BACKGROUND

- Washington State law requires household goods carriers operating in the state of Washington subject to regulation by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (commission) to file and maintain proof of liability and property damage insurance.
- On October 23, 2006, the commission notified you by letter that your permit to operate as a household goods carrier in Washington State would be suspended if acceptable proof of insurance was not filed by your insurance company. We also told you that you could contest suspension of your permit by requesting a hearing within 10 days of the notice.
- We have not received proof of insurance and you did not request a hearing.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSION

- The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission is an agency of the state of Washington having authority to regulate household goods carriers as defined in RCW 81.80.
- Don C. Risk, Jr. is a household goods carrier operating in Washington State under permit no. HG-11881.
- On October 23, 2006, the commission received notice of insurance cancellation related to the named carrier effective December 1, 2006.
- 7 The commission is authorized by WAC 480-15-430(1)(a) to suspend a household goods permit for failure to file and maintain proof of insurance.
- The commission is authorized by WAC 480-15-450(2) to cancel a household goods permit for failure to correct conditions leading to suspension within the time defined in the order of suspension.

ORDER

- The commission suspends permit no. HG-11881 for a period of 30 days effective December 1, 2006.
- You are directed to cease all operations associated with this certificate until the commission receives proof of liability and property damage insurance and enters an order lifting the suspension and authorizes you to resume operations.
- If proof of insurance is not filed within 30 days certificate no. HG-11881 will be cancelled without further notice or order. To reinstate this certificate you must submit a new application and acceptable proof of insurance.
- You may contest cancellation of this certificate by requesting a hearing within 10 days of service of this order. A hearing request does not affect the suspension status of your certificate.
