RE: Notice of Intent to Send to Collections, Penalty Assessment No. TV-140340

Dear Mr. Adekanmbi:

As you are aware, on April 9, 2014, the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission issued a Complaint Seeking to Impose Penalties for engaging in business as a household goods carrier within the State of Washington without the authority required by RCW 81.80. On May 7, 2014, the Commission entered a Stipulated Initial Order Classifying Respondent as Household Goods Carrier; Ordering Respondent to Cease & Desist; Imposing and Suspending Penalties on Condition of Future Compliance, which imposed a penalty of \$5,000. The Commission suspended \$4,500 of the penalty, with the remaining \$500 due subject to a payment schedule of three monthly installments. On February 9, 2016, the Commission issued Order 03, Order Imposing Suspended Penalty, finding that Sea-Tac Movers violated the conditions of Order 02, under which the Commission suspended \$4,500 of the \$5,000 penalty. The Commission sent Sea-Tac Movers LLC a Corrected Final Invoice on April 12, 2016, re-imposing the suspended penalty.

The Commission has not received the \$4,500 payment due and owing.

This is to notify you that the Commission intends to forward your outstanding debt to a collection agency for collection. You likely will incur additional expenses and fees, including costs of collection, attorney's fees, and interest. These expenses and fees will be added to your outstanding \$4,500 balance.
