Ray, when we talked after the Toppenish city council meeting I believe you said that Yakama Power would like to take over service to four areas of tribal housing in the Wapato area. I am guessing that you would like to purchase our distribution facilities on the properties, is that correct? If so, I think this is a big enough sale that I will need additional approvals within our company. Plus, the aggregate may be significant enough that we may need to make a filing with the WUTC as we did with the original sale of facilities. Note that I'm not saying that we will sell, but for facilities serving only Yakama Nation accounts, I believe we may still be willing to consider selling.

Additionally, if there is to be a sale, we will need to do an inventory and valuation, so will need some time to do that, as well as to prepare any construction estimates for separation. We don't want to start on those things so far in advance that the numbers lose their accuracy before work is done, but would like to have plenty of notice.

Also, I'm familiar with only three areas of tribal housing in the Wapato area, and they are shown on the attached map (in pink) along with the substation location in blue. Could you tell me please where the fourth area is?

Another impact of your plans is that it will take some load off at least three of our feeders, and may change how load is distributed between our two transformers in Wapato Substation, so we would like to be able to factor that into our own system planning.

Are there any new loads that we do not now serve that will be added to your feeder, or will your feeder be only serving what are now existing loads?

I know that your schedule is contingent on our construction of the feeder position, but it would be helpful if you could provide a description of the facilities you would like to take over and a time line for doing that. While a response by email will be sufficient for our planning purposes, I think if Yakama Power wants to purchase our facilities serving the housing areas, that ultimately should be initiated by a good old fashioned letter.
