The Energy Project works with Community Action Agencies that provide rate assistance and energy efficiency programs for Puget Sound Energy's (PSE) low-income electric and natural gas customers. The Energy Project also works generally with utilities and other stakeholders to develop and expand rate assistance and energy efficiency programs for low-income customers in Washington. The Energy Project is a frequent party in general rate cases and other significant dockets before the UTC involving Washington investor-owned utilities when energy affordability, energy efficiency, and customer service policies are at issue. The Energy Project has concerns regarding the impact of PSE's electric rate request on PSE's low-income customers and programs.

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The Energy Project has a direct and substantial interest in PSE's tariff filing in this docket and no other party will adequately represent those interests. The Energy Project will be the only party to focus solely on the interests of low-income customers in this proceeding.
