- NATURE OF PROCEEDINGS: Puget Sound Energy, Inc. (PSE), on November 25, 2008, filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) a petition for an order determining that its newly acquired Mint Farm Energy Center ("Mint Farm") complies with the greenhouse gases emissions performance standards in RCW 80.80, Greenhouse Gases Emissions, and approval of proposed deferred accounting pursuant to RCW 80.80.060(6) and WAC 480-100-435. In the alternative, if the Commission determines that Mint Farm is not eligible for deferral accounting under RCW 80.80.060(6), PSE requests that the Commission issue an accounting order under WAC 480-07-370(b) that authorizes the deferred accounting treatment detailed in its Petition related to the fixed and net variable cost components of the Mint Farm facility that will be incurred prior to entry of a final Commission order in the Company's next rate proceeding. The Commission, at its December 23, 2008, open meeting, set the matter for hearing.
- 2 **CONFERENCE/PRESIDING OFFICERS.** The Commission convened a prehearing conference in this proceeding at Olympia, Washington on February 2, 2009, before Administrative Law Judge Dennis J. Moss, whom the Commission appoints as presiding officer in this proceeding.
- PARTY REPRESENTATIVES: Sheree Strom Carson and Jason Kuzma, Perkins Coie, Bellevue, Washington, represent PSE. Simon ffitch, Assistant Attorney General, Seattle, Washington, represents the Public Counsel Section of the Washington Office of Attorney General (Public Counsel). Robert D. Cedarbaum,

Senior Assistant Attorney General, Olympia, Washington, represents the Commission's regulatory staff (Commission Staff or Staff). Donald T. Trotter, Senior Assistant Attorney General, Olympia, Washington, appeared on Staff's behalf at the prehearing conference. S. Bradley Van Cleve, Davison Van Cleve, Portland, Oregon, represents the Industrial Customers of Northwest Utilities (ICNU).

- 4 **PETITION FOR INTERVENTION.** ICNU petitioned to intervene on the bases that it has a substantial interest in the outcome of this proceeding and its participation will be in the public interest. ICNU's petition was granted orally from the Bench without objection by any party.
- PROTECTIVE ORDER. The Commission will enter a protective order in this docket under RCW 34.05.446, RCW 80.04.095, WAC 480-07-420 and WAC 480-07-423 to protect the confidentiality of proprietary information.
- 6 **DISCOVERY.** Discovery will be conducted pursuant to the Commission's discovery rules, WAC 480-07-400 425.
- PROCEDURAL **SCHEDULE.** The parties agreed on a procedural schedule during the conference. The Commission adopts this procedural schedule as set forth below and in Appendix B to this Order.

- NOTICE OF HEARING. The Commission will hold evidentiary hearings in this matter beginning May 4, 2009, at 9:30 a.m., in the Commission's Hearing Room, Second Floor, Richard Hemstad Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington.
- 9 **DOCUMENT PREPARATION AND FILING REQUIREMENTS.** Parties must file the original plus eight copies of the unredacted versions of all pleadings, motions, briefs, and other prefiled materials. Parties must also file the original and one copy of any redacted version(s). These materials must conform to the format and publication guidelines in WAC 480-07-395 and WAC 480-07-460. The Commission prefers that materials be three-hole punched with *oversized* holes to allow easy handling. The Commission may require a party to refile any document that fails to conform to these standards.
- All filings must be mailed or delivered to the Executive Secretary, Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, P.O. Box 47250, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive, S.W. Olympia, Washington 98504-7250. Both the post office box and street address are required to expedite deliveries by the U.S. Postal Service.

Parties must follow WAC 480-07-140(5) in organizing and identifying electronic files.
