Thank you for your leadership in the decision to retire Colstrip 1+2 coal-burning plants — two of the dirtiest boiler units.

I write to urge you to commit to retiring units 3+4 by 2025. I further urge you not to renew the coal burning contract for this plant.

We can't continue to burn fossil-fuels without further damaging the health of the planet and of this + future generations.

The public and political will to move away from fossil fuels — particularly coal burning power plants and natural gas burning plants is growing stronger everyday. You can see this clearly in the recent decisions of REI, Microsoft and Starbucks to move to 100% renewable energy! It makes sense and cents for businesses and for the planet.
