On March 12, 2012, Steven Nava, Jr., d/b/a Mover's for the Baby Boomers, filed Docket TV-120357 requesting permanent household goods authority.

The commission granted the company temporary authority subject to conditions pending a decision on its application for permanent authority. The company has operated under Household Goods Carrier Permit THG-64611, since May 3, 2012.

Under WAC 480-15-330, the commission will grant or deny an application for permanent authority after conducting a complete review of the application filings, supporting statements, reports, or other information necessary to determine fitness, public interest, and current or future public convenience and necessity.

Compliance staff worked with the company providing technical assistance during its temporary operations. Investigator Bruce Grimm completed a Safety Compliance Review, a Household Goods Technical Assistance and Records Review Checklist. Investigator Grimm found the company in general compliance and on September 23, 2013, he recommended the applicant be considered for permanent authority.

The current provisional permit THG-64611 is in order as follows:

- o Records Center has the annual report on file;
- o Financial Services reports the company has paid appropriate regulatory fees;
- o The commission does not have any outstanding penalty or other fines;
- O Consumer Protection does not have a pending consumer complaint;
- o Transportation Safety does not have a pending compliance action; and
- o Company representative attended HHG training on 7/11/12.

I recommend the commission grant TV-120357 without hearing and reissue permit THG-64611 to HG-64611, Steven Nava, Jr. d/b/a Mover's for the Baby Boomers, as unrestricted permanent authority to operate as a household goods carrier in the state of Washington.

DESCRIPTION OF PROCESS BREAKDOWN: Driver qualification file is not complete.

BASIC SPECIFIC RECOMMENDED REMEDIES

Implement Safety Improvement Practices: The following are recommended practices related to Policies and Procedures.

- Develop a policy for the periodic review (at least twice per year) of driver qualification files. The motor carrier should not rely on third-party sources, such as insurance agencies. The procedure should include controls to ensure that documents requiring renewals are in place, to remind drivers of expiration dates on medical certificates, so they can schedule another physical examination in advance, and to prevent falsification of documents related to driver qualification.
- Develop a policy for document retention and recordkeeping, including documents that are to be in the possession
 of the driver as proof of credentials.
- Develop a process to ensure that operations will always have the proper amount of fit drivers. This process would address how to deal with issues such as sick leave, vacation, training, suspension, and termination.
- Develop a written and progressive disciplinary policy focused on taking corrective action to ensure drivers comply
 with regulations and policies. A progressive disciplinary policy could include, among other things, written warnings,
 suspensions, or work restrictions, monetary penalties, and termination. This policy should also specify consequences
 for any carrier official who knowingly and willfully allows Driver Fitness Violations.

REASON FOR INVESTIGATION:

This review was conducted as a comprehensive safety compliance review for a provisional intrastate household goods carrier. The company has an intrastate US DOT number and has operated under the provisional household goods permit since May 3, 2012. See THG64611/Application TV-120357. This carrier is required by WAC 480-15 rules to achieve a satisfactory safety rating after UTC investigation prior to conversion of the provisional authority to a permanent household goods moving permit.

SCOPE OF INVESTIGATION:

The carrier was requested to produce the following information with at least 48 hours notice provided before this focused compliance investigation was conducted:

Financial responsibility

Crash reporting

Driver qualification files

Hours of service records

Inspection, repair and maintenance records

A comprehensive compliance review was conducted because of the above requirements and UTC policy covering this type of motor carrier operation. A recognized FMCSA sampling method was used for selection of pertinent records for inspection.

CARRIER OPERATION DESCRIPTION:

This UTC new entrant provisional household goods carrier specializes in moving residential household goods for mostly senior citizens from their homes to and between assisted living housing, skilled care nursing facilities and other senior living accommodations. The majority of hauls are in the Puget Sound region of Snohomish, King and Pierce Counties. The carrier has not operated in interstate or foreign commerce since start up.

PRE-INVESTIGATION:

This is a sole-proprietor operation. Mr. Nava operates a single commercial motor vehicle under 26,000 GVWR from his residence in Snohomish County. He was given educational and technical assistance regarding the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations as adopted by the Commission in WAC 480-15 in May 2013. The carrier is subject to the federal Safety Measurement System (SMS) program. The SMS provides an assessment of the motor carrier's on-road performance and investigation results within the Behavior Analysis and Safety Improvement Categories (BASICSs). The carrier did not have enough roadside inspection activity to receive a percentile BASIC performance score. Thus, no categories are in ALERT status.

CDLIS:

The single driver is not required to possess a commercial driver's license because the vehicle operated is under 26,001 GVWR. The driver's license was queried through the Washington State Department of Licensing database and found to be valid.

DRIVERS WITH RED FLAG VIOLATIONS:

There were no drivers with red flag violations identified as needing an investigation. No further action was required.

INVESTIGATION:

In conducting this comprehensive safety compliance review, records pertaining to UTC adopted Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations found in 49 CFR Parts 390, 391, 392, 393, 395 and 396 were reviewed with the following results:

Part 391 Driver Qualification: The driver qualification file was inspected for this owner-operator. The carrier did not have a complete employment application on himself and failed to perform an annual review of driving record. The violations noted are found in Part B of this report.

Authentication of Medical Examiners Certificate: In accordance with FMCSA Memorandum MC-ECS-2012-004 the medical examiner's certificate for the single driver was selected for validation check:

RESULTS: Policy, could not confirm.

Part 392 Driving of Motor Vehicles: There were no known violations in this category. The carrier is aware of the rules of road requirements, use of seat belt, prohibition of radar detectors, prohibition of texting while driving and other safety rules in this part.

Part 393, Parts and Accessories: The carrier is always subject to roadside inspection. One vehicle inspection was used from the carrier safety profile. There have been no out-of-service conditions in the past 12 months.

Part 395, Hours of Service: As a property carrier in intrastate commerce, the carrier is subject to the 11, 14 and 70 hour rules and may take advantage of the 34 hour restart. The carrier has operated exclusively within a 150 air mile radius of the normal work reporting location and is not required to record the 30 minute break. Time records are maintained showing starting time, ending time and total on duty time. The carrier meets the short haul provision exemption. The driver worked or was on duty 20 days in a 30 day period between August 20 and September 20, 2013.

Part 396, Inspection, Repair & Maintenance: The carrier owns and operates a single commercial motor vehicle under 26,001 GVWR. There is a current periodic (annual) inspection on the vehicle. Management tracks due dates for service to be performed. Written maintenance records identify the vehicle and show date/type of repair or service performed. Repair orders and service invoices can be reconciled against the maintenance file. This is a single vehicle operator and no driver vehicle inspection reports are required.

Note: The carrier is not subject to commercial driver's license (CDL) regulations because of vehicle size and there is no transportation of hazardous materials. The carrier is not subject to USDOT type controlled substance and alcohol testing because there are no drivers with CDLs and no vehicles used which require a CDL to operate.

Financial Responsibility/Insurance: The carrier meets the UTC requirement for public liability and property damage

insurance through a policy underwritten by Charter Indemnity Co (6365120). There is a current Form E filing. Cargo insurance is underwritten by Charter Indemnity Co policy LCC1CR6365120-01 and it meets the minimum state requirements.

Household Goods: The carrier prepares a required format bill of lading for each shipment, valuation is typically the default rate and estimates are prepared when required. The firm uses UTC Tariff 15-C as the basis for rates. Loss and damage claims are documented and there is a contingency for using an arbitrator, if needed. The company transported about 85 loads in 2012 and is on target for a higher level this year. The carrier markets it services through word of mouth and Internet services.

FOLLOW-ON ACTION:

Mr. Nava was cooperative and indicated a desire to achieve and maintain further compliance with the FMCSRs as they apply to his current operation. The carrier plans to update the driver qualification file.

DOCUMENTS PROVIDED TO CARRIER:

The carrier was previously provided with a UTC safety manual. Mr. Nava was given a overview of the FMCSRs and further instruction on how to comply with them.

It is anticipated that the carrier will achieve a satisfactory safety rating based on current or former criteria provided by the USDOT Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration for this intrastate operation.
