ORDER INSTITUTING INVESTIGATION, ORDER OF CONSOLIDATION, AND NOTICE OF PREHEARING CONFERENCE

(April 30, 1996)

On November 1, 1995, Puget Sound Power & Light Company (Puget) filed its restated and proforma statement of operations for the year ended June 30, 1995, in compliance with paragraph 2 of the Joint Proposal adopted by the Commission in Docket Nos. UE-901183-T, UE-901184-P, and UE-950618. Puget is seeking review

and analysis to determine whether the currently collected revenue of approximately \$165.5 million authorized in the PRAM under Schedule 100 is fully supported by cost data and should be transferred to Puget's permanent rate schedules.

On February 20, 1996, Puget jointly applied with Washington Natural Gas Company (WNG) for an order of this Commission approving the merger of Washington Natural Gas Company, a Washington corporation, and its parent company, Washington Energy Company, into the surviving company of Puget Sound Power & Light Company. The surviving corporation will be renamed, but is referred to in the joint application as "NewCo," with principal executive offices in Bellevue, Washington.

Puget and WNG seek authority to (1) merge the assets of these companies into the surviving company; (2) issue common and preferred stock; (3) assume all obligations outstanding at the effective date of the merger and to continue and create liens in connection therewith; (4) adopt all tariff schedules and service contracts of WNG in effect at the time of merger; (5) transfer to NewCo all WNG certificates of public convenience and necessity; (6) implement a proposed rate stability plan; (7) implement certain accounting treatment for regulatory and ratemaking purposes for conservation expenditures, environmental remediation costs, and proceeds from property transfers; (8) implement a proposed method for allocating costs between electric and gas operations; and (9) defer and amortize for regulatory and ratemaking purposes over the rate stability period of the merger transaction any transition costs associated therewith.

The Commission believes it necessary, in order to carry out the duties imposed upon it by law, to investigate the companies' books, accounts, practices, and activities to make a valuation or appraisal of property, and to investigate and appraise various phases of their operations.

Inasmuch as the aforementioned Joint Proposal stated that Puget's restated and proforma results of operations filed November 1, 1995, would be among the issues noticed in, presented in, and relevant to the merger filing, it has been determined that the foregoing matters should be consolidated for hearing and determination.

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED That an investigation shall be, and the same is hereby instituted by the Commission as specified above; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED That the companies shall pay the expenses reasonably attributable and allocable to such investigations to the extent required pursuant to the provisions of chapter 80.20 RCW; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED That each of the above-entitled causes be and the same is consolidated for hearing and determination, with the Commission reserving the right to hold such separate hearings and to issue separate orders in individual causes as it may deem appropriate.

NOTICE OF HEARING

Hearing in this matter is being held pursuant to Part IV of chapter 34.05 RCW pertaining to Adjudicative Proceedings, including but not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.422, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.449, and RCW 34.05.452. The Commission has jurisdiction over this matter under Title 80 RCW, having legal authority to regulate the rates, services, and practices of electric and natural gas utilities pursuant to 80.28 RCW; and to regulate transfers of property through merger or otherwise, and the securities or evidence of indebtedness of utility companies pursuant to chapters 80.08 and 80.12 RCW. Statutes involved, in addition to those previously cited, include those within chapter 80.04 RCW and RCW 80.01.040, RCW 80.08.040, and RCW 80.12.020 through .040. Rules involved include those within chapter 480-143, WAC relating to transfers of property, chapter 480-146 WAC relating to securities, chapter 480-150 WAC and chapter 480-09 WAC.

In Docket No. UE-951270, the ultimate issue is whether the currently collected revenue authorized in the PRAM under Schedule 100 is fully supported by cost data and should be transferred to the company's permanent rate schedules and would result in rates that are fair, just, reasonable, and sufficient. In Docket No. UE-960195, the ultimate issue involved is whether the proposed merger and financial activities required to effectuate it are consistent with the public interest. The burden

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of proof to show the justness and reasonableness of the transfer and the merger shall be upon the companies.
