Seattle man charged with ex-girlfriend's murder now faces his third strike and a potential life sentence

King County prosecutors have rush-filed a second-degree murder charge against Lester P. Thompson Jr., a 37-year-old Seattle man with a long history of domestic violence who now faces a potential sentence of life in prison, accused of strangling to death the mother of two of his children just seven months after he was released from prison for assaulting her in 2013, court records show.

Destinie Gates-Jackson, 36, of Seattle, was found dead in the back seat of her Acura sedan early on April 22 when Kent police stopped the vehicle, which had been involved in a slow-speed collision with a train near South 212th Street and 77th Avenue South, according to police and prosecutors. The driver, later identified as Thompson, charged at an officer, who used a Taser on Thompson to take him into custody, the charges say.

Arrested on a state Department of Corrections warrant for violating conditions of his community supervision and booked into the SCORE Jail in Des Moines, Thompson was transferred Tuesday to the Maleng Regional Justice Center in Kent on investigation of homicide, according to Kent police and jail records. On Tuesday afternoon, Superior Court Judge Catherine Schaffer signed a warrant ordering Thompson to be held without bail, court records show.

If convicted of second-degree murder domestic violence in Gates-Jackson's death, Thompson faces his third strike under the state's persistent offender law and would be sentenced to life in prison without the possibility of release, charging documents say.

King County Senior Deputy Prosecutor Adrienne McCoy also alleged in the charges that Thompson's history of domestic violence against multiple victims is an aggravating factor in the case against him.

The most recent charges detail Thompson's prior strike offenses:

In 2007, Thompson kicked down the door of his then-girlfriend's house and chased her with a knife. When their 4-year-old son cried, Thompson swung the knife, slashing the boy's hand and wrist. He was later convicted of second-degree assault domestic violence, third-degree assault of a child, and felony harassment. His second-degree assault conviction counted as his first strike.

Six years later, in 2013, Thompson beat Gates-Jackson — then known as Destinie Gates — strangled her with her purse strap, dragged her from a moving car and forced her into the trunk of the vehicle. Court records show Thompson pleaded guilty to second-degree assault domestic violence, first-degree theft, intimidating a witness and unlawful imprisonment and was sentenced to eight years in prison. His second-degree assault conviction counted as his second strike. He was released from prison in September.

Kent police detectives also interviewed a woman who married Thompson in 2014 while he was behind bars, charging papers say. During a recent argument, she said Thompson shoved her, broke her phone when she tried to call 911, and forced her to the ground in a chokehold. He also broke the windows in her home, the charges say.

"The court must make certain his murder of Ms. Gates-Jackson is his final act of brutality in his rampage of domestic violence against the mothers of his children, his own young son, and his current partner," McCoy wrote of Thompson in charging papers.

According to the charges:

After Thompson was arrested last week, a Kent police officer at the scene looked into the Acura and saw a woman lying face down along the back seat. She was not responsive when officers pulled her from the vehicle and they noticed she had significant bruising and swelling to her eyes, face and mouth, as well as small horizontal cuts on her neck. Attempts to revive her failed, and she was pronounced dead at the scene.

The woman was identified as Gates-Jackson, and the Acura was registered to her. Officers also learned a no-contact order was in place, barring Thompson from communicating or coming within 1,000 feet of her, the charges say.

The King County Medical Examiner's Office determined Gates-Jackson had been strangled to death.

Detectives interviewed witnesses and obtained cellphone data and video-surveillance footage to piece together the final hours of Gates-Jackson's life and are still looking for footage to show her movements between 1:08 a.m. and the time of the train crash, 2:26 a.m. on April 22.

The investigation showed Gates-Jackson spent the evening of April 21 with her boyfriend, then went to meet Thompson around 9:30 p.m. The boyfriend last contacted her at 10:45 p.m. and made several unsuccessful attempts to reach her through the night.

Gates-Jackson and Thompson stopped for gas around 10:45 p.m. at a gas station in Maple Valley, then traveled to an area near the landfill, where Thompson was supposed to meet someone. He never showed for that meeting but recorded a 5-minute argument with Gates-Jackson on his cellphone before turning the phone off, the charges say.

At 1:07 a.m., Thompson's phone was turned back on and showed he was in the area of Renton Avenue South and South Henderson Street in Seattle, which is near his residence, and he was the only one spotted on video-surveillance footage from the area.

Thompson's phone records show he then traveled to Kent, where he was involved in the collision with the train and was subsequently arrested about a mile away, the charges say.

At the time of this call, I was wearing my standard issue Police jumpsuit which has visible Kent Police patches on both shoulders. On top of my jumpsuit, I was wearing a standard issue external vest which has a Police Velcro patch on the back as well as multiple items on the vest that clearly state I am a Police Officer. I have my Police badge, multiple magazines for my standard issue sidearm, handcuffs, flashlight, and my radio. The items of clothing I was wearing make it clear that I am a Police Officer.

I was operating a fully marked Police patrol vehicle with fully marked "KENT POLICE" marking on the driver and passenger side. The vehicle I was operating (3850) was a Chevy Tahoe. The vehicle was equipped with a working overhead emergency blue and red LED light bar, emergency blue and red LED lights mounted in the front grill and on the front push bars, side marker emergency blue and red LED lights, flashing wig-wag headlights, and a working siren. The siren was checked for operability prior to this incident.

On <u>April 22, 2020</u>, at approximately 0226 hours, Officers Hartley, Crawford, R. Gonzalez and I were dispatched to an unknown if injury collision involving a train and vehicle at S 212th St and 77 Ave S, in the City of Kent, County of King, State of Washington.

Dispatch advised the reporting party was the Train Conductor 1-ELE-PD Reports.

1-ELE-D said a dark colored early 2000 Acura TL ran the signal and collided with the train. 1-ELE- further advised a male was up and out of the vehicle.

At 0229 hours 1-ELE-... advised dispatch the male was back inside of the vehicle with the lights on. At 0232 1-ELE-... updated dispatch that the Acura drove west on S 212TH away from the scene. The driver was described as a black male, approximately thirty years old, wearing a dark colored shirt and jeans. 1-ELE-... could not tell if anyone else was in the vehicle.

When dispatch advised responding officers the Acura had fled the scene westbound on S 212th St, I was at the intersection of Riverview Blvd S and S 212th St. I slowly continued driving eastbound on S 212th St until I saw a gray Acura TL (WA/BNF3149) drive past me westbound on S 212th St.

I made a U-turn and caught up to the Acura as we both continued west on S 212th St. By now I could see portions of the front bumper hanging low and disconnected from the rest of the vehicle. The Acura continued to drive west in the most right lane until S 212th starting curving to the right. I observed the Acura Drift into the left lane of westbound traffic as it entered the natural curve of S 212th St just east of 42nd Ave S. The Acura was traveling at approximately 35 MPH and drifted approximately three feet into the left lane on the curve. The Acura continued driving in both lanes for a couple seconds before returning to the right lane.

I followed behind the Acura to the stale red light at the intersection of 42nd Ave S. It appeared the Acura was going to run the red light, but abruptly stopped for the traffic signal. After our light turned green the Acura remained stopped at the intersection for approximately ten seconds. I turned on my emergency lights and remained stopped behind the vehicle. I could see my emergency lights reflecting off the Acura, and other street signs nearby. Within a few seconds I could hear the Acura's engine roar a few times as if the driver was attempting to accelerate at a high rate of speed. At approximately 2:35:16. I notified dispatch I would wait for a second officer before making contact with the vehicle. At approximately 02:35:30 the Acura accelerated very quickly westbound through the intersection now continuing onto Orillia Rd S. At approximately 02:35:49 hours I performed a Pursuit Intervention Technique (P.I.T) on the Acura approximately a few hundred yards west of 42nd Ave S. The Acura was driving west in the right lane, so I performed the P.I.T by using the front passenger side of my push bars to strike the rear driver side bumper of the Acura. The Acura's rear slid to the right, causing the Acura to travel partially into the left lane and come to a stop. I passed the Acura on the right and stopped in front of the Acura.

I could not see the driver and was parked in front of a vehicle that previously tried to elude me. I exited my patrol vehicle and looked into the Acura. I could see a black male driver holding his hands together in front of his chest. I could not see anyone else inside the Acura. I approached the driver door window and attempted to break it with my flashlight. After this failed I noticed the driver door was unlocked and opened the door.

As soon as I opened the door, the driver later identified as ARR Lester Thompson put his hands together as if he was holding a pistol and quickly extended his arms into a shooting position while seated in the driver seat. After realizing Lester was not holding a pistol I started to transition to my Taser.

While continuing to hold his arms out extended and hands together as if he was holding a pistol, Lester stepped out of the Acura and lunged towards me. I was currently standing in the middle of a five lane arterial roadway. I believed Lester was trying to make me believe he was armed with a pistol and with his quick lunges towards me, I believed he was going to assault me.

I deployed my first cartridge, striking Lester in the upper body. Lester stepped back but I did not see any sign of Neuro Muscular Incapacitation. Lester continued to take steps towards me, so I deployed my second cartage, also striking him in the upper body. Lester's abdomen contracted and he fell over in the roadway. Officer Crawford and Gonzalez were able to detain Lester in handcuffs without further incident.

Officer Rainier responded to the collision scene to interview the BNSF employees. Please see his supplemental report for details regarding his interviews with 1-ELE--m and wit 1-ELE--PD Reports.

Lester was frisked and moved out of the roadway. Officer Hartley looked inside the Acura and advised she did not see anyone else. With Lester now sitting on the sidewalk Officer Hong looked inside the Acura and alerted all on scene officers there was a person in the backseat compartment. I went to the rear driver side door and noticed the female later identified as VIC

1-ELE-PD Reports
was lying face down on the rear seats. 1-ELE-PD face was on the seat cushion behind the driver seat and her feet were behind the front passenger seat 1-ELE-PD made no movement and I could see what appeared to be dried blood on the cushion her face was on.

I also noticed that prior to discovering 1-ELE-PDR... both the driver seat and front passenger seat were leaned all the way back covering her body. I attempted to feel 1-ELE-PDR... carotid arterial pulse and believed I felt one. We decided to Move 1-ELE-P... out of the vehicle to conduct further evaluation on her condition. I supported her neck and head as we moved her from the vehicle to the roadway on the right side of the Acura.

Once 1-ELE-P... was lying on her back on the pavement, I noticed there was no rise or fall of her chest. I also saw bruising and swelling to her eyes, cheeks and blood on her lips. I used my AED from vehicle #K3850 and placed the pads in the appropriate locations on 1-ELE-P... body. The AED alerted "no shock advised." Officer Morris and I performed chest compressions of 1-ELE-P... until South Puget Sound Fire Fighters took over. The AED completed an evaluation on 1-ELE-P... approximately every two minutes but always alerted "no shock advised."

While Officer Morris completed chest compressions I noticed 1-ELE-PDR.... jaw appeared to be locked shut and it looked like she was biting the tip of her tongue. I tried to open her lower jaw with no success.

After I was relieved from performing chest compressions I took photos of the Acura and of 1-ELE-PD.... It was around this time I was notified there was a DV No Contact Order between 1-ELE-PD.... and Lester.

DV No-Contact Order 131137361 was personally served on 5/30/2014 and set to expire on 5/30/2024. The order list 1-ELE-P... as the protected person and Lester as the respondent. Lester is restrained from coming within 1000 feet of 1-ELE-P... and any type of communication. Lester was also restrained from Assaulting, threatening, abusing, harassing or following 1-ELE-P... For every restriction and exact verbiage please read DV No-Contact Order 131137361. This order was later confirmed with Seattle Police Department.

At approximately 0313 hours Medics ceased efforts to resuscitate Traffic section were notified and responded to the scene. A crime scene log was initially started by Officer Crawford but then was transferred to me. Officer Crawford transported Lester to the Kent Police Department. Later Officer Crawford advised me Lester was arrested for Order violation. Please see Officer Crawford's supplemental for more information.

Please see all supplemental reports for specific actions done by involved officers and detectives on scene.

The crime scene was turned over to Detective Sergeant Koehler.

Additionally, some of these records identify the home addresses of known gang members and their claimed gang affiliation. Therefore, sensitive information, the non-disclosure of which is essential to effective law enforcement, which may endanger the lives of others, or which may result in retaliation, was redacted from the identified document. (Information redacted includes identifying information of possible suspects, their connection to one another, their location, vehicles to which they have access, gang affiliation; specific intelligence gathered on suspects; crime trends; law enforcement resources; or a photograph that would identify police officers who work in undercover investigations).
