ADDENDUM NOTICE OF DISCUSSION AND VIRTUAL WORKSHOP (Set for Tuesday, Sept. 28, 2021, at 9 a.m.)

Re: In the Matter of the Commission's examination of intervenor funding provisions for regulatory proceedings, Docket U-210595

TO ALL INTERESTED PERSONS:

On Sept. 28, 2021, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) will hold a workshop to discuss the implementation of Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 5295, Chapter 188, Laws of 2021, which provides statutory authority for energy utilities to provide financial assistance to certain organizations participating in regulatory processes before the Commission.

The law, codified as <u>RCW 80.28.430</u>, directs the Commission to approve, approve with modifications, or reject proposed agreements and, before administering agreements, determine by rule or order:

- Amounts of funding that can be provided to organizations
- The manner in which the financial assistance is distributed
- The manner in which the financial assistance is recovered in the rates of the gas company or electrical company, and
- Other matters necessary to administer the agreement.¹

The statute further directs the Commission and utilities to prioritize for funding organizations that represent vulnerable populations or highly impacted communities.²

The Commission is accepting public comments, both written and through its September 28 workshop, to inform a policy statement that will guide Commission orders administering funding agreements.
