IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR WASHINGTON WATER CUSTOMERS

Washington Water Service (Washington Water) charges customers for the true costs to provide safe, clean, and reliable water utility service; as such, we have filed an application with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (UTC) to increase revenues needed to continue providing a reliable, high-quality water supply. The filing requests an increase of \$577,273 in annual revenue from 2022 to spread the costs of investments in the water system infrastructure over time. If approved, the new rates would become effective July 14, 2023.

Washington Water's last general rate increase became effective December 1, 2018 and was based on 2017 capital and operating expenses. Since then, the utility has made numerous water system upgrades at a cost of \$6.0 million, such as:

- Treatment for naturally occurring arsenic and well improvements in the Biscay Villa Water System
- New limestone treatment plant to remove lead and copper in the Winddrift Water System
- Electrical and booster pump upgrades to improve fire flow in the Raft Island Water System
- A new well in Peacock Hill that produces 275 gallons of water per minute
- 1,200 feet of 4-inch water main in the Minterbrook Water System to increase reliability and water quality
- 1,100 feet of 4-inch water main in the Evergreen Shore Water System to prevent water loss
- 700 feet of 4-inch water main in the Black Lake Estates Water System to reduce leaks

The filing also reflects cost increases in materials, equipment, depreciation expenses due to the addition of new facilities, a newly proposed conservation program, and increases in personnel costs. However, in the face of rising costs, we continue to work diligently to control expenses wherever possible and help keep water rates affordable.
