The purpose of this hearing is to determine 10 11 whether Sunrise Acres is a water company subject to the 12 jurisdiction of the Washington Utilities and 13 Transportation Commission. 14 My name is Nelli Doroshkin, and I am the administrative law judge presiding over this proceeding. 15 16 We will begin by taking appearances with the 17 parties beginning with Commission Staff, and after that, I will give an overview of how this hearing will 18 19 proceed. 20 MR. FUKANO: Good morning, Judge Doroshkin. I am Harry Fukano, assistant attorney general with 21 22 Utilities and Transportation division, and I am here on 23 behalf of Commission Staff. 24 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. And is Mr. Harrison 25 in the room?

Page 5 Is there anyone else in the hearing 1 Okay. 2 room or on the bridge line who would also like to enter 3 an appearance? 4 And your name is? MR. CHRISTENSEN: Paul Christensen. 5 6 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Paul Christensen? Could 7 you please state and spell your first and last name, 8 please? Or spell your first and last name. 9 MR. CHRISTENSEN: P-a-u-l, C-h-r-i-s-t-e-n-s-e-n. 10 11 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. And you are 12 appearing on behalf of Sunrise Acres? 13 Interested party at this MR. CHRISTENSEN: 14 point. 15 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. And what is your 16 interest in the case? 17 MR. CHRISTENSEN: My daughter is looking at buying the Sunrise Acres water system. 18 19 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. And will you be -do you plan on testifying on behalf of Sunrise Acres or 20 are you simply observing the proceeding? 21 22 MR. CHRISTENSEN: Depends on how the 23 proceeding goes. Depends on what information might be 24 needed at that point. So I would testify if required or 25 asked to.

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JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Is there anyone else in the hearing room or on the bridge line who would like to enter an appearance? Okay. Hearing nothing, we will proceed.

As noted earlier, this is a classification 5 hearing initiated by the Commission based on Staff's 6 7 findings that Sunrise Acres is subject to Commission 8 jurisdiction. If we determine today that that is the 9 case, then we will issue an order requiring Sunrise Acres to file an initial tariff under provision 10 480-110 -- or 110-433, Subsection 3 of the Washington 11 12 Administrative Code or WAC. Among other things, that 13 regulation would require Sunrise Acres to notify its 14 customers prior to filing the tariff with the Commission. 15

16 So Staff will present its case first, and 17 then Sunrise will have an opportunity to ask the Staff 18 witness questions based on what the Staff witness has 19 said. And after that, Mr. Harrison will have an 20 opportunity to present his case and testify regarding 21 Sunrise Acres' proper classification.

Mr. Harrison, if you'd like, you can come up here and sit. And, Mr. Harrison, is your address, telephone number, and email address on file with the Commission?

1 MR. HARRISON: Yes, it is. 2 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: It is, okay. Then Staff will present its case first. 3 4 Mr. Fukano, you may make any preliminary remarks and then call Staff's first witness. 5 6 MR. FUKANO: As a preliminary matter, would 7 the Court -- or excuse me, would the Commission inquire 8 as to the -- Mr. Harrison's response to the subpoena 9 contained in the complaint at paragraph 13? And I have 10 a copy --11 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. I was going to ask 12 that when it came to Mr. Harrison's turn to present his 13 case. 14 MR. FUKANO: That would be fine with Staff. 15 Under RCW 80.04.010, the Commission has 16 jurisdiction over water companies that have greater than 17 The same statute requires the Commission 100 customers. to include all portions of water companies having common 18 ownership or control when determining the measurement of 19 customers or revenue for a particular water system to 20 resolve whether a water system's subject to the 21 22 Commission's jurisdiction. 23 Staff intends to introduce evidence that 24 Sunrise Acres is owned or controlled by Tom Harrison and 25 that Mr. Harrison owns two additional water companies in

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1	addition to Sunrise Acres and that the total number of	
2	customers across all of Mr. Harrison's water systems	
3	exceeds the Commission's jurisdictional threshold.	
4	Furthermore, Staff intends to introduce	
5	evidence that Mr. Harrison has not filed a tariff for	
б	Sunrise Acres contrary to the requirements of RCW	
7	80.28.050. Thank you.	
8	And I would like to call Susie Paul as my	
9	first witness.

11	SUSIE PAUL, witness herein, having been	
12	first duly sworn on oath,

18	Q. Good afternoon, Ms. Paul.	
19	A. Good afternoon.	
20	Q. Would you please state your name and spell your	
21	last name for the record.	
22	A. My name is Susie Paul, P-a-u-l.	
23	Q. And please state the name of your employer.	
24	A. I'm employed by the Washington Utilities and	
25	Transportation Commission.

And what is your position with the Commission? 1 Q. 2 Α. I'm a compliance investigator for consumer 3 protection. 4 And what does your position involve? Ο. I investigate the business practices of 5 Α. 6 regulated utility and transportation companies, and as 7 part of my duties, I also investigate nonpermitted or 8 nonregulated companies that may be operating. 9 And how long have you worked for the Commission? 0. I started with the Commission in April of 2013. 10 Α. 11 And what are your qualifications? Ο. 12 Α. I have a degree in criminal justice. I have 13 been working as -- in the regulatory field as an investigator for 14-plus years. I also am a 14 certificated investigator for the state of Washington, 15 16 and I'm a board member of the Pacific Northwest License 17 and Tax Fraud Association that recruits and provides training for Washington State investigators. 18 19 Now I'd like to discuss the matter at issue in 0. 20 today's hearing. Are you familiar with Sunrise Acres? 21 22 Α. Yes. How are you familiar? 23 0. I became familiar, there was some consumer 24 Α. 25 complaints that came in about two companies owned by

And when did you last check the Secretary of 9 State records for any updates? I checked it this morning, about 9:30 this 10 Α. 11 morning. 12 Q. Would you please turn to attachment B on pages 13 11 and 12. 14 Okay. Α. 15 What is attachment B? 0. 16 Α. This is a Department of Health record. It's the Water Facilities Inventory Form and it's for Sunrise 17 18 Acres water system. 19 And does the Department of Health forms indicate Ο. who owns Sunrise Acres? 20 Yes, on -- in box 7, it lists William Tom T. 21 Α. Harrison as the owner. 22 And when did you last check the Department of 23 0. 24 Health records for any updates? 25 Α. I checked that this morning, approximately 9:30.

Page 12 You had mentioned earlier in your testimony that 1 Q. 2 you conducted an investigation into Sunrise Acres. Did you determine how many customers Sunrise Acres has? 3 4 Α. Yes. 5 Ο. How many --6 Α. Umm --7 Oh, how many customers does Sunrise Acres have? Ο. 8 Α. The company reported that they had 39 active 9 customers, and on the Department of Health forms, it indicates that they have 41 active connections with 50 10 11 approved connections. 12Ο. And did you, in the course of your 13 investigation, determine who owns Sunrise -- Sunrise 14 Acres? 15 Α. Yes. 16 Ο. Who owns Sunrise Acres? 17 Tom Harrison. Α. MR. FUKANO: At this time, I would offer 18 19 proposed SP-1 into evidence. 20 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Mr. Harrison, do you have any objection to the admission of this exhibit? 21 22 MR. HARRISON: No. 23 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. Then SP-1 is 24 admitted as designated. 25 (Exhibit SP-1 admitted.)

2 Ms. Paul, to your knowledge, does Mr. Harrison 0. own any other water companies? 3 Α. 4 Yes. 5 0. How did you determine that Mr. Harrison owns other water companies? 6 7 Well, Mr. Harrison owns two other water Α. 8 companies; Harrison-Ray Water Company, Inc. and Harrison 9 Water Company/Kiona, LLC, and they are both regulated by UTC and have tariffs on file. 10 11 I'm showing you what's been labeled as proposed Ο. 12 Exhibit SP-2. What is this exhibit? 13 This is -- I wanted to make sure. This is the Α. Secretary of State business information for Harrison-Ray 14 15 Water Company. 16 Ο. And are you familiar with it? 17 Α. Yes. And how are you familiar with it? 18 Ο. 19 I researched this and printed out this Α. information. 20 21 Ο. And we are referring to attachment A on page 1 22 of proposed SP-2, correct? 23 Α. Yes. What does -- does the Secretary of State record 24 Ο. 25 indicate who the governor of Harrison-Ray is?

This is another printout from the Secretary of It's the business information for Harrison Water 17 State. Company/Kiona, LLC. 18 19 Does the Secretary of State record indicate who 0. 20 the governor of Harrison/Kiona is? Yes, it lists the registered agent as Tom 21 Α. Harrison, and it also lists Tom Harrison as the 22 23 governor. 24 Would you please turn to page 5 and 6 of Ο. 25 proposed SP-2?

FUKANO: At this time, I would offer 4 proposed SP-2 into evidence. 5 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Mr. Harrison, do you have any objections to the admission of that exhibit? 6 7 MR. HARRISON: No. 8 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. Then SP-2 is 9 admitted as designated. (Exhibit SP-2 admitted.) 10 BY MR. FUKANO: 11 12Ο. I would like to ask some questions about the investigation detailed in your report. 13 14 How did Staff initially become involved in this 15 matter? 16 Α. There were informal complaints coming in for 17 Harrison-Ray Water Company and Harrison Water Company/Kiona, and as a result of that, it was brought 18 out that they also had a third company called Sunrise 19 20 Acres. Based on your investigation, does Sunrise Acres 21 Ο. 22 operate a water system? 23 Α. Yes. 24 And how did you determine that? 0. 25 Α. Well, the company sent me the -- a copy of their

9	that Mr. Harrison owns and controls and the number of
10	customers they have. What is the total number of
11	customers contained in Harrison-Ray Water Company,
12	Harrison Water Company/Kiona, and Sunrise Acres?
13	A. That's the 494 total customers.
14	Q. If the total number of customers is more than
15	the hundred customer jurisdictional threshold, is
16	Sunrise Acres subject to the jurisdiction of the
17	Commission?
18	A. Yes.
19	Q. Is a jurisdictional water company required to
20	file a tariff with the Commission?
21	A. Yes, and we have attempted to have Mr. Harrison
22	file that tariff numerous times, and we sent Staff to
23	the company with a template for the tariff to encourage
24	the tariff to be filed.
25	Q. Has Sunrise Acres filed a tariff?

1 Α. No. MR. FUKANO: No further questions for this 2 3 witness. 4 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. Mr. Harrison, do 5 you have any questions for Ms. Paul based on what she said? 6 7 MR. HARRISON: No. JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. I have a few 8 9 questions. One is the -- really the only question I 10 have. The 242 self-reported customers for Harrison-Ray, similarly the 213 for the Harrison/Kiona, and the 39 for 11 12 Sunrise Acres, these are all self-reported numbers? 13 MS. PAUL: Yes. 14 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. And these were 15 provided in an email or how were they provided to you? 16 MS. PAUL: They were provided in an email 17 with a copy of the customer list. JUDGE DOROSHKIN: All right. I would like 18 19 to request that email to be filed in this docket, and if that could be done within the next 48 hours. 20 21 All right. Mr. Harrison, you'll now have an 22 opportunity to present your case. Will anyone be 23 speaking on behalf of Sunrise Acres other than yourself? 24 MR. HARRISON: Possibly Paul. 25 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. You will need to

13	testimony, do you have the documents that Order 01 in
14	this docket requires you to bring to the hearing?
15	MR. HARRISON: Yes.
16	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: And do you have copies of
17	these documents for myself and Staff?
18	MR. HARRISON: I don't know if they're
19	duplicate or the sole ones.
20	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Do you have just one copy
21	of all of these documents?
22	MR. HARRISON: Yes, yes.
23	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. Then we will take a
24	brief recess to make copies of the documents and look
25	over them and then we'll get back on the record.

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(A break was taken from 1 2 1:49 p.m. to 2:22 p.m.) JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. We will be back on 3 the record. Mr. Harrison, could you please briefly let 4 5 me know if this data that you provided, this is for 6 Sunrise Acres customers? 7 MR. HARRISON: Yes, it is. 8 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. So are certain of 9 these customers Sunrise Acres customers and there are 10 certain of them Harrison-Ray Water Company customers? 11 How is it segregated out? 12 MR. HARRISON: It should all be Sunrise 13 Acres. It's --14 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: These are all Sunrise 15 Acres? 16 MR. HARRISON: Yeah, there should be 39 of 17 them. JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. 39 total. 18 Okay. 19 All right. I see no need to admit this into the record. There is personally identifiable information in these 20 21 documents, and so for the time being, you can continue 22 with your testimony. 23 MR. HARRISON: All righty. This system 24 existed since the late '60s. It was owned by my dad and 25 mother. I inherited them here about three years ago. I

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Page 22 1 managed --2 I pushed that and it didn't light up. Ι 3 pushed --4 MR. FUKANO: It can be hard to see. MR. HARRISON: And it's just a little 5 6 39-unit domestic water-only system. It -- I -- it never 7 exceeded the hundred. I considered it a separate 8 system, you know, than the others because they're like -- one's six miles and one's 25 miles apart from 9 the other one, but I did manage them all. 10 I just -- like I said, I received them in 11 12 the closing of the estate roughly three years ago, and I'm in the process of selling the unit off to Paul's 13 daughter, we just haven't signed the papers yet. And I 14 figured we might get it done before, you know, the 15 16 meeting was held here. It would put it -- make it kind 17 of moot because it would go back to a single person owning it that doesn't own any other water companies. 18 I've had these things, like I said, since the '60s, late 19 '60s. I'm ready to be done with water companies. So if 20 you have any questions, go ahead and ask away. 21 22 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: All right. Mr. Fukano, do 23 you have any questions for Mr. Harrison? 24 MR. FUKANO: Just to confirm, that you had 25 stated that you did manage all of the water companies?

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1 MR. HARRISON: Yes. 2 MR. FUKANO: Okay. No other questions. JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Mr. Harrison, I have two 3 questions for you. One is, can you please state the 4 5 number of customers served by Harrison-Ray Water 6 Company, by Sunrise Acres, and then separately by 7 Harrison Water Company/Kiona? 8 MR. HARRISON: Well, I think the figures are pretty correct, the 242, the 213, and the 39, if that's 9 the question. 10 11 That is the question. JUDGE DOROSHKIN: 12 And then the other question is, were the 13 Commission to find that Sunrise Acres is a jurisdictional water company, by when would Sunrise 14 Acres be able to file a tariff? 15 16 MR. HARRISON: Pardon me? I didn't quite 17 hear you. JUDGE DOROSHKIN: How much time would 18 Sunrise Acres need to file a tariff were the Commission 19 to find that it is a jurisdictional water company? 20 MR. HARRISON: How long would it take, 21 22 Susie? I don't know. I've never, you know. MS. PAUL: Well, I don't know how long it 23 would take because it's regulatory services assists with 24 25 that, but I know that almost a year ago they gave you a

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Page 24 template that just needed to be reviewed and filed. 1 So 2 if things are in order, it shouldn't take you too long. MR. HARRISON: So would 30 days be a... 3 MR. CHRISTENSEN: I think you'll need longer 4 5 than that. Going to need 90. 6 MR. HARRISON: Should go 90? 7 MR. CHRISTENSEN: 90 days. MR. HARRISON: 8 90 days? 9 And then the question back to you is, if I complete the sale prior to the tariff, instead of 10 11 getting a tariff in place and then having to take it 12 back off because it's to a sole entity? So we will get back to 13 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: that later. I'd like to have Mr. Christensen testify 14 15 first. 16 And is your daughter on the bridge line? 17 MR. CHRISTENSEN: No. No, okay. 18 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: So, Mr. Christensen, can you please state your email 19 address, your address, and your phone number for the 20 record? 21 22 MR. And knowing that he wants to get out of the water business, my children are 18 wanting to get into the water business, so we're looking 19 at -- we're talking to our attorney and our accountants. 20 We're trying to figure out the best way to bring this 21 22 whole system into a workable, accountable system. 23 My children have wanted to each individually 24 own water systems. So the breakup between his systems 25 would go to each one of my children, and I'm looking at

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Page 26 my management being a satellite management corporation, 1 2 an SMA, over the -- and overseeing what they're doing with their individual systems so that we're able to 3 manage them, but they're the sole owners. 4 So that's -- that's kind of what we've been 5 6 dealing with with Tom. We've been working on the 7 details of -- and the, you know, part of it is going out 8 and doing the investigation of the equipment, and with the weather we have back there right now, we just can't 9 get out there to, you know, go out and check each meter 10 and find out exactly what he's got for ownership. 11 So 12 we're in the process working on a purchase agreement for 13 his water systems. 14 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. Does that complete 15 your statement? 16 MR. CHRISTENSEN: Unless you have questions. 17 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. Mr. Fukano, do you have any questions for Mr. Christensen? 18 19 I do not have any questions. MR. FUKANO: 20 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: I have a couple of questions for Mr. Christensen. 21 22 When did negotiations begin on this sale? 23 MR. CHRISTENSEN: Probably about the first 24 part of January. 25 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Of this year?

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MR. CHRISTENSEN: Yeah. As far as the 1 2 negotiations of purchase price and assets. You know, we've been talking about the whole process probably for 3 six months, but the actual arrangements for purchase and 4 5 when we started to get our accountant involved in doing the analysis for us. 6 7 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. And have you or has 8 anyone else notified Staff of the proposed sale? MR. CHRISTENSEN: I mentioned it to Jim Ward 9 here at one of the UTC training sessions. 10 When was that? 11 12 MR. HARRISON: Was that September or August? 13 MR. CHRISTENSEN: No, that was --14 Here, whenever we -- here a couple weeks ago when we were up in Everett. I just happened to mention 15 16 to him that we're looking at it and how -- how we're 17 trying to put this system together. JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. And so do you have 18 19 any evidence of the negotiations, any emails, any documents? 20 21 MR. CHRISTENSEN: Between us? 22 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Yes, of this for this 23 transaction --MR. CHRISTENSEN: Not here with us. 24 25 MR. HARRISON: It's gone the other way.

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Page 28 It's my CPA giving him information. 1 2 MR. CHRISTENSEN: Yeah. MR. HARRISON: I -- we've talked on the 3 4 phone more than anything. 5 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Do you have any documentation of the negotiations that have been ongoing 6 7 here? 8 MR. CHRISTENSEN: Just -- just a materials list of what he owns. I received his balance sheets, so 9 and his depreciation tables on his equipment. 10 11 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: And when did this happen? 12 MR. CHRISTENSEN: In January. 13 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: In January? 14 MR. CHRISTENSEN: Yes. 15 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Do you have -- did you 16 receive it by email form, in mail? 17 MR. CHRISTENSEN: No, we just met. You just met. 18 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: 19 MR. HARRISON: We met at the CPA's office and she gave it to him. 20 21 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: And has a closing date been established? 22 23 MR. CHRISTENSEN: No, because we were aware that this was going on, so this is one of the things 24 25 that we want to clarify is, is her system going to be

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regulated? And if we do it under the SMA type of 1 2 process, those don't -- systems don't need to be regulated. Now, we understand the other two do and 3 that's not a problem. But this being a smaller one, 4 private ownership, it's like, do we need to have this 5 6 one regulated? So we're waiting to kind of see what's 7 happening here at this meeting. 8 The meeting was supposed to be here earlier 9 this month, and due to his problem with the breakage on his system, we weren't able to have that meeting. So 10 we've just kind of been delayed here, waiting to see 11 12 what's going on. 13 JUDGE DOROSHKIN: I will not be issuing any 14 additional bench requests or have any other questions for you, Mr. Christensen. We'll have an opportunity now 15 16 for closing statements. 17 Mr. Fukano, would you like to summarize Staff's recommendation or make a closing statement? 18 19 MR. FUKANO: Yes. And Staff has reviewed 20 the materials submitted by Mr. Harrison and have determined that there are 46 customers listed in the 21 22 materials. MR. HARRISON: How do you get 46 and I'm 23 24 only collecting from 39? 25 MS. PAUL: The paperwork that you submitted

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Page 30 shows a total of 46 customers, although one is vacant. 1 2 So that would be 45 active customers --3 MR. HARRISON: There's still only 39 lots in 4 the system. 5 MS. PAUL: I'm sorry, this is the report --6 (Multiple speakers.) 7 MS. PAUL: -- you handed to us. 8 MR. HARRISON: -- on the billing. I don't 9 know what, you know, a dead account. I didn't review it like that, but there's truly only 39 lots. Whatever. 10 11 MR. FUKANO: RCW 80.04.010(30) states that a 12 water company is subject to Commission jurisdiction if the company has over 100 customers. 13 RCW 14 80.04.010(30)(b) further states that when measuring how many customers a water company has, the measurement must 15 16 include all portions of water companies having common 17 ownership or control regardless of location or corporate designation. 18 19 This statute means that the Commission is 20 required to include all customers from water companies that have the same owner or controller when determining 21 22 how many customers a water company has. 23 To interpret this provision in another 24 manner, would allow companies to artificially 25 compartmentalize water company operations to avoid

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Commission regulations and the accompanying consumer
protection safeguards.

Furthermore, WAC 480-100-235 defines control as meaning the water system operator or manger has discretion over the property or finances or operations of a water system which is normally exercised by an owner.

8 You've heard testimony today from Mr. Harrison that he does manage all of the water 9 10 systems. Staff has also presented evidence that Sunrise 11 Acres is a water company owned and controlled by Tom 12 Harrison, and that Mr. Harrison owns and controls two additional water systems; Harrison-Ray Water Company and 13 14 Harrison Water Company/Kiona through Secretary of State and Department of Health records. 15

16 Staff contends that Mr. Harrison controls 17 Harrison-Ray, Harrison/Kiona, and Sunrise Acres in the 18 capacity as governor of those companies as reflected in 19 the Secretary of State records, and that Mr. Harrison 20 owns Harrison-Ray, Harrison/Kiona, and Sunrise Acres as 21 reflected in the Department of Health records.

Harrison-Ray is organized as a corporation and Harrison/Kiona and Sunrise Acres are both limited-liability corporations. RCW 23B.01.400(19) of the Washington Business Corporation Act states that the

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1	term "governor" has the same meaning as provided in RCW
2	23.95.0 0 105, a provision in the Uniform Business
3	Organizations Code.
4	According to that statute, a governor in the
5	context of a for-profit corporation such as Harrison-Ray
б	is a director. According to the same statute, in the
7	context of a limited-liability company such as
8	Harrison/Kiona and Sunrise Acres, a governor is a member
9	of a member-managed limited-liability company.
10	Therefore, according to the Secretary of State records
11	provided by Staff, Mr. Harrison is the sole director of
12	Harrison-Ray and is the sole managing member of
13	Harrison/Kiona and Sunrise Acres.
14	Therefore, Staff asserts that Mr. Harrison
15	controls Sunrise Acres, Harrison-Ray, and
16	Harrison/Kiona. Staff has also presented evidence that
17	Harrison-Ray Water Company and Harrison Water
18	Company/Kiona each have over 200 customers.
19	Finally, Staff has testified that Sunrise
20	Acres has not filed a tariff with the Commission. RCW
21	80.25.050 requires a jurisdictional water company to
22	file a tariff with the Commission. Therefore, Staff
23	asks the Commission to determine that Sunrise Acres is a
24	water company that is subject to the Commission's
25	jurisdiction because it exceeds the 100 customer

1	threshold for Commission jurisdiction and to order the
2	company to file a tariff by a definite and reasonable
3	date. Thank you.
4	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Mr. Harrison, do you have
5	any final remarks that you would like to make on the
6	record?
7	MR. HARRISON: No.
8	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Okay. Then I will take
9	this matter under advisement and issue an order. Is
10	there anything else?
11	MR. FUKANO: Not from Staff.
12	JUDGE DOROSHKIN: Then we are adjourned.
13	(Adjourned at 2:43 p.m.)
