9/19/19 - Per Laura Chartoff, the disclaimer on emails - we don't need to worry about the disclaimers that attorney's or others put on each email they send out. According to Laura, "it is 2/28/19 – per Laura Chartoff, the autopsy exemption would not apply to a suicide note where the victim survived. There is no case law that definitively tells uswhether another exemption applies. Because it could take me a long time to get an answer, and there is no active request 10/08/18 – per Harry Fukano, Responsive Photographs Which Depict Identifiable Person(s) – When the commission obtains photographs as part of a police reportvoluntarily provided by law enforcement, in order for the photograph to be exempt from disclosure under RCW 42.56.240(1), it must be "for the protection of anyperson's right to privacy" (RCW 42.56.050). Absent additional considerations or facts, the Commission should only withhold or redact a 9/27/18 - Documents prior to October 2018 that contain Autopsy Reports/Postmortems (RCW 68.50.105(1) and RCW 42.56.510) information could be marked as code (4c) or (4d) due a 07/31/18 - Per Brett Shearer, AAG, regarding VIN numbers - VIN numbers registered to large companies (rather than an individual). The commission past practices are not to redact VIN 5/21/18 - Per Sally Brown, AAG, regarding Toxicology information that has been provided in a police report. The PRA would not expect the agency to redact that information. 05/23/18 - Per Brett Shearer, AAG, REVISED OPINION regarding Vehicle License plates -Vehicle license plates do not need to be redacted unless they are specifically marked as confidential plates or there is some other unique situation where disclosure would invade a 5/22/18 - Per Brett Shearer, AAG, regarding Vehicle license plates - Vehicle licenses are exempt under 42.56.230(7)(c) and probably under RCW 42.56.050 as well. It's not a blanket exemption for all instances involving license plates, but the PRA exempts situations where vehicle license records provide individually identifiable information. I cannot think of a practical 5/22/18 - Per Brett Shearer, AAG, regarding EIN numbers - The PRA exempts EINs under 42.56.230(4), 42.56.230(5), 42.56.210, and, maybe, 42.56.050. An EIN is taxpayer information and considered private. The IRS and DOL both warn about potential complications if an EIN is 3/6/18 – Per Sally Brown, AAG, regarding Date of Birth disclosure – Because dates of birth are considered personally identifiable information, the commission should err on the side of 11/10/16 - Per Julian Beattie, AAG, regarding Suicide Notes - Suicide notes are exempt under the same law as Coroner Reports, i.e., RCW 68.50.105(1)RCW 42.56.510 (see 4d above). 12/04/2019 - Per Jeff Roberson, AAG, Regarding PII of Requestors - The Court of Appeals has signaled that it is improper to redact a requester's personal information (City of Fife v. Hicks, 186 Wn. App 122, 144, 345 P.3d 1 (2015)). I wouldn't even email the requester. I'd just
