CHAIR DANNER: Good evening, everyone. Tonight -- or today is Monday, November 20, 2023, and this is a public comment hearing of the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission in Docket UE-230172.

I'm Dave Danner. I'm chair of the commission. I'm joined by my colleagues, Commissioner Ann Rendahl and Commissioner Milt Doumit.

On March 17, 2023, PacifiCorp, doing business as Pacific Power and Light Company, filed with the commission a request that we approve a two-year rate plan under which the company would increase its revenue by approximately 26.8 million in the first year, which would be effective March 1, 2024, and approximately 27.9 million in the second year. These increases, the company says, are due to capital investments and increased power costs, among other things.

Under the company's proposal, the average residential customer using 1,200 kilowatt hours per month would see a rate increase of $\$ 12.11$ in the first year, followed by an increase of $\$ 9.34$ in the second year on top of that first-year rate increase.

The company's proposal includes a number of particulars, such as a proposal for an increase of $\$ 2.25$ in the basic charge for single family dwellings and the elimination of inclining blocks or tiered rate structures in favor of a seasonal rate.

The commission will hold an evidentiary hearing in this case beginning at 9:00 a.m. on December 11, and continuing through December 12.

The commission at that time will also consider a petition for an accounting order in another docket, and that's Docket UE-210852, which has been consolidated with this case. In that petition, the Alliance for Western Energy Consumers, or AWEC, requests the commission enter an order requiring PacifiCorp to defer from the date of the petition the revenue generated by the company's increased sale of fly ash from its Jim Bridger coal plant in Wyoming.

In preparation for the hearing, for the evidentiary hearing, the commission is currently reviewing written testimony in this case presented by the company as well as testimony from several intervening parties, including Walmart, the Sierra Club, the Alliance of Western Energy Consumers, the Northwest Energy Coalition, and The Energy Project.

The commission regulatory staff also provides

CHAIR DANNER: That 503 phone number, that might be PacifiCorp.

All right. Let me ask if there is anyone on the call tonight who wishes to comment in this docket or make comments to the commission tonight.

ANDREW ROBERTS: So to unmute on the phone,

CHAIR DANNER: All right. Then we can -- at this point, then, we will just make clear that we will be accepting comments at least through December 12. And we can determine at the evidentiary hearing when the deadline is. Commissioners, if that's okay with you?

COMMISSIONER RENDAHL: That's fine. Thank you.

COMMISSIONER DOUMIT: Yes.
