PROCEEDINGS: Air Liquide, *et al.* filed their original Formal Complaint Requesting Emergency Adjudicative Proceeding in Docket No. UE-001952 on December 12, 2000. Complainants filed an Amended Complaint on December 18, 2000, and a Second Amended Complaint on December 28, 2000. PSE filed its Petition in Docket No. UE-001959 on December 13, 2000. PSE filed its Answer to the first Amended Complaint on January 2, 2000.

On March 9, 2001, the Parties filed On March 9, 2001, the Parties filed a set of related documents which together compose their Settlement Agreement. The Settlement Agreement would resolve all issues pending in Docket Nos. UE-001952 and UE-001959 (Consolidated), UE-000735, UE-001014, UE-001616, UE-010038, and UE-010046. The Settlement Agreement requires final Commission action in

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bear on the Commission's consideration of the settlement. These witnesses should expect to appear as a panel. WAC 480-09-751.

- c. Prior Witnesses Subject To Recall; Substitute Witnesses: Parties are reminded that all witnesses who previously testified were excused subject to recall. If necessary to ensure a complete and accurate record, such witnesses should be prepared to retake the stand. If a company, Commission Staff, or Public Counsel witness who previously testified is unavailable at the time set for hearing, a substitute witness competent to testify to the subject matter previously testified to by the unavailable witness should be present in the hearing room.
- d. Bench Inquiry: The Bench will direct questions to the witness panel collectively, and may direct questions to individual witnesses on the panel. The Bench may direct questions to any individual witnesses recalled to the stand, or to any substitute witness called to testify.
- e. Inquiry by Counsel: Counsel for Parties may be permitted to direct questions to the witness panel, or to individual witnesses, if the Bench determines such inquiry is required to clarify the record, ensure a full record, or otherwise to ensure that all Parties are afforded their full due process rights.
- f. Related Proceedings; Interested Persons: Persons not parties to Docket Nos. UE-001952 and UE-001959, but who express an interest in the outcome of various related Commission dockets, including Nos. UE-010038, UE-010046, and UE-010010, may request the opportunity to state for the record the nature of their interest or to participate in these proceedings in a fashion appropriate to their interest.
- EXHIBITS: The Bench will mark and consider exhibits at the hearing, and will admit relevant exhibits subject to any objections. The witness panel may sponsor the settlement agreement as a multi-part exhibit and may collectively sponsor other exhibits, if appropriate. Individual witnesses may sponsor exhibits, and the Bench will consider exhibits tendered as "unsponsored by any witness," consistent with practices followed during prior phases of this proceeding.
- Pursuant to discussions with counsel for PSE and counsel for Complainants, the confidential Accord and Satisfaction (i.e., "separate confidential bilateral settlement agreements") referred to in paragraph 14.1 of the Stipulation of Settlement should be tendered to the Bench for in camera review prior to the hearing. If the Bench determines such agreement, or agreements, should be made part of the record, the Parties will be given an opportunity to propose an amendment to the Protective Order
