- 7 JUDGE PEARSON: Let's be on the record in Docket
- 8 TR-143902, captioned: City of Woodinville v. Eastside Community
- 9 Rail, Ballard Terminal Rail, Port of Seattle, and Washington
- 10 State Department of Transportation, and Docket TR-143903,
- 11 captioned: City of Woodinville v. Eastside Community Rail, King
- 12 County, Ballard Terminal Rail, and Washington State Department
- 13 of Transportation.
- 14 My name is Rayne Pearson. I'm the administrative law
- 15 judge presiding over this case. And today is Thursday, March
- 16 19, 2015, at approximately 10:30 a.m., and we are here for a
- 17 prehearing conference to establish a procedural schedule in
- 18 these dockets.
- 19 So let's begin by taking full appearances. We'll
- 20 start with Staff, and then continue in this direction. And once
- 21 we are finished identifying everyone in the room, and I will ask
- 22 if anyone is on the bridge line who wishes to identify
- 23 themselves for the record.
- So, please, when it's your turn, state your name,
- 25 spelling your last name for the court reporter, who you

- 1 represent, your address, phone number, e-mail address, and fax
- 2 number.
- 3 Mr. Beattie?
- 4 MR. BEATTIE: Thank you, Judge Pearson.
- 5 My name is Julian Beattie, B-e-a-t-t-i-e. I'm with
- 6 the Attorney General's Office. I represent Commission Staff in
- 7 these dockets.

- 19 JUDGE PEARSON: Is your microphone turned on? The
- 20 red light should be on.
- Is it on now?
- MR. ENGLE: It is on now.
- JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Okay.
- MR. RUBSTELLO: Excellent.
- MR. ENGLE: Okay. Doug Engle, Eastside Community

- 1 Rail.

- JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.
- 7 Go ahead.
- 8 MR. COLE: So my name is Byron Cole; B-y-r-o-n,
- 9 C-o-l-e. I'm the founder, one of the founders, and the general
- 10 manager of the Ballard Terminal Railroad Company, LLC. It was
- 11 formed in about 1962.

- JUDGE PEARSON: Phone number?
- MR. COLE: The office phone in Seattle is

- JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. And do you have a fax number?

- JUDGE PEARSON: Thank you.

- Okay. And so I understand the City of Woodinville is

- MR. RUBSTELLO: Okay. My name is Greg Rubstello.

- 16 Woodinville.

- 1 MR. RUBSTELLO: Dotcom.
- 2 JUDGE PEARSON: And your last name, are you saying
- 3 R-u, "b," as in boy, or "v," as in Victor?
- 4 MR. RUBSTELLO: "B," as in boy.
- JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.
- 6 MR. RUBSTELLO: There are two staff people from
- 7 Woodinville here in the room with me, so for your record, Tom
- 8 Hansen, the public works director, and Rick Roberts, the
- 9 assistant public works director.
- 10 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.
- 11 Is there anyone else on the bridge line who wishes to
- 12 enter an appearance today?
- MR. MARCUSE: Yes, there is.
- Go ahead, Isabel.
- MS. SAFORA: Okay. This is Isabel Safora;
- 16 I-s-a-b-e-l; last name is "S," as in Sam, "a," "f," as in Frank,
- 17 o-r-a. And I'm the deputy general counsel for the Port of
- 18 Seattle.
- 19 My address is: PO Box 1209, Seattle, Washington
- 20 98111; and the telephone is: 206.787.3216; fax is:
- 21 206.787.3205; and my e-mail address is:

- JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
- 24 MR. MARCUSE: And appearing for King County, this is
- 25 Andrew Marcuse. I filed a notice of appearance in this matter,

- 1 so I think you have my contact information.
- JUDGE PEARSON: That's fine.
- 3 MR. MARCUSE: All right. Thank you very much.
- 4 JUDGE PEARSON: Is there anyone else on the bridge
- 5 line?
- 6 Okay. Hearing nothing. Let's move on to --
- 7 MR. NIZAM: We have one more appearance, Your Honor.
- JUDGE PEARSON: Oh, I'm sorry.
- 9 MR. NIZAM: Hi, my name is Ahmer Nizam. It's spelled
- 10 A-h-m-e-r; N-i-z-a-m. I'm representing the Washington State
- 11 Department of Transportation.
- 12 My mailing address is: PO Box 47329, Olympia,

- 16 JUDGE PEARSON: And I apologize for that. I'm not
- 17 used to turning my head that way, so...
- 18 Okay. So let's move on to the issue of
- 19 consolidation.
- 20 Are there any parties that are opposed to
- 21 consolidating these two dockets?
- 22 Okay. Hearing nothing, I will consolidate the two
- 23 dockets in the prehearing conference order.
- 24 Are there any parties that are seeking intervention?
- JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Hearing nothing, it appears

- 1 that no one is seeking intervention.
- 2 Do the parties want the discovery rules to be
- 3 available in this case? I assume that they do.
- 4 MR. BEATTIE: Staff would like the discovery rules to
- 5 be available, please.
- JUDGE PEARSON: Okay.
- 7 MR. RUBSTELLO: The City of Woodinville requests the
- 8 same.
- 9 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. We'll make those available to
- 10 the parties.
- 11 And do each of the parties consent to electronic
- 12 service if the Commission decides to serve documents in that
- 13 matter?
- MR. COLE: Yes.
- MR. BEATTIE: Yes, consent.
- MR. RUBSTELLO: Yes, Woodinville agrees.
- MS. SAFORA: Yes.
- JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you.
- 19 And that brings us to the schedule. I assume that
- 20 the parties will need a recess to discuss a procedural schedule?
- MR. BEATTIE: Correct.
- 22 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. So we will go off the record.
- 23 I will be in my office. And if you just want to give me a call
- 24 when you have decided on a schedule. And I will have my
- 25 calendar, as well as the Commission's hearing room calendar here

- 1 with me to check availability when we come back on the record.
- Okay. Let's be off the record. Thank you.
- 3 (A break was taken from 10:42 a.m.
- 4 to 11:17 a.m.)
- 5 (Ms. Safora and Mr. Marcuse left the
- 6 proceedings during the recess.)
- JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Let's be back on the record.
- 8 During the break, the parties agreed on a procedural
- 9 schedule which I will ask Mr. Beattie to now read into the
- 10 record.
- 11 MR. BEATTIE: Thank you, Judge. The parties
- 12 conferred and agreed on the following procedural schedule:
- 13 The parties are seeking a mediated settlement
- 14 conference on Tuesday, April 7, 2015. Following mediation,
- 15 should further proceedings be necessary, the Petitioner's direct
- 16 testimony and exhibits would be due Tuesday, May 5th; Staff and
- 17 Respondent responsive testimony and exhibits would be due
- 18 Tuesday, May 19th; Petitioner rebuttal testimony, as well as
- 19 Staff and Intervenor -- although I suppose we don't have any
- 20 Intervenor, so Staff cross-answering would be due June 2, 2015;
- 21 a final settlement conference would be scheduled for Tuesday,
- 22 June 16, 2015.
- 23 And should we be proceeding to hearing, nonetheless,
- 24 cross-examination exhibits would be due one week before the
- 25 hearing on Tuesday, July 7th, with an evidentiary hearing

- 1 scheduled for Tuesday, July 14th, proceeding on to Wednesday,
- 2 July 15th, if necessary, with simultaneous briefs due from all
- 3 participants in the hearing on Tuesday, August 4, 2015.
- 4 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. Thank you. So I will look
- 5 into the facilitated mediation availability of a mediator for
- 6 the parties, and I will reserve a room at the Commission for
- 7 both days of the hearing like I stated when we were off the
- 8 record, and it's incumbent upon the parties to find a facility
- 9 in Woodinville to host the hearing and to notify me of that
- 10 location at least 45 days before the hearing date. Otherwise,
- 11 we will hold the hearing in this room. So please make sure that
- 12 you notify me directly when you secure the location.
- MR. RUBSTELLO: And that's a matter of agreement
- 14 among all the parties; is that --
- 15 JUDGE PEARSON: Well, it sounds like we've agreed
- 16 that it's just a matter of you confirming whether or not the
- 17 council chambers is available and whether it can be set up --
- MR. RUBSTELLO: All right.
- 19 JUDGE PEARSON: -- in the fashion that we need it to
- 20 be.
- 21 MALE SPEAKER: Are there some particular requirements
- 22 that you need, house setup or some recording facilities, that
- 23 would be unusual? We do record. We have capability to record
- 24 audio and record video in the council chamber.
- 25 Do you have any other requirements above and beyond

- 1 that or how it's set up?
- 2 JUDGE PEARSON: We need microphones and a PA system,
- 3 right?
- 4 MR. RUBSTELLO: Sure.
- 5 MALE SPEAKER: Sure, we have those available to you.
- 6 JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. So it sounds like that will
- 7 work provided that you can confirm those dates.
- 8 MALE SPEAKER: Okay. We just wanted to make sure
- 9 there was nothing physical that we had to have that we don't
- 10 already have.
- 11 JUDGE PEARSON: I don't think so. There's a certain
- 12 way that we like the room set up with tables and chairs, but we
- 13 can figure that out later.
- 14 MALE SPEAKER: Okay.
- MR. RUBSTELLO: Okay.
- JUDGE PEARSON: Okay. So I assume that, obviously,
- 17 the medicated settlement conference will be facilitated by
- 18 another ALJ, but the second settlement conference on June 16th
- 19 is parties only; is that correct?
- MR. BEATTIE: We did not discuss that, but I would
- 21 say that that would be parties only for now, although I suppose
- 22 if maybe we could reserve that discussion to a future date.
- JUDGE PEARSON: As a second facilitated mediation?
- 24 Okay. That sounds good.
- Okay. Is there anything else that we need to discuss

while we're here today? Okay. I will issue an order reflecting what was decided, and we are adjourned. Thank you. (Proceeding concluded at 11:20 a.m.) -000-
