12	and Transportation Commission (Commission) to issue an order authorizing petitioner to change and revise its depreciation rates for eight accounts most affected by technology and competition utilizing new straight line vintage group remaining life rates for intrastate accounting and rate making purposes effective on or after January 1, 1997. GTE Northwest is not, by this Petition, requesting any changes in the rates charged for its Washington intrastate services.

or retirement accounts in accordance with such rules, regulations and forms of accounts as the Commission may prescribe. The Commission may from time to time ascertain and by order fix the proper and adequate rates of depreciation or retirement of the several classes of property of each public service company. Each public service company shall conform its depreciation or retirement accounts to the rates so prescribed. In fixing the rate of the annual depreciation or retirement charge, the Commission may consider the rate and amount theretofore charged by the Company for depreciation or retirement.

- 4. The form and content of this Petition is a departure from the traditional regulatory submission for depreciation rates. As a result of rapidly changing technology and a competitive environment, detailed analysis of mortality data is no longer a viable basis for setting depreciation rates. Further, the Telecommunications Act of 1996 deregulated the telecommunications industry and eliminated the requirement for the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to regulate depreciation rates. The FCC has made the 1997 depreciation rate filings optional. Accordingly, the historic three-way process, wherein personnel from the FCC, Commission Staff, and company meet to discuss depreciation rates and associated remaining lives of accounts is no longer appropriate.
- 5. GTE Northwest has set out the rationale supporting this Petition in its GTE Depreciation Proposal, marked Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein. Summary Statements A and B of said Proposal set out the remaining lives and changes in annual depreciation expense that GTE Northwest considers reasonable in light of the competitive marketplace that exists in today's telecommunications arena.

WHEREFORE, GTE Northwest requests that the Commission issue an Order authorizing the Petitioner to adopt and utilize the depreciation rates encompassing the new straight line vintage group remaining life rates for intrastate accounting and rate making purposes effective on or after January 1, 1997.
