S1. DEFINITION OF TERMS

LOCAL ACCESS AND TRANSPORT AREA (LATA)

A geographic area established for the purpose of defining the territory in which telephone companies can provide communications services. It encompasses designated Access Areas which are grouped to serve common social, economic, and other purposes.

LOCAL CALLING AREA

A geographical area in which a customer has access for placing and receiving local calls at a fixed monthly rate or at a lower basic monthly rate plus usage charge for each local call completed.

LOCAL CHANNEL

A channel which connects a station location to its serving central office.

LOCAL MESSAGE

A completed communication between stations located within the same local service area. Reference "Message".

LOCAL SERVICE

Telephone service furnished between customer's stations located within the same exchange area.

LOCAL SERVICE AREA

The area in which telephone service is furnished to customers under a specific schedule of exchange rates and without toll charges. A local service area may include one or more exchange areas.

LONG DISTANCE MESSAGE TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICE

- a. The furnishing of facilities for telecommunication between stations in different local service areas in accordance with the regulations and system of charges specified in this Tariff.
 - (1) Appointment Call An arrangement made in advance with a particular party for the establishment of a person-to-person long distance call to be connected at a specified time.
 - (2) Collect Call A long distance call in which the user stipulates that the called party accept and pay all charges associated with the call.
 - (3) Credit/Calling Card Call A long distance call in which associated charges are billed to a credit/calling card number assigned by a telephone company and issued to either the called or calling party.
 - (4) Person-to-Person Call A long distance call whereby the person originating the call specifies to the long distance operator a particular person to be reached.
 - (5) Station-to-Station Call A long distance call whereby the person originating the call either dials the telephone number desired, or gives the operator the telephone number of the desired station.
 - (6) Third Number Call A long distance call in which associated charges are billed neither to the calling party nor to the called party, but rather to a station not involved in the call.
 - (7) Mechanized Call A long distance call that is computer handled and completed by the caller or defaults to an operator and then is completed by him/her.

LOCAL SERVICE AREA An area within which are located the stations which customers may call at exchange rates, in accordance with the provisions of the exchange tariffs. The local service area may include the whole or a part of an exchange area, or parts of all of two or more exchange areas. LOOP START SIGNALLING A method of signalling the central office that a telephone call is being initiated by electrically bridging both wires of the telephone line. MACHINE-SWITCHING TELEPHONE SERVICE See Dial Telephone Service. MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM A system that is designed to provide statistical data for the purpose of administering work force and trunk requirements. 2.1 **DEFINITION OF TERMS (CONT'D)**

Local Exchange Service

A local exchange service is a serving central office line equipment and all outside plant facilities needed to connect the serving central office with the customer premises. These facilities are Company provided and maintained and provide access to and from the telecommunications network for message toll service and for local calling appropriate to the tariffed use offering selected by the customer.

Local Message

A message not subject to toll charges.

Local Service

Exchange access service furnished between customer's premises located within the same local service area.

Local Service Area

The area within which exchange access service is furnished under specific rates. This area may include one or more exchanges without the application of toll charges.

Measured Service

A local service for which charges may be based upon: frequency, time of day, duration and distance.

Tie Line

A circuit connecting two switching systems for the purpose of connecting one system with another system, without the use of trunk lines, to a Company central office.

Toll Message

A completed call between two exchange access lines located in different local service areas, between two toll stations, or between a toll station and an exchange access line.

Toll Service

Telephone service between exchanges or locations for which a toll rate is charged.

5. EXCHANGE SERVICES

5.1 EXCHANGE AREAS

A. Description

- 1. Residence and business flat rate lines, basic measured lines, message rate lines, party lines, suburban lines, farmer lines, Public Access Lines (PAL), trunk lines, and toll access lines are provided within exchange boundaries. The exchange access line is provided from the Company's central office facilities to the customer's location. The central office serving the customer's location is designated by the Company. Through these exchange access lines, the customer has access to the local calling area of the exchange and/or to long distance calling on the message toll network.
- 2. Local calling refers to calls placed to telephone numbers where message toll charges do not apply.
- 3. The exchange may include service provision inside and outside a Base Rate Area (BRA). The BRA is the area of highest population density within an exchange. The exchange boundary and the BRA boundary may be the same. The BRA is set forth on the tariff map.

5.1.1 LIST OF EXCHANGE AREAS AND LOCAL CALLING AREAS

A. Description

Local calling refers to calls placed to telephone numbers where message toll charges do not apply. This includes calls placed within an exchange as well as between two or more exchanges that are part of the local calling area as specified in B., following.
