NOTICE REQUIRING FILING OF SETTLEMENT DOCUMENTS
(by 5 p.m., Friday, December 15, 2023)

RE: *Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission v. PacifiCorp, d/b/a Pacific Power and Light Company,*
Dockets UE-230172 and UE-210852 (*Consolidated*)

TO ALL PARTIES:

On April 19, 2023, PacifiCorp d/b/a Pacific Power (PacifiCorp or Company) filed with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) revisions to its currently effective Tariff WN U-76. The purpose of the filing is to increase rates and charges for electric service provided to customers in the state of Washington.

On May 25, 2023, the Commission issued Order 03, Prehearing Conference Order; Notice of Hearing, which established a procedural schedule including, among other things, an evidentiary hearing beginning on Monday, December 11, 2023, continuing as needed on December 12.

On December 6, 2023, the Company contacted the presiding officer to inform the Commission that PacifiCorp, the Alliance of Western Energy Consumers, the NW Energy Coalition, The Energy Project, and Walmart (collectively, the Settling Parties) have reached a partial settlement in principle. The Company added that Sierra Club does not oppose the settlement and that Public Counsel has not yet taken a position. PacifiCorp further noted that the settlement leaves some issues still unresolved.

The Commission finds good cause to proceed with the evidentiary hearing scheduled to begin at 9 a.m. on Monday, December 11, 2023. The Company has indicated on behalf of the parties that the parties anticipate limiting their cross-examination of witnesses to issues related to net power

costs (NPC) and the power cost adjustment mechanism (PCAM), which are not subject to the settlement in principle.

The Commission additionally finds good cause to require the Settling Parties to file the settlement agreement and supporting testimony by 5 p.m. on Friday, December 15, 2023.

The Commission will likely modify the remaining procedural schedule once it has received the settlement and supporting documents and can determine what further process is necessary. For now, the existing procedural schedule remains in place.

THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE That the Settling Parties must file a settlement agreement and supporting testimony by 5 p.m. on Friday, December 15, 2023.
