 days of the requested May 1, 2019, effective date.
