(j) Short explanation of rule, its purpose, and anticipated effects:					
The proposed rulemaking will change adoption-by-reference dates to reflect current versions of the adopted material and make other minor administrative changes such as: correct telephone numbers; repeal obsolete sections; add cross-references to adopted material; and create new sections in each chapter that move the adoption-by-reference material to the same location in each chapter in Title 480.					
Each applicable chapter in Title 480 will have an adoption-by-reference rule ending in section number 999. This proposed change will provide for efficiencies in future adoption-by-reference date changes in Title 480 WAC.					
Updating the adoption-by-reference dates in the pipeline safety chapters of rules is necessary to maintain the Commission's federal certification.					
The Commission's participation in the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance is contingent on adopting current federal rules.					
Updating the adoption-by-reference dates in the transportation chapters of rules will provide for consistency between intrastate and interstate operations and equal enforcement.

This rulemaking incorporates recent federal rule changes into the Commission's rule and makes other administrative changes.
