- NATURE OF PROCEEDING. Docket No. UT-050778 is a petition by persons in seven households near Index, Washington. Petitioners request that the Commission direct Verizon to expand its service territory and provide service to petitioners' properties.
- 2 **CONFERENCE.** The Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (Commission) convened a prehearing conference in Docket No. UT-050778 at Olympia, Washington on January 31, 2006, before Administrative Law Judge Karen Caillé (ALJ) for purposes of reestablishing a procedural schedule in this docket.

APPEARANCES. Petitioner Douglas Rupp represents himself and the petitioners, Petitioner Melinda Inman appeared by telephone. David C. Lundsgaard, Graham & Dunn, Seattle, Washington, represents Verizon Northwest, Inc. Sally Johnston, Senior Assistant Attorney General, represents the Commission's regulatory staff (Commission Staff or Staff). Appendix A to this Order provides revised contact information for the parties' representatives.

BACKGROUND. On November 10, 2005, the Commission suspended the procedural schedule in this proceeding at the request of the parties pending the Commission's decision on a settlement agreement filed in Docket No. UT-050814, *In the Matter of the Joint Application of Verizon Communications, Inc. and MCI, Inc. for Approval of Agreement and Plan of Merger (Merger Docket)*. One of the terms of the settlement agreement in the *Merger Docket* could have resolved the petition in this proceeding. The Commission's decision in the *Merger Docket* rejected the settlement term for this petition. Subsequently, the parties in this proceeding requested that this docket be reactivated, and a procedural schedule be reestablished.

- PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE. Verizon proposed a schedule that preserved the intervals of time that were set in the initial procedural schedule. Mr. Rupp objected and argued that Verizon could have been working on the case while the procedural schedule was suspended, and following the entry of the order in the *Merger Docket*. Over Mr. Rupp's objection, the ALJ accepted Verizon's proposed schedule. The Commission adopts the procedural schedule which is attached to this Order as Appendix B, and incorporated into the body of this Order by this reference. In all other respects, the initial prehearing conference order, Order No. 01, remains in effect.
- MOTION TO REMOVE PETITIONER. Petitioners filed an unopposed motion to remove Robert Jacobs as a petitioner in this proceeding. The motion explains

that Mr. Jacobs has moved from his residence in the Skyko 2 area. The ALJ granted the motion.

BENCH REQUESTS. The ALJ advised the parties that she would be issuing formal bench requests for information on the permits required in order to bring service to Petitioners, and whether provision of service would be consistent with other state policies such as environmental policies and growth management policies.

- NOTICE OF EVIDENTIARY HEARING. The Commission gives notice of the evidentiary hearing in this matter on Monday, April 3, 2006, beginning at 1:00 p.m., and if needed, Tuesday, April 4, 2006, beginning at 9:30 a.m., in Room 206 of the Commission's offices, Chandler Plaza Building, 1300 S. Evergreen Park Drive S.W., Olympia, Washington.
- NOTICE TO PARTIES: Any objection to the provisions of this Order must be filed within ten (10) days after the service date of this Order, pursuant to WAC 480-07-430 and WAC 480-07-810. Absent such objection, this Order will control further proceedings in this matter, subject to Commission review.
