14 COMES NOW INLAND TELEPHONE COMPANY (*d/b/a* Inland Networks)(the
15 "Company") and, pursuant to Chapter 480-123 of the Washington Administrative Code ("WAC"),
16 including, but not limited to, WAC 480-123-110, hereby petitions the Washington Utilities and
17 Transportation Commission (the "Commission") to receive support from the Universal Service
18 Communications Program (the "Program") for the Program year 2022.

20 **I. Demonstration of Eligibility under WAC 480-123-100**

- 21 1. WAC 480-123-100(1)(a): The Company is a local exchange company as defined in WAC
22 480-120-021 that serves fewer than forty thousand access lines within the state.
23 2. WAC 480-123-100(1)(b): The Company is an incumbent local exchange carrier as defined
24 in 47 U.S.C. Sec. 251(h) or has been designated as an incumbent local exchange carrier by

1 the Federal Communications Commission.

2 3. WAC 480-123-100(1)(c): The Company offers basic residential and business exchange
3 telecommunications services as set forth in WAC 480-120-021 and RCW 80.36.630.

4 4. WAC 480-123-100(1)(d): The Company has established a plan, as described in WAC 480-
5 123-110, to provide, maintain or enhance broadband service (See II.4, below).

6 5. WAC 480-123-100(1)(e): The Company has been designated by the Commission as an
7 eligible telecommunications carrier ("ETC") for purposes of receiving federal universal
8 services support pursuant to 47 C.F.R. Part 54 Subpart D - Universal Service Support for
9 High Cost Areas with respect to the service areas for which the Company is seeking
10 Program support.

12 **II. Demonstration of Eligibility under WAC 480-123-110**

13 1. WAC 480-123-110(1)(a): The name of the legal entity that provides communications
14 services and is seeking Program support is as follows: Inland Telephone Company

15 2. WAC 480-123-110(1)(b): A corporate organization chart showing the relationship between
16 the Company and affiliates as defined in RCW 80.16.010 is attached hereto as Exhibit 1. ¹

17 A detailed description of any transactions between the Company and the affiliates named in
18 Exhibit 1 recorded in the Company's operating accounts is attached hereto as Exhibit 2. ²

19 3. WAC 480-123-110(1)(c): Service area maps for the Company can be found at Sheet Nos.
20 501, 502, 503, and 504 of the Company's Tariff WN U-7.


- 1 4. WAC 480-123-110(1)(d): The Company's broadband plan to provide, maintain, or enhance
2 broadband services in its service area is attached hereto as Exhibit 3.
- 3 5. WAC 480-123-110(1)(f): A sworn statement by a Company officer certifying that the
4 Company complies with state and federal accounting, cost allocation, and cost adjustment
5 rules pertaining to incumbent local exchange carriers is attached as Exhibit 4.
- 6 6. WAC 480-123-110(1)(g): The number of residential local exchange access lines served by
7 the Company as of December 31, 2020, was 1,405. The number of residential local
8 exchange access lines served by the Company as of December 31, 2019, was 1,619. The
9 number of business local exchange access lines served by the Company as of December 31,
10 2020, was 294. The number of business local exchange access lines served by the Company
11 as of December 31, 2019, was 439. The number of broadband connections served by the
12 Company in its regulated service areas as of December 31, 2020, was 2,252; approximately
13 1,669 connections capable of receiving speeds equal to or greater than 25/3. The number of
14 broadband connections served by the Company in its regulated service areas as of December
15 31, 2019, was 1,962. The unbundled monthly recurring rate charged by the Company for
16 residential local exchange access service on December 31, 2020, was: Dewatto exchange -
17 \$22.00; Prescott exchange - \$18.00; Roslyn exchange - \$18.00; and, Uniontown exchange -
18 \$18.00. The unbundled monthly recurring rate charged by the Company for residential local
19 exchange access service on December 31, 2019, was: Dewatto exchange - \$22.00; Prescott
20 exchange - \$18.00; Roslyn exchange - \$18.00; and, Uniontown exchange - \$18.00. The
21 unbundled monthly rate charged by the Company for single line business local exchange
22 access service on December 31, 2020, was: Dewatto exchange - \$27.00; Prescott exchange -
23 \$26.50; Roslyn exchange - \$24.00; and, Uniontown exchange - \$25.00. The

1 unbundled monthly rate charged by the Company for single line business local exchange
2 access service on December 31, 2019, was: Dewatto exchange - \$27.00; Prescott exchange -
3 \$26.50; Roslyn exchange - \$24.00; and, Uniontown exchange - \$25.00. The unbundled
4 monthly rates charged for broadband services as of December 31, 2020, and as of December
5 31, 2019, are set out in the attached Exhibit 5.

- 6 7. WAC 480-123-110(1)(h): The requested statements are attached as Exhibit 6.
- 7 8. WAC 480-123-110(1)(h)(i): A sworn statement by a Company officer certifying that the
8 Company is in compliance with the Federal Communications Commission's obligation for
9 deployment of broadband at speeds specified by the Federal Communications Commission
10 applicable to the Company and that the Company meets one of the eligibility criteria set out
11 in WAC 480-123-110(1)(j)(ii), (iii) or (iv) is attached at Exhibit 7.
- 12 9. All exhibits attached hereto are incorporated into this Petition as though fully set forth.



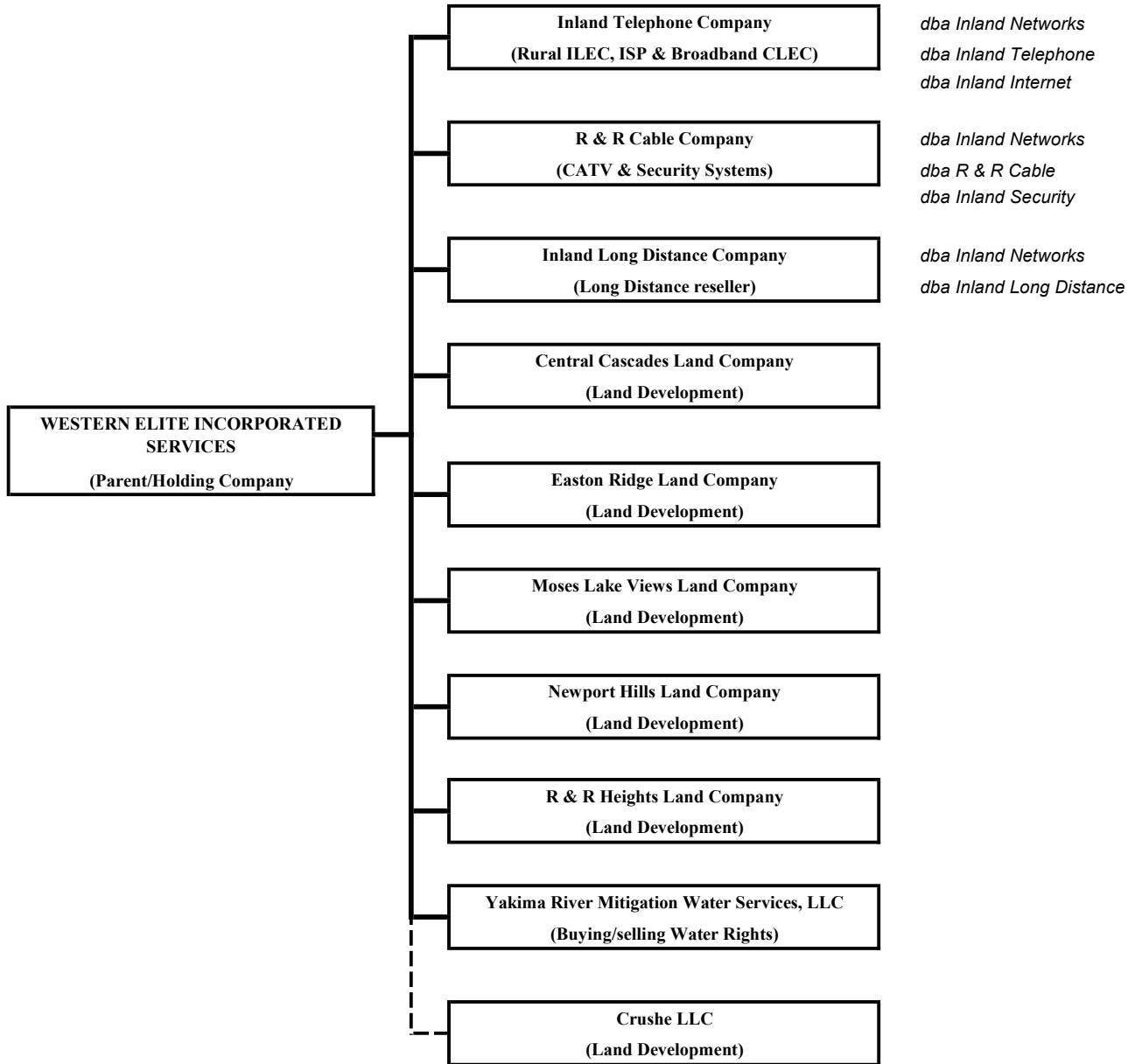

Shareholders – There are shareholders holding five percent or more of the stock, directly or indirectly, of the Company who are also employees of the Company and receives from the Company employment compensation together with employment associated benefits in accordance with the benefits plan that governs all employees.

Related Party Transactions:

R & R Cable Company (“R & R”) –

- R & R paid Inland Telephone Company (“ITC”) for contracted services for managing R & R’s Internet service via cable modem outside of the ITC service area.
- ITC paid R & R for wholesale cable television service provisioned on ITC’s fiber-to-the-premise network.

BROADBAND PLAN

As they are known to the Company at the date of this Report, the following projects exist or are planned by Inland Telephone Company in order to further its broadband footprint. The “Current Projects” are those that the Company is presently working on completing; many have already been mentioned in previous filings (i.e. ETC Filing and SUSF Compliance).

Current Projects:

Roslyn Exchange – In the 2020 filing, it was explained that there was an estimated 3.5 mile main fiber transmission line build required for the Company to have the ability of providing fiber service to an estimated 100+ homes/lots. As of the date of this report, this main fiber transmission line has been completed. The Company has placed and spliced a VDSL cabinet at the end of this fiber transmission line; transitioning the customers from the current DSL cabinet located by the Kittitas County Fire District 7 station on Salmon La Sac road still needs to be accomplished. The Company experimented in its Uniontown exchange with the VDSL and found that VDSL can be provisioned at 10 Mbps upstream and 50 Mbps downstream at approximately a mile. Although 10/50 is a somewhat adequate speed, the Company continues to have plans for fiber-to-the-premise (“FTTP”) in and around the area known as Anna Belle; however, it is not cost effective since the existing premise drops were direct buried (no conduit) and there is now infrastructure to avoid and boring would be difficult and costly in this rocky, mountainous area. There is no estimated cost to complete the transition from DSL to VDSL as this will be labor only and the difficulty in the differing cabinet locations has not been assessed however, the cumulative balance of the workorder as of April 30, 2021, was \$28,739.

Uniontown Exchange – The construction of FTTP in the Uniontown exchange started in November 2019; starting with the Town of Colton. Although COVID slowed construction, the construction was fully completed in the Town of Colton by December 31, 2020. As of the date of this report, 81 customers have been converted to FTTP service in the Town of Colton. The Company is currently constructing FTTP in the Town of Uniontown and, although not fully completed, the Company has converted 26 customers to FTTP service as of the date of this report. In a previous report filed under Docket No. 200677, it was reported that 90 customers were connected as of May 31, 2021, in the Town of Colton. This was in error as I was not aware that customers were already being connected in the Town of Uniontown and the internal report that was used was for the entire Uniontown exchange. As of the date of this report, the Company has capitalized \$996,702 for this FTTP project which includes the cost of the contractor, construction materials (fiber cable, conduit, fiber drop cable, and splitter cabinet), Adtran fiber transmission equipment, central office fiber termination equipment, optical network terminals, and Company personnel time. As of April 30, 2021, the Company had \$91,400 in open workorders for this continuing FTTP project. The Company must still address the more rural customers (approximately 90) that are currently provided service by eleven (11) VDSL cabinets currently running in DSL mode. The Company is already upgrading the central office equipment

to optimize these cabinets and run them as VDSL until FTTP can be installed. The Company did have some foresight when it built this portion of the network as it was built in a fiber ring configuration and we are confident that FTTP can be achieved in these areas using Company personnel at an estimated cost of approximately \$200,000. The Company does not have a timeframe for completion.

Planned Projects:

Prescott Exchange – The Company plans on first addressing those customers that are currently provided service from the Prescott central office; the greater Town of Prescott. At the time of this report, the Company has already purchased the Adtran TA5000 for the central office; racked and ready to go. The Company will then address the more rural customers (approximately 33) that are currently provided service by seven (7) VDSL cabinets (currently running in DSL mode) that are connected to the central office with fiber cable. The Company is already upgrading the central office equipment to optimize these cabinets and run them as VDSL which should be accomplished in 2021. The Company would be performing the construction and does not foresee the need to borrow funds for this project. The Company does not have a timeframe for completion and has estimated the initial project cost to be approximately \$250,000 however, should the Company decide to commence FTTP, this approximate cost could be upwardly of \$600,000; adequate funds and personnel availability are a factor.

Dewatto Exchange – The Company currently has in place fiber infrastructure connecting ADSL cabinets (6) to the Dewatto central office. At the time of this report, the Company has placed the order for an Adtran TA5000 for the central office in order to commence the upgrade. After running trials in its Uniontown exchange with VDSL from the TA5000, the Company will initially replace the ADSL cabinets with VDSL and add more VDSL cabinets to lessen distances to the subscribers; initially two additional cabinets. The Company believes that in order to achieve FTTP, the Company will need to apply for another RUS loan as it estimates the cost to build to be approximately \$4,000,000. The Company does not have a timeframe for completion and is not planning on applying to the RUS until 2023.




