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SCHEDULE 86 SERVICE LINES

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- 1. OVERHEAD SERVICE LINES The Company will provide and install an individual overhead Service Line from an existing overhead distribution system or from one constructed under terms of Schedule 85 across private property to the Customer's service entrance facilities upon the following terms:
 - a. Payment shall be required toward the cost of construction of all new overhead Service Lines, as follows:
 - \$15 for any Secondary Service Line between a distribution or service pole to the Point of Delivery; and in addition,
 - (2) For any Service Line requiring an intermediate pole (other than for the convenience of the Company), \$50 plus \$1.25 for each foot of single-phase or \$2.15 for each circuit foot of three-phase Service Line, measured along the path of construction from the property line nearest to the Company's Primary distribution system to the last pole on the Premises to be served.
 - b. The Customer shall pay for any additional cost of providing service to a Point of Delivery other than the normal Point of Delivery upon request of the Customer or for his convenience.
- 2. SECONDARY UNDERGROUND SERVICE LINES TO RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS The Company will provide and install an individual Secondary underground Service Line across private property to approved service entrance facilities on the following terms:
 - a. New Customers
 - (1) From an underground distribution system: The Customer shall (a) pay the Company \$20 toward the cost of construction for each single family unit served by such Service Line and (b) pay the Company for costs of trenching and backfill on the Customer's property. At its option, the Company may accept Customer-provided trenching and backfill in lieu of payment therefor.

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- (2) From an overhead distribution system: The Customer shall pay the Company \$70 for facilities necessary to connect the underground Service Line to the overhead system in addition to the conditions specified in 2 (a) (1), above.
- Existing Customers
 - In an underground (conversion) area, requiring removal of an overhead service line: The Customer shall (a) pay the Company for the costs of construction at the rate of \$55 plus \$.70 for each foot of underground Service Line located on private property in excess of 100 feet; (b) make necessary changes in service entrance equipment to accept the underground Service Line; (c) provide a trench to the Company's specifications from the Customer's service entrance to a point designated by the Company; and (d) backfill the trench following the installation of the underground Service Line.
 - (2) From an overhead distribution system: The Customer shall pay the Company \$70 for facilities necessary to connect the underground Service Line to the overhead system in addition to the conditions specified in 2 (b) (1), above.
- PRIMARY UNDERGROUND SERVICE LINES TO RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS The Company will provide and install a Primary underground Service Line across private property to serve a single Customer upon payment of the costs of construction at the rate of \$400 if from an existing underground system or \$500 if from an existing overhead system, plus \$1.25 for each trench foot measured along the path of construction from the property line nearest to the Company's existing distribution system to the transformer pad or vault.
- UNDERGROUND SERVICE LINES TO NON-RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS (INCLUDING MULTI-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL COMPLEXES)
 - The Company will provide and install a Primary underground Service Line, including Secondary terminations, from its overhead or underground distribution system across private property on the following terms:

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- (1) The Customer shall pay to the Company the total installed cost of such Service Line, less a maximum credit of \$10 per kilowatt of estimated maximum demand (excluding low load factor components such as X-ray machines, fire pumps, spot welders, elevators and seasonal or intermittent loads). Such credit may not apply against costs of trenching, excavation and backfill if such work is done by the Company.
- The Customer shall provide and install all Secondary service facilities beyond the Secondary terminations at the transformer or handhole.
- Upon application of an existing non-residential Customer within a Conversion Area the Company will provide and install a Primary underground Service Line, remove its overhead Service Line and connect the underground Service Line with the Main Distribution System in accordance with the terms of Schedule '71 of this tariff and on the following additional terms:
 - (1) The Customer shall pay the Company the installed cost to the Company of any required Primary service facilities, including trenching and/or required excavations and backfill, which are in excess of those facilities converted under terms of Schedule 71.
 - The Customer shall provide and install all Secondary service facilities beyond the Secondary terminations at the transformer or handhole.
- OPERATING RIGHTS Adequate legal rights for the construction, operation, repair and maintenance of Primary or Secondary overhead or underground service facilities over or through all property, including property not owned by the Customer, must be provided to the Company by the owner or owners thereof prior to the commencement of construction of said facilities.

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- 6. OWNERSHIP OF FACILITIES The Company shall own, operate and maintain all facilities not required to be provided and installed by the Customer pursuant to this Schedule.
- 7. ECONOMIC FEASIBILITY The Company shall not be required to construct any Service Line under this Schedule if such Service Line is, in the reasonable judgment of the Company, economically unfeasible. Service may, however, be provided to Customers on terms which require payment of amounts sufficient to justify the Company's investment in facilities.
- 8. SUBSEQUENT CUSTOMERS Additional Customers may be served from a Primary Service Line, provided operating rights can be acquired for extensions thereto. If such additional Customer(s) are connected within three years following the completion of construction of the Primary Service Line, it shall be deemed to have become a line extension and the Company will redetermine the cost thereof in accordance with provisions of Schedule 85 of this tariff. The difference between any cost paid by the Customer for such Service Line and the allocated cost to the Customer (if any) determined under provisions of Schedule 85 shall be refunded to the then owner(s) of the property served by such Service Lines at the time of connection of such additional Customer(s).
- 9. GENERAL RULES AND PROVISIONS Service under this schedule is subject to the General Rules and Provisions contained in this tariff.
