IX. Comments
Event Summary:
On April 30, 2021, at 6:10 a.m., an eastbound BNSF Railway Company freight train struck and fatally injured a trespasser standing on the tracks. According to the police report, the video captured from the lead locomotive showed that the train blew its horn approximately nine to 10 times as it approached the person standing on the railroad ties on north side of the tracks. No attempt was made to move out of the way of the on-coming train. After striking the individual, the train was placed into an emergency braking application and it came to a stop about a quarter mile east of the point of contact. Investigators determined by the video footage that it was an intentional act. The police report also noted that the deceased was in possession of drug paraphernalia. According to the events surrounding this incident, drugs likely played a role in this fatality.
Site Description:
The location of the incident is on BNSF Railway Company's Northwest Division, Scenic Subdivision at railroad milepost 1768.3 at the eastern edge of the city of Monroe. The incident occurred on a tangent section of track with more than 1500 feet of sight distance in both directions. Al Borlin Park is directly southeast and the Skykomish River and the Woods Creek trestle is directly east. During a site visit I found it to be a high trespass/transient area with many trails leading towards Woods Creek and into Al Borlin Park. To the south is residential and to the north are local businesses. At the location of the incident and in the immediate vicinity I discovered multiple BNSF No Trespassing signs posted as well as the addition of ecology blocks to keep trespassers off of railroad property. **Inspector Perompandations:**

NARRATIVE

I am Detective Trevor J. Larson with the Monroe Police Department.

On 4/30/2021 at approximately 0629 hours, I was on uniformed patrol in an unmarked patrol vehicle equipped with 360 degree emergency lights and siren. I am currently assigned to the Street Crimes Detective Unit and am tasked with proactively investigating street level crimes associated with narcotics, fraud, organized retail theft and possession or trafficking of stolen property within the city of Monroe, WA.

Detective Sgt. Hatch advised me of a train versus pedestrian collision that occurred within the city limits of Monroe. I called the on duty patrol sergeant at the time, Sgt. Carswell, to get additional details of the collision. Sgt. Carswell advised me to respond to the Highway Auto located at 20014 SR 2 and to go to the back of the building near the railroad tracks. Sgt. Carswell told me a male had been struck by an eastbound train and was deceased.

I arrived on scene and walked around to the back side of Highway Auto. I saw the train, identified as BNSF 6807 East, was stopped and I could see the engine portion was stopped just pasted the bridge going over Woods Creek Rd. I could see a male under a white blanket lying on the north side of the tracks. The male's head was pointing north, and his feet were pointing south. I could see a cone of debris around the male that patrol marked with disposable gloves.

I noticed a black folding knife approximately 15 feet north of the body. The was a black Reebok shoe approximately 20 feet east of the body. I could see the male was missing a shoe on his right foot and the shoe on his left foot matched the other Reebok shoe. I saw an Orca card a couple foot west of the body and a Washington State Quest card near the tracks approximately 20 feet east of the body. There was a black Timex watch approximately 12 feet east of the body and I noticed the watch band was broken at the watch face.

I could see the deceased male was wearing a brown Carhartt style jacket. I lifted the white sheet and looked at the male's face. I recognized the male to be Shannon O. Honeycutt from multiple prior contacts. Shannon was released from the prison in Monroe approximately 3 years ago and remained in Monroe. I had contacted Shannon for prior DV related offenses and disturbances around town. From those contacts, Shannon has told me he used to live in Kentucky before being transferred out to the Monroe Prison to serve his sentence.

I could see a cut on the top back portion of Shannon's head that was approximately an inch and a half long. I noticed blood coming from Shannon's nose and vomit on the ground where his head lay. Shannon's left leg was bent forward at a near 90 degree angle and appeared broken just above the knee.

I contacted the train's conductor, James McAuliffe, and asked him what he saw. James told me that Shannon was crossing the tracks from the south to the north. Shannon then stopped on the north side of the track, approximately 1 foot from the track itself, and held up what appeared to be a cell phone. James speculated that Shannon stopped to take a selfie as the train rolled by. James told me the train impacted Shannon at approximately 38 mph on the front left corner of the train plow. James described it as a glancing hit from the train. James stated it appeared like Shannon was about to move out of the way but did not move in enough time.

I asked James if he knew if the emergency brake dumped any sand when he hit the emergency brakes. James told me he could not find a pile of sand due to the train running at 38 mph. I began looking at the rails and noticed some spots of crushed sand residue on the rails near where Shannon's body was located. I could not find the area where the sand was originally dumped. James told me Shannon was standing approximately 30 feet west of where his body was lying.

I walked the track and noticed a couple of dirty shoe patterns on a railroad tie near where James stated Shannon was standing. I looked at the tread on Shannon's shoes and the wavy tread pattern appeared to match the shoe print on the railroad tie. I marked the shoe prints with an evidence placard #1. I began marking the other spots of debris with yellow evidence placards. I marked the Quest card with Placard #2, the watch with Placard #3, the body with Placard #4, the knife with Placard #5 and the shoe with Placard #6. Det. Henderson had arrived and was taking digital images of the scene starting at the front of the train and working west.

BNSF Claims Inspector Greg Beam arrived on scene. I asked Greg if he could obtain video from the train for me to view. Greg told me he could, but it would take approximately one week before it would be ready. I gave Greg my business card with the case number. Greg provided me with his phone number, (425)330-1852, to contact him next week to review the trains camera system.

I requested dispatch have the Snohomish County Medical Examiner's Office call my work cell phone. I was contacted by SCME Investigator Max Cantu. I advised Investigator Cantu of the incident and Investigator Cantu stated he would be in route within the hour.

Officer Springer arrived at the scene. Officer Springer works with the Homeless Outreach Team and so I asked him to confirm that the deceased male is Shannon. I lifted the sheet for Officer Springer and he told me the deceased male is Shannon Honeycutt.

I was provided with written statements from James and the train's engineer, Jason Jewett, by the responding patrol officers. By the time Det. Henderson got to the shoe prints to take digital images, it had begun raining and the tie got wet from the rain. The shoe prints were no longing visible on the tie. Det. Henderson took digital images of Placard #1 to show where the shoe prints were located.

Once Det. Henderson completed taking digital images, I began collecting the debris that was marked by the placards to include the watch, Quest card, Orca card, black knife and Reebok shoe. BNSF advised they were moving the train to open the lines and unblock the intersections in Monroe. SCME Investigator Cantu arrived on scene at approximately 0800 hours. Investigator Cantu began taking digital images of the scene and the body. Investigator Cantu began searching the pockets of Shannon's clothing. Investigator Cantu located a black leather wallet inside a jacket pocket. Inside the wallet was a social security card, Washington State ID card and credit card belonging to Gabriel Hocog. Investigator Cantu gave me the wallet since it did not appear to belong to Shannon.

Investigator Cantu also located a glass bulb style pipe, wrapped in tissue paper, inside Shannon's jacket pocket. Based on my training and experience, I recognized the glass pipe to be the type commonly used to smoke methamphetamine. Investigator Cantu found a plastic Ziploc style bag which contained a torn up social security card and birth certificate belonging to Shannon Honeycutt.

I assisted Investigator Cantu with placing Shannon's body into a body bag and loading the bag onto a gurney. Investigator Cantu provided me with a ME #210430-252. I provided Investigator Cantu with the Monroe PD case number and Shannon's information.

I returned to the Monroe PD and booked the collected items from the scene into temporary evidence. I checked Gabriel Hocog's information on my Mobile Data Computer. The return shows that Gabriel is deceased, but I could not locate a death investigation case regarding when Gabriel died. Gabriel's wallet was booked into temporary evidence as well.

I recommend this case remains open until I can view video from BNSF involving the collision.

On 04-30-2021 I was working day time patrol. At the listed time, Monroe units were advised of a train versus pedestrian collision near the intersection of Butler Rd and W Main St. The call was being made by BNSF employees and they reported their location as approx. 1/4 mile east of the listed intersection.

I responded to the area and could see the train was at a stop and blocking all lanes of E Main St. I looked east along the tracks and could see a BNSF employee on the the north side of the tracks in the approx. 19900 block. I could see the male was hovering over another figure who was laying on the ground behind Highway Auto. I arrived moments after Ofc. N Michel as she was checking for signs of life. She advised there was a faint pulse from the subject. I could see the subject was laying partially on his side and could tell there was trauma to the subjects legs, left arm, and head area. We requested aid to our location and did not move the subject as the bodily trauma looked severe.

I spoke with the other male on scene who advised he was the conductor and he and the engineer were the only ones on the train. He stated both were witnesses to the collision but the engineer had stayed with the front of the train per policy. He told me that the train was moving at approx. 38 MPH when they both saw the subject standing near the left side of the tracks. The subject appeared to have his arms raised and was possibly looking up at the sky. It was unknown what exactly he was doing. He never made an attempt to avoid the collision and never seemed to notice the train. After striking the subject, the train was stopped coming to a stop approx. 1/4 mile from the contact point.

As Ofc. Walker arrived, Ofc. Michel advised the subjects pulse had faded and could not be found. I began making notifications and requested a detective call out. I requested Ofc. Walker begin photogrphing the scene including the subject and multiple items of debris (knife, shoe, cards, a watch etc). I also requested Ofc. Michel walk to the front of the train and contact the engineer as well as take photographs of the point of contact on the train. While making calls, aid arrived and declared the subject deceased.

I stayed on scene until the arrival of detectives. I was ultimately cleared from the scene by Det. Larson and resumed patrol duties.

I am Officer N. Michel of the Monroe Police Department.

On 4/30/21, I noted a new call appear on my MDC. I clicked on the call and observed that it stated train vs. ped. Immediately following, I was dispatched to a priority collision at approximately 0615 hours.

I arrived at 0618 hours along with Sgt. Carswell. The location was approximately .5 miles east of Main Street. I was able to see a BNSF employee beside a prone figure just north of the tracks. I arrived beside the subject and felt for a pulse on his wrist. There was still a pulse but there was obviously severe trauma to the males entire body. The male was already in a "recovery" position with fluids coming out of his mouth. Although there was a pulse, there was no response from the male.

I estimated the male had a weak pulse for approximately 1-2 minutes. Aid personnel arrived and advised the male was code black.

I took photographs of the front of the engine and obtained a statement from one of the BNSF conductors on board. The conductor advised me that the impact had been on the front left side of the engine, by the "cow catcher".

My name is Paul Henderson and I am a Commissioned Police Detective for the City of Monroe.

April 30, 2021

At approximately 6:28 am, I was called by Sergeant Carswell regarding a train versus pedestrian collision resulting in a fatality. The pedestrian had yet to be identified but appeared to be a transient. The train had been traveling eastbound with the collision occurring just east of East Main Street. The train was currently stopped with the front engines a few hundred yards past the approximate point of impact and the trailing cars being long enough to block South Kelsey Street. I advised Sergeant Carswell to have the train remain in place until I was able to document everything with photographs. I was also called by Detective Sergeant Hatch, who explained that Detective Larson would be taking lead on the investigation.

After arriving, I spoke with Sergeant Carswell and Detective Larson, whom were both at the scene. Detective Larson pointed out a couple of shoe prints on the railroad ties of which the tread pattern appeared to match that of the shoes being worn by the victim. There was a trail of personal belongings in a nearly straight line from this location, heading northwest, to include a Quest EBT card, watch, Orca transit card, decedent, and shoe. The matching shoe was still being worn by the decedent. Placards were placed next to these items to assist with documenting their position in relation to the train and surrounding area. Detective Larson also advised that he spoke to the train conductor who noted the decedent was standing directly next to the tracks with his back to the train and hands in the air; possibly holding a cell phone as if he were taking a "selfie". No cell phone or remains of a cell phone were located.

I took photographs of the scene, beginning at the front of the train and working west to the estimated point of impact. Heavy rain had washed away the shoe tread patterns on the railroad ties. I photographed the area where the patterns were previously observed and where a placard had been placed to record the location. While waiting for the medical examiner to arrive, I noted media appeared to be filming from East Main Street. I also overheard Officer Springer identify the decedent as Shannon Oliver Honeycutt. Officer Springer is the Community Outreach Officer who works with the local transient population on a daily basis. He recognized the decedent from previous contacts through the duties of his specialized position.

After the medical examiner arrived, I took photographs of the decedent to document injuries sustained during impact with the train. I also took pictures of tattoos and other identifying features. After this was complete, I returned to the police department where the pictures were booked into evidence.

On 6/17/2021, I met with BNSF Claims Investigator Greg Beam to review the in-train surveillance video, reference follow up incident #2021-8252. The video was approximately 3 minutes long. I began watching the video as the train traveled through the intersections of Lewis St and East Main St. At both intersections, the train blew its horn on approach and as it went through the intersections.

As the train approached the incident location, I could see Shannon standing on the north side of the railroad tracks and facing north. Shannon had his left hand up in the air and was looking up towards the sky. I could see Shannon's left hand was open and facing up. I could see that Shannon's left hand was empty. The train blew its horn approximately 9 to 10 times as it approached Shannon stand on the north side of the tracks. Shannon was standing on the wood railroad ties just north of the left track. Shannon then disappears from view, obstructed by the nose of the train, as the train passes where he was standing. The last thing I could see of Shannon was the raised palm of his left hand.

As the train approached Shannon, I did not see him move or attempt to move out of the way of the train as it was blowing its air horns repeatedly. Once the train passed Shannon's location, I could hear the brakes and wheels begin to squeal as the train came to a stop.

I replayed the video several times to observe Shannon's actions on the railroad tracks. I did not see anyone else within the vicinity of the railroad tracks where Shannon was standing.

Based on the video and Shannon's lack of moving from the tracks, it appears Shannon's actions to be intentional to remain on the tracks as the train passed.

- (4) License applications under RCW <u>9.41.070</u>; copies of license applications or information on the applications may be released to law enforcement or corrections agencies; and
- (5) Information revealing the identity of child victims of sexual assault who are under age eighteen. Identifying information means the child victim's name, address, location, photograph, and in cases in which the child victim is a relative or stepchild of the alleged perpetrator, identification of the relationship between the child and the alleged perpetrator.

RCW 42.56.240

Investigative, law enforcement, and crime victims. (Effective July 1, 2006.)

The following investigative, law enforcement, and crime victim information is exempt from public inspection and copying under this chapter:

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- (2) Information revealing the identity of persons who are witnesses to or victims of crime or who file complaints with investigative, law enforcement, or penology agencies, other than the commission, if disclosure would endanger any person's life, physical safety, or property. If at the time a complaint is filed the complainant, victim, or witness indicates a desire for disclosure or nondisclosure, such desire shall govern. However, all complaints filed with the commission about any elected official or candidate for public office must be made in writing and signed by the complainant under oath;
- (3) Any records of investigative reports prepared by any state, county, municipal, or other law enforcement agency pertaining to sex offenses contained in chapter <u>9A.44</u> RCW or sexually violent offenses as defined in RCW <u>71.09.020</u>, which have been transferred to the Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs for permanent electronic retention and retrieval pursuant to RCW <u>40.14.070(2)(b)</u>;
- (4) License applications under RCW <u>9.41.070</u>; copies of license applications or information on the applications may be released to law enforcement or corrections agencies; and
- (5) Information revealing the identity of child victims of sexual assault who are under age eighteen. Identifying information means the child victim's name, address, location, photograph, and in cases in which the child victim is a relative or stepchild of the alleged perpetrator, identification of the relationship between the child and the alleged perpetrator.
