Commission Staff's Recommendation to Waive Suspended Penalties of Order 02

Docket TE-180219

Dear Mr. Johnson:

On June 4, 2018, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (commission) entered Order 02 in Docket TE-180219, classifying Tiger Express Shipping Corporation, d/b/a Tiger Travel (Tiger Travel or company) as a charter party or excursion service carrier within the state of Washington and assessed Tiger Travel a penalty in the amount of \$5,000 for two violations of RCW 81.70.260(1). In addition, Order 02 suspended a \$4,500 portion of the penalty for a period of two years subject to the conditions that Tiger Travel refrains from further operations as a charter party or excursion service carrier in the state of Washington without first obtaining the required certificate from the commission and that the company pays the \$500 portion of the penalty that is not suspended.

On June 7, 2018, Tiger Travel paid the \$500 non-suspended portion of the penalty in full. To date, Tiger Travel has refrained from further operations as a charter party or excursion service carrier in this state. Commission staff finds that Tiger Travel has satisfied the conditions of Order 02 and recommends that the \$4,500 suspended penalty be waived.
