Dear Ms. Harris,

Thank you for committing to retiring two of the four plants that comprise the Colstrip Power Plant. I am writing to ask that you take a step further and commit to retiring the remaining two plants by 2025 and replacing it with 100% renewable and energy-efficient sources with no new natural gas.

Climate change is an existential threat to humanity. The impacts to global health, food production, and water availability are alarming enough, but local impacts will be profound — ocean acidification that affects oyster beds, warmer rivers with higher peak flows and lower summer flows that reduce salmon survival and productivity, or reduced agricultural production, our energy use in this region

has both local and global impact.

available to switch to renewable  
energy sources, and it is imperative  
that we all commit to bold  
and effective action. There is  
strong public support in Washington  
for committing to 100% renewables  
in a way that makes economic

Please retire the remaining two  
coal plants.
