- NATURE OF PROCEEDINGS. Dockets TG-111991, TG-111992 and TG-111993 involve filings by Rabanco Ltd., d/b/a Eastside Disposal, Container Hauling, Rabanco Connections and Rabanco Companies, Rabanco Ltd., d/b/a Allied Waste Services of Kent, Rabanco Companies and Sea-Tac Disposal, and Rabanco Ltd., d/b/a Lynnwood Disposal (collectively Rabanco). Each company proposes to increase the amount it pays to single family and multi-family customers for the value of the recyclable materials that Rabanco collects in its residential recycling collection service. Each company also seeks Commission approval of its recycling revenue sharing plan under RCW 81.77.185.
- 2 **CONFERENCE.** The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) convened a prehearing conference in this docket at Olympia, Washington on March 5, 2012, before Administrative Law Judge Gregory J. Kopta.
- APPEARANCES. Fronda Woods, Assistant Attorney General, Olympia, Washington, represents the Commission's regulatory staff (Commission Staff or Staff). David W. Wiley, Williams, Kastner & Gibbs, PLLC, Seattle, Washington, represents Rabanco, Ltd. Contact information provided at the conference for the parties' representatives is attached as Appendix A to this order.
- 4 **PETITIONS FOR INTERVENTION.** No interested person appeared at the conference seeking to intervene.
- 5 **CONSOLIDATION.** The Commission previously entered an order consolidating these three dockets on February 15, 2012.
- **DISCOVERY.** It does not appear that discovery will be required in this proceeding. If parties see a need for discovery, any party may move that the Commission make the Commission's discovery rules available.
- 7 **PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE.** The parties agreed on the following procedural schedule during the conference: Each party will file a motion for summary

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determination by July 13, 2012, and responses will be due by August 2, 2012. The Commission adopts this procedural schedule, which is attached to this Order as Appendix B.

- WAIVER OF INITIAL ORDER. The parties agreed to waive an initial order in this case and have the Commission issue a final order directly after the briefing is concluded. Each of the parties will submit a letter confirming this waiver.
- 9 **DOCUMENT PREPARATION AND FILING REQUIREMENTS.** Parties must file an original plus **five** (5) copies of all pleadings, motions, briefs, and other prefiled materials. These materials must conform to the format and publication guidelines in WAC 480-07-395 and WAC 480-07-460. The Commission prefers that materials be three-hole punched with *oversized* holes to allow easy handling. The Commission may require a party to refile any document that fails to conform to these standards.
- All filings must be mailed or delivered to the Executive Director and Secretary, Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission, P.O. Box 47250, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive, S.W. Olympia, Washington 98504-7250. Both the post office box and street address are required to expedite deliveries by the U.S. Postal Service.
- An electronic copy of all filings must be provided through the Commission's Web Portal (www.utc.wa.gov/e-filing) or by e-mail delivery to <<u>records@utc.wa.gov</u>>. Alternatively, parties may furnish an electronic copy by delivering with each filing a 3.5-inch IBM-formatted high-density diskette or CD including the filed document(s). Parties must furnish electronic copies in MS Word 6.0 (or later) supplemented by a separate file in .pdf (Adobe Acrobat) format. Parties must follow WAC 480-07-140(5) in organizing and identifying electronic files.
- the Commission of the Commission on the filing deadline to expedite the filing process, but must file an original, plus **five** (5) paper copies, of the documents with the Commission by 12:00 noon on the first business day following the filing deadline established in the procedural schedule. WAC 480-07-145(6). Parties may submit documents electronically through the Commission's Web Portal (<a href="www.utc.wa.gov/efiling">www.utc.wa.gov/efiling</a>) or by e-mail to <a href="mailto:records@utc.wa.gov">records@utc.wa.gov</a>. Finally, to perfect filing, parties must simultaneously provide e-mail courtesy copies of filings to the presiding administrative law judge (<a href="mailto:gkopta@utc.wa.gov">gkopta@utc.wa.gov</a>) as well as to the parties to the proceeding.

- ALTERNATE DISPUTE RESOLUTION. The Commission supports the informal settlement of matters before it. Parties are encouraged to consider means of resolving disputes informally. The Commission does have limited ability to provide dispute resolution services; if you wish to explore those services, please call the Director, Administrative Law Division, at 360-664-1355.
- NOTICE TO PARTIES: A party who objects to any portion of this Order must file a written objection within ten (10) calendar days after the service date of this Order, pursuant to WAC 480-07-430 and WAC 480-07-810. The service date appears on the first page of the order in the upper right-hand corner. Absent such objection, this Order will control further proceedings in this matter, subject to Commission review.
