NOTICE OF VIRTUAL PREHEARING CONFERENCE (Set for September 29, 2020, at 1:30 p.m.)

- COMPLAINT: On May 15, 2020, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) issued a Complaint against Shuttle Express, Inc., (Shuttle Express or Company) alleging violations of WAC 480-30 (Complaint).
- SETTLEMENT NEGOTIATIONS. On June 30, 2020, counsel for Commission staff (Staff) contacted the presiding officer on behalf of the parties to inform the Commission that the parties had reached a settlement in principle. On July 1, 2020, the Commission issued a notice suspending the procedural schedule and requiring the parties to file either settlement documents or a status report by July 22. On July 27, the Commission issued a notice extending the deadline to file settlement documents or a status report to August 21, and on August 20, 2020, the Commission issued a further notice requiring the parties to file either settlement documents or a status report by October 2.
- On September 9, 2020, Staff contacted the presiding officer on behalf of the parties, notifying the Commission that the parties had failed to reach a final settlement and requesting that the Commission set the matter for prehearing conference.
- PROCEDURES: The Commission will hear this matter under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA), particularly Part IV of RCW 34.05 relating to adjudications. The provisions of the APA that relate to this proceeding include, but are not limited to RCW 34.05.413, RCW 34.05.422, RCW 34.05.431, RCW 34.05.440, RCW 34.05.449, and RCW 34.05.452. The Commission will also follow its procedural rules in WAC 480-07 in this proceeding.
- The Commission finds there is good cause to hear this matter on shortened notice. *See* WAC 480-07-440(1)(a) and RCW 34.05.434.

- PURPOSE: The purpose of the prehearing conference is to consider requests for intervention, to resolve scheduling matters including establishing dates for distributing evidence, to identify the issues in the proceeding, and to determine other matters to assist the Commission in resolving the matter, as listed in WAC 480-07-430. The Commission will set the time and place for the evidentiary hearings at the prehearing conference or by later written notice.
- 8 **INTERVENTION**: Persons seeking to intervene in the proceeding must file written petitions to intervene at least three business days before the date of the prehearing conference. See WAC 480-07-355(a).
- 9 **NOTICE OF APPEARANCE; INTERPRETER**: Party representatives must file notices of appearance with the Commission, as required by WAC 480-07-345(2), no later than the day before the conference. If any party needs an interpreter or other assistance, they should fill out the form attached to this notice and return it to the Commission.
- THE COMMISSION GIVES NOTICE that any party who fails to attend or participate in the prehearing conference set by this Notice, or any other stage of this proceeding, may be held in default under RCW 34.05.440 and WAC 480-07-450.
