

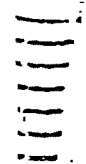

I have just received my monthly statment from Pacific Power in which was enclosed a notice that Pacific Power had filed a request for rate increases with the Commission. I am particularly interested in the residential rate structure and I certainly do not agree that Pacific Power should be entitled to raise the residential rate by the percentages they have requested.

After you have carefully scrutinized all of their expense items and you find the itemized expenses to be legitimate, there may be a reason to allow a small increase in the rates, but not to the extent that they have requested.

I think their attitude is always, "we will ask for a large increase and hope the Commission grants us an increase of any amount".

I question the sale of Pacific Power to a foreign Corporation and I think this is only the beginning of rate increase requests to be filed in the future.

This situation will continue to require your closest attention,.
