THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS That the tariff revisions filed herein by Puget Sound Power & Light Company, September 27, 1996, which are attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof as though fully set forth herein, shall become effective as filed, and that the rates, charges and conditions therein are hereby specified as the rates, charges and conditions to be applicable to service on and after October 1, 1996.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED That jurisdiction is retained by the Commission to effectuate the provisions of this and prior orders entered in this docket.
